This limit is cumulative and does not reset if a tenant moves out then back in or if they start a new program. A third-year tenant's academic department may use one of their Priority Allocations to grant three additional years of eligibility. Please reach out directly to your academic department with any inquiries regarding allocations. They are solely responsible for whom they allocate and what criteria they place on who is eligible to be allocated.</p> <p>Family Housing Tenants may remain in family housing for the duration of their Normative Time to Degree (as established by their academic department) or a lifetime maximum tenancy of seven years, whichever comes first. This limit is cumulative (including any time spent in single graduate housing) and does not reset if a tenant moves out then back in or if they start a new program.</p>

UC RIVERSIDE	NO	Available campus housing will be assigned on a first-come, first-served basis
UC SAN DIEGO	PARTIAL	Graduate and Family Housing offers campus housing to graduate and professional students, housing will be offered to new incoming single students and couples for a two-year term
UC SAN FRANCISCO	NO	No guaranteed offer. All tenants are welcome to live in UCSF Housing for up to 5-years. Term limits are cumulative in a lifetime, regardless of university affiliation or break in tenancy. Time living in UCSF Housing on someone else's lease is not counted toward this 5-year occupancy limit.
UC SANTA BARBARA	PARTIAL	New single graduate students entering fall quarter are given priority consideration for housing for their first year as long as they adhere to application procedures and deadlines. New single graduate students entering winter or spring quarter are accommodated when possible. Family Housing, priority is given to families with children, and it is recommended that interested students apply for the waitlist as soon as possible--even prior to admittance--to ensure placement.
