**FLIGHT PATTERN:** The St. Louis Cardinals and Seattle Mariners kick off a three-game Interleague series tonight at Busch Stadium as the Redbirds begin a six-game/seven-day homestand ... The Cardinals finished 4-2 on their recent road trip after taking 2-of-3 from both the Yankees and Brewers ... St. Louis enters today in 3rd place in the National League Central, 10.0 games back of Milwaukee, and 5.0 games out of the 3rd NL Wild Card position ... The Cardinals are home for 13 of next 16 games until Sept. 22, bookending a three-game international trip to Toronto next weekend.

**CARDINALS GARY LaROCQUE TO RETIRE:** The Cardinals announced today that Gary LaRocque, Assistant GM/Director of Player Development, will retire at the conclusion of the 2024 season and remain with the organization in 2025 in an advisory role ... LaRocque, who joined the Cardinals organization in 2008, has overseen the team's Farm System for 12 seasons, the 2nd longest tenure in team annals to Branch Rickey (20 years, 1923-42) ... During LaRocque's Cardinals tenure, the farm system has had 113 players advance to the Major Leagues and nine minor league affiliate teams win League Championships, with Springfield (AA) and Palm Beach (Single-A) bound for the postseason this year.

**COME AS YOU ARE:** The Cardinals welcome the Seattle Mariners to St. Louis tonight for only their 10th game overall since Interleague play began (1997-present) and their 7th ever at Busch Stadium III (2006-present), 2nd-fewest games played here by any visiting team behind the Baltimore Orioles (6).

- The last Cardinals-Mariners game in St. Louis was 11 years ago on Sept. 14, 2013 (12-2 Cardinals win), representing the longest active timespan between visits by any team to a current Major League venue.
- The Cardinals have won seven of nine over the Mariners in the city of St. Louis (3-0 at Busch II & 4-2 at Busch III), for their best home win pct. (.778) against any visitor since joining the National League in 1892.

**I STAY AWAY:** Since Interleague play began in 1997, the only venue that was a full-time home to a Major League team for multiple seasons in which the Cardinals never played was The Kingdome (1977-99) in Seattle ... Cardinals who appeared in the 1979 MLB All-Star Game at The Kingdome included Lou Brock, Keith Hernandez, Ted Simmons, and coach Dave Ricketts; Garry Templeton was selected as a reserve, but would not depart because he did not start.

**GOTTA BEAT THE BEST TO BE THE BEST:** The Cardinals are 11-8 over their current 22-game stretch against playoff contending teams: vs. Los Angeles Dodgers (1-2), vs. Milwaukee (2-1), at Minnesota (2-1), vs. San Diego (2-2), at New York Yankees (2-1), at Milwaukee (2-1) and vs. Seattle (3 games).

**FANTASTIC FINISHES:** Since winning their 11th World Series in 2011, the Cardinals have the 2nd-most wins (211) in Major League Baseball during the month of September, trailing only the Los Angeles Dodgers (213) over those 14 seasons ... The Cardinals 10 wins since August 21 are tied for 3rd in MLB trailing the Mets (11) and Phillies (11).

**...I'M NOT GONNA CRACK:** St. Louis has played an MLB-leading 94 games (78.3%) decided by three runs or fewer ... The Cardinals and Rays co-lead MLB in one-run victories (26) while both sport an MLB-low 2.72 run differential per game in wins.

**BAKER STREET:** Rookie Luken Baker hit a game-winning RBI single in the 10th inning on Wednesday in Milwaukee, extending his RBI streak to six games (Aug. 27-present), longest active in MLB ... According to Elias, Baker joins Albert Pujols (May 10-16, 2001 - 6 games) as the only two Cardinals in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to run off RBI streaks of 6+ games in their first 44 Major League games ... Brendan Donovan (7 games from June 17-24) is the only Cardinal this season with a longer RBI streak.

**EVERLONG:** Paul Goldschmidt is slashing .477/.500/.795 (21-44) over his season-high 11-game hitting streak since Aug. 24 (MLB's 4th-longest active), while Lars Nootbaar is riding a season-best nine-game hit streak (.364/.417/.576, 12-33) since Aug. 27 (T-5th longest in MLB) ... Iván Herrera has reached base safely in a career best 12 in a row since Aug. 12 (T-11th active in MLB).

**CAN'T FIND A BETTER MAN:** According to Baseball Reference, RHP Sam Tuivailala is the only player in MLB history to exclusively play for both the Cardinals (2014-18) and Mariners (2018-19) in his career ... Originally selected by St. Louis as a shortstop in the 3rd round of the 2010 MLB Draft, Tuivailala transitioned to a pitcher in 2012, made his MLB debut in 2014, and was later traded to Seattle for minor league RHP Seth Elledge (July 27, 2018).

**Lance Lynn** was originally selected by Seattle in the 6th round of the 2005 MLB Draft, but did not sign to attend the University of Mississippi

**Randy Arozarena** played in 19 games for St. Louis in 2019 and parts of three minor league seasons in the Cardinals organization (2017-19)...originally signed with the Cardinals as an international free agent (Aug. 1, 2016)...traded to Tampa Bay with José Martínez, and Cardinals Compensation draft pick A (INF Arika Williams) in exchange for Matthew Liberatore, Edgardo Rodriguez and Rays Compensation draft pick B (RHP Tink Henge). Jan. 9, 2020.

Cardinals broadcaster **Chip Caray** worked for the Seattle Mariners and three seasons (1993-95).

Mariners Pitching Strategy Coach **Trent Black** was born in St. Louis...graduated from nearby Columbia (Ill.) High School.

**Andrew Kittredge** was born in and resides in Spokane, WA...graduated from Joel E. Ferris High School in Spokane...originally selected by his home state Mariners in the 45th round of the 2008 MLB Draft, but did not sign to attend the University of Washington...pitched three seasons for the Huskies (2009-11) before signing as a minor league free agent with Seattle in 2011... pitched six seasons in the Mariners minor league organization (2011-16) before traded with Dalton Kelly and Dylan Thompson to Tampa Bay for Taylor Motter and Richie Shaffer (Nov. 18, 2016).

**John King** made his MLB debut at T-Mobile Park with Texas (Sept. 4, 2020)...fanned Kyle Lewis (swinging) that night for his first MLB strikeout.

Mariners broadcaster **Rick Rizzs** is a 1975 graduate of Southern Illinois Univ. in Carbondale...previously served as a broadcaster for the Memphis Chicks (AA-Expos) from 1978-80.

**Riley O'Brien** was born in Seattle and resides in Shoreline, WA... graduated from Shorewood (WA) High School...pitched two seasons at Everett (WA) Community College (2014-15)...traded by Cincinnati to the Mariners for Luis Chevalier (April 17, 2022) and pitched in one game for Seattle (May 7, 2022 vs. TB)...2023 PCL Post-Season All-Star for AAA-Tacoma...acquired by the Cardinals from the Mariners for cash considerations (Nov. 5, 2023).

**Luis Urias's** brother, **Ramón Urias**, played two seasons (2018-19) in the Cardinals minor leagues.

Mariners broadcaster **Aaron Goldsmith** was born in St. Louis...graduated from Principia College in Elsah, Ill...began broadcast career in 2007 with the nearby Gateway Grizzlies in the independent Frontier League.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Vince Coleman** played in Seattle in 1995, including all 11 postseason games.

TONIGHT'S GAME

- Makes his 28th start of the season and his 7th since joining the Cardinals.
- Has pitched an MLB single-season high 155.2 innings this season, while his 28th start tonight establishes a career Major League high. His 180.1 innings and 30 starts for the NC Dinos in the KBO last season were professional career highs.
- His 137 strikeouts this season are the most of his Major League career behind 209 for the NC Dinos in the KBO last season.
- Currently riding a season-low three-game losing skid (Aug. 13-present).
- Has made six starts with St. Louis, going is 1-4 with a 4.64 ERA (33.0 IP) and 29 strikeouts. Is 1-1 with a 4.80 ERA at Busch Stadium with the Cardinals and 0-3 with a 5.64 ERA on the road with the Cardinals.
- Ranks in the Top-20 in MLB in both ERA (3.43, 19th) and opponent's BA (.229, 19th).
- His only win with the Cardinals was Aug. 7 vs. TB at Busch, limiting the Rays to one run over 5.0 innings with four hits, while throwing 93 pitches. Two of his eight wins this season are vs. TB.
- Has held his opposition to one run or fewer in 11 starts this season. Lance Lynn has seven such starts this season for 2nd-most on the Cardinals staff this season.
- Has received one run of support or fewer in 10 of his 27 starts. Is 6-1 in starts which he receives three runs of support or more this season.
- Sports a 2.00 ERA in the first inning of starts (6 ER/27.0 IP), T-12th lowest in MLB. Atlanta's Reynaldo Lopez (0.82 ERA) leads MLB.
- Acquired by the Cardinals 24 hours shy of the MLB Trade Deadline on July 29 in a three-way trade with the White Sox and Dodgers that brought OF Tommy Pham to the Cardinals as well and INF Tommy Edman being sent to the Dodgers.
- Ranked 11th in the American League in ERA (3.11) at the time of the trade.
- Pitched 6.0 or more innings in 13 starts with 10 quality starts for White Sox.
- Struck out a career-high 11 batters over 6.0 innings at Minnesota on April 23.
- Ran off four straight winning decisions to start the year, establishing a new career-best winning streak from April 17-May 14, including consecutive scoreless starts vs. CLE (5/9) and vs. WSH (5/14) covering a season-high 14.0 inning scoreless streak.
- Had a positive home/road split after going 5-2 with a 1.87 ERA at Chicago's Guaranteed Rate Field, ranking 4th in Major League Baseball in home ERA.

LAST TIME OUT

- Suffered his third straight losing decision in last Friday's series opener at Yankee Stadium, allowing four hits for four runs in 5.1 innings in the 6-3 Cardinals loss.
- Two of his four runs came on an Austin Wells go-ahead 2-run homer in the 3rd inning.

- Faced Seattle twice this season with the Chicago White Sox. In his first outing vs. the Mariners on June 10 at T-Mobile Park, allowed one run over 7.0 innings and departed with a 4-1 on lead before Seattle plated eight unanswered highlighted by a Cal Raleigh grand slam.
- Has allowed three runs or fewer in all four starts.
- Is lifetime 1-7 with a 4.35 ERA (39.1 IP) and 34 strikeouts in eight starts vs. the American League West.

2024

- Posted an 0.95 ERA over his first six starts at Guaranteed Rate Field, lowest by a White Sox pitcher in his first six home starts since Tommy John with an 0.76 ERA in 1967.
- Reached the 500.0 career innings pitched mark and recorded his 400th career strikeout (Jesse Winker) in the same start vs. Washington (5/14-Game 2).
