The report includes policy recommendations for the 88th Legislative Session and summarizes SASTF projects completed since the last biennial report – including the creation of a trauma-informed rubric, a safety planning framework, a law enforcement training review and law enforcement sexual assault response protocol, a sexual assault evidence kit pilot project, and a survivors' rights guide.
