

Avista Stadium Fan Code of Conduct

The Spokane Indians are committed to creating a family-friendly and welcoming environment at Avista Stadium for all guests. As part of that commitment, we have adopted the below expectations for all fans and team members.

A copy of the Fan Code of Conduct can be found at spokaneindians.com, at the Advanced Ticket Window, and at the Information Booth on the outer concourse. Fans will be also be reminded each game over the PA system about the Fan Code of Conduct, the penalties for violation, and how to report prohibited behavior.

Reporting An Incident

Any gameday team member who witnesses or receives a report of prohibited fan behavior by a fan must report the incident to Kyle Day, Chris Duff, Josh Roys, or MacKenzie White. If the previously listed individuals are unavailable, please notify the Information Booth and an appropriate response will occur.

Use of derogatory language by a fan toward a player, umpire, Club staff, or their family members must be documented by the Club and reported to Kyle Day and to the Commissioner's Office.

Fan Code of Conduct

In order to provide a welcoming experience for all, the Spokane Indians have implemented a Fan Code of Conduct. Out of respect for fellow guests, players, coaches, and ballpark staff, all guests are prohibited from:

- Trespassing on the playing field at any time;
- Interfering with baseballs that are in play;
- Throwing or tossing objects;
- Using foul, obscene or derogatory language (see below) or gestures;
- Misusing or overconsuming alcohol, including, underage consumption;
- Behaving in a manner that is disruptive, unruly, or abusive;
- Accessing areas of the ballpark without a proper ticket, pass, or credential;
- Misusing tickets, passes, or credentials in any way; or
- Bringing prohibited items into the ballpark. Prohibited items include:
 - Non-clear bags
 - Beach balls and other inflatables
 - Glass bottles
 - Fireworks
 - Firearms or other weapons
 - Laser devices
 - Skateboards and roller blades
 - Toy guns and knives
 - Sticks and clubs
 - Unmanned aerial vehicles
 - Aerosol cans
 - Baseball bats
 - Coolers
 - Outside food and beverage other than sealed plastic water bottles
 - Cameras/recorders for video

- Animals with the exception of service animals to aid guests with disabilities or in specified areas on Bark in the Park night
- Air horns or other distracting noise makers
- Visibly obscene, indecent, or inappropriate clothing
- Any devices that may interfere with and/or distract any sports or event participant, other guests, audio or audio/visual telecast or recording of the game, or any technology related service provided in the stadium

Derogatory language is defined as offensive language concerning a person's race, ethnicity, gender, religion, disability, age, sexual orientation, or national origin, and anyone using such language is subject to automatic ejection from the ballpark.

Violations of the Fan Code of Conduct will not be tolerated and may lead to ejection from the ballpark, a ban on attending future games, or other consequences.

Fans are encouraged to report violations of the Fan Code of Conduct to the nearest front office team member. This can be done in person, at the Information Booth on the outer concourse, or by emailing mail@spokaneindians.com.
