CHICAGO CUBS (66-66) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (62-69) AUGUST 27, 2024 AT PNC PARK, PITTSBURGH, PA - 6:40 EDT - GAME #132/HOME #67

LHP JUSTIN STEELE (4-5, 3.07 ERA) vs. RHP JARED JONES (5-6, 3.56 ERA)

THE PIRATES: Allowed a season-high 18 runs on 21 hits while losing their series opener against the Cubs last night...Are 6-5 in their last 11 games following their season-high 10-game losing streak from August 4-14...Have won 15 games in their last at-bat (their most since having 16 last at-bat wins in 2021)...Have played in 47 one-run games, which

are the most in MLB...Have the best stolen base percentage (85.6 percent) in MLB...Have recorded an extra base hit in a season-high 32 consecutive games (the third-longest active streak in all of MLB)...Have the fourth-most quality starts (57) in MLB behind the Mariners (80), Royals (65) and Braves (58)...Are hitting .337 with the bases loaded; the fourth-highest average in MLB behind the Royals (.375) Diamondbacks (.369) and Reds (.354).

MR. JONES AND ME: Jared Jones comes into tonight two strikeouts shy of 100 as he makes the 17th start of his rookie campaign...Jones ranks third on the team in strikeouts behind Mitch Keller (138) and fellow rookie Paul Skenes (130)...The only other time the Pirates have had two rookies reach 100 strikeouts in a season came in 1993 when Steve Cooke had 132 and Paul Wagner had 114 strikeouts.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR: Tonight the Pirates will be opposed by a starting lefthander for the 40th time this season (Pittsburgh is 20-19 in games started by opposing lefties)...Connor Joe is 7-for-13 with a home run against Steele in his career...Joe is also a .362 career hitter (38-for-105) with eight doubles, a triple, seven home runs and 19 RBI in his career against the Cubs.

20 X 4: Bryan Reynolds has 20 home runs this season, which marks his fourth consecutive season to hit at least 20 home runs...He is now one of seven players in club history to record 20-plus home runs in four or more consecutive seasons and the first since Andrew McCutchen did so in seven consecutive seasons from 2011-2017...Special thanks to the Elias Sports Bureau... Reynolds is now also just one of nine players in Pirates history to amass four or more seasons of 20-plus home runs (consecutive or otherwise).

50 BUCS: Last night Brady Feigl became the 50th player to appear in a game for the Pirates this season...The Marlins have used the most different players (62) this season while the Cardinals have used the fewest (43).

CRUZING ALONG: Oneil Cruz has reached base safely in each of his last 18 games, which is the sixth-longest active streak in MLB coming into today (Francisco Lindor has the longest at 24 games)...Cruz is hitting .323 (21-for-65) with six doubles, one triple, one home run, seven RBI and .897 OPS since the streak began on August 7.

THE BEAR FACTS: Jared Triolo went 2-for-3 with a triple and two RBI in the series opener last night against the Cubs...Triolo has now hit safely in eight of his nine career starts against the Cubs, going 12-for-32 (.375) with a triple, two home runs and eight RBI.

QUALITY STARTS: Jared Jones has recorded quality starts in each of his two outings against the Cubs this season and nine total as a rookie this season...That's tied for the fourth-most quality starts in MLB among rookies...The only three rookies to have more quality starts in MLB this season are Chicago's Shota Imanaga (14), Paul Skenes (13) and Los Angeles' (NL) Gavin Stone (10).

PIRATING: Oneil Cruz has been successful in each of his last 15 attempts since being caught for the only time on April 22...The last Pirate to steal at least 15 consecutive bases without being caught is Bryan Reynolds (16 straight) from August 5, 2022, to September 11, 2023...The last Pirate to steal at least 15 consecutive bases without being caught in a single season is Andrew McCutchen (15 straight) from April 11 to July 10, 2014...Pittsburgh has been successful in an MLB-best 85.6 percent of its stolen base attempts.

THIS AND THAT: The Pirates have scored 27 runs in their last five games since being shut out 1-0 on August 21 at Texas...Pittsburgh's 27 runs scored since August 22 are tied for the fifth-most in MLB...Eight of Pittsburgh's last 17 home games have been decided by one run.

TODAY'S STARTER RHP JARED JONES #37

2024 RECORD: 5-6, 3.56 ERA

HEIGHT/WEIGHT: 6-1/190 BATS/THROWS: L/R

AGE: 23 SIGNED: Thru 2024

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected by the Pirates in the 2nd round of the 2020 Draft.

STARTING OFF: The 23-year-old righthander is in his first Major League season with the Pirates...Was named to the Opening Day roster after being a non-roster invitee to big league camp...The Whittier, California, native was Pittsburgh's second-round draft selection in 2020 out of La Miranda (CA) High School.

PIRATES PROSPECTS: Jones entered the 2024 season rated as the Pirates No. 3 prospect and the No. 74 prospect in all of baseball according to Baseball America.

LAST TIME OUT: Will be making his first start with the Pirates since July 3 against St. Louis when he had a no-decision (5.0ip/1r) in a 5-4 Pirates win.

<u>VS. CHICAGO (NL):</u> Has gone 1-1 in two starts...Lost a 7-2 decision (6.0ip/3r/2er) at PNC Park on 5/10 before winning a 5-4 decision (6.0ip/3er) at Wrigley Field on May 16.

FEELING BETTER NOW: Jones was placed on the 15-day injured list on July 4 with a right lat strain...He made a total of three rehab starts with Triple-A Indianapolis, where he went 0-1 with a 4.91 ERA (11.0ip/6er)...In his last rehab start on August 20 at Columbus, he threw a total of 73 pitches (53 strikes) while striking out 10 of the 16 batters that he faced.

CLOSING IN ON THE CENTURY MARK: Jones has amassed 98 strikeouts so far this season...Since the mound was moved to its current distance in 1893, the only three Pirates to reach 100 career strikeouts in fewer in 20 games are Gerrit Cole in 2013 (19), Jose DeLeon in 1983 (13) and Paul Skenes (13).

BODY OF WORK: Is making his 17th career start and appearance tonight...He has allowed three earned runs or fewer in 14 of his 16 starts, as well as two or fewer nine times and one or fewer five times.

HOME COOKIN': Tonight will be Jones' 10th start at PNC Park this season, where he's gone 3-2 with a 2.17 ERA (54.1ip/13er), 55 strikeouts, 18 walks and a .203 batting average against...He has allowed three earned runs or fewer in each of his eight starts at home, including two or fewer seven times and one or fewer three times.

WHAT A DEBUT: Jones became the first Pirate since Tim Wakefield in 1992 and the third pitcher in team history to record at least 10 strikeouts in his big league debut on March 30at Miami...In addition, he became one of just five starting pitchers since 1900 to strike out at least 10 batters in less than 6.0 innings in a big league debut...Prior to Jones, Milwaukee's Freddy Peralta was the last pitcher to record 10-plus strikeouts in a big league debut when he did so on May 13, 2018 (13 punchouts)... Dick Hall struck out 11 batters in his first MLB start, but he made his MLB debut as a third baseman for the Pirates on April 15, 1952.

NO WALK SIGN IS ON: Jones opened his career with a streak of 21.1 consecutive innings without issuing a walk before issuing his free pass to Blake Perkins in the fifth inning on April 22 vs. Milwaukee...It was the fifth-longest streak by a Major League pitcher within their first five career games since 1971 and the longest since Cleveland's Cody Anderson had a streak of 25.2 consecutive walkless innings in 2015.

 Through five career starts, he had 39 strikeouts against just four walks, making him the only pitcher since 1893 when the mound to plate distance was set at 60'6", to record 35-plus strikeouts and four or fewer walks in a pitcher's first 5 career MLB games.

BRINGING THE HEAT: Jones has thrown 23 pitches of 100.0+ mph this season...That's the fourth-most among Major League starting pitchers behind teammate Paul Skenes (79), Jose Soriano of the Angels (40) and Cincinnati's Hunter Greene (35)..23 pitches of 100.0+ mph is already the second-most by a Pirates starting pitcher in a single season since 2008, behind only Skenes' total this year.

ON DECK: The 22-year-old Skenes will be making his 18th start tomorrow afternoon... Struck out eight batters in 6.0 innings while winning a 7-0 decision in his last start on 8/22 against the Reds...Won each of his first six decisions before losing for the first time on 7/23 against the Cardinals...Has posted the lowest ERA (2.16) in all of MLB since making his debut on 5/11...Will be facing the Cubs for the third time after making his debut against them on 5/11 while also earning his first career win against them on 5/17 at Wrigley Field.
