CHICAGO CUBS (67-66) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (62-70)

AUGUST 28, 2024 AT PNC PARK, PITTSBURGH, PA - 12:35 EDT - GAME #133/HOME #68

RHP KYLE HENDRICKS (3-10, 6.33 ERA) vs. RHP PAUL SKENES (8-2, 2.16 ERA)

THE PIRATES: lost 9-5 last night in the middle game of their three-game series against the Cubs...Are 6-6 in their last 12 games following their season-high 10-game losing streak from August 4-14...Have won 15 games in their last at-bat (their most since having 16 last at-bat wins in 2021)...Have played in 47 one-run games, which are the most in MLB...Have the best stolen base percentage (85.7 percent) in MLB...Have recorded an extra base hit in a season-high 33 consecutive games (the third-longest active streak in all of MLB)...Have the fifth-most quality starts (57) in MLB behind the Mariners (81), Phillies (68), Royals (65) and Braves (58)...Are hitting .337 with the bases loaded; the fourth-highest average in MLB behind the Royals (.375) Diamondbacks (.369) and Reds (.350)...Will look to avoid being swept for the seventh time this season (were swept in three games at home by the Cubs last year from June 19-21).

ROOKIE SENSATION: Paul Skenes lowered his ERA to 2.16 after tossing 6.0 scoreless innings in his last start on August 22 against the Reds...According to Baseball Reference, Skenes' 2.16 ERA is the fourth-lowest by a Pirates starter (minimum 17 starts) in the last 100 years...The only three Pirates starters to post a lower ERA are Bob Veale (2.05 in 1968), Steve Blass (2.12 in 1968) and Vern Law (2.15 in 1965).

PAUL GETS THE CALL: Paul Skenes will make his 18th start of the season in the finale of this series against the Cubs...Skenes is one of five rookies in MLB history to strike out at least 11 batters per nine innings pitched while maintaining a WHIP below 1.00 (minimum 75 innings pitched)...The most recent rookie to finish a season with such numbers was Spencer Strider in 2022...Special thanks to StatsPerform.

BRYAN IN THE BOX: Bryan De La Cruz hit his first home run as a member of the Pirates last night while also recording his 10th RBI in his last eight games...De La Cruz' 10 RBI since August 20 are tied for the third-most in MLB along with Arizona's Eugenio Suarez...The only two players in MLB with more RBI in the last week are Miguel Amaya (13) and Aaron Judge (11).

OFF TO OHIO: The Pirates will bus to Cleveland tomorrow for a three-game series against the Guardians that gets underway Friday night...It's Pittsburgh's first trip to Cleveland since September 25-27, 2020...The Pirates are 8-9 on the road this season against the American League, including 6-3 in the last nine games.

HEY 19: Oneil Cruz has reached base safely in each of his last 19 games, which is the sixth-longest active streak in MLB coming into today (Francisco Lindor has the longest at 25 games)...Cruz is hitting .362 (25-for-69) with seven doubles, one triple, one home run, nine RBI and .966 OPS since the streak began on August 7...Cruz' .383 average this month ranks second in all of MLB...The only player with a higher average this month is Aaron Judge (.413).

PIRATING: Oneil Cruz has been successful in each of his last 16 attempts since being caught for the only time on April 22...The last Pirate to steal at least 16 consecutive bases without being caught is Bryan Reynolds (16 straight) from August 5, 2022, to September 11, 2023...The last Pirate to steal at least 16 consecutive bases without being caught in a single season is Nate McLouth (21 straight) from May 2 to September 28, 2008...Pittsburgh has been successful in an MLB-best 85.7 percent of its stolen base attempts.

THE REYNOLDS REPORT: Bryan Reynolds has hit safely in six of his last seven games and comes into today 13th in the National League with a .279 average...Reynolds is six hits shy of 800 in his career...Since the beginning of the 2019 season, he ranks 15th in MLB with 794 hits (Freddie Freeman is first with 967).

THIS AND THAT: Connor Joe is 8-for-15 in his career against Kyle Hendricks...Oneil Cruz took Hendricks deep here at PNC Park on May 12...Cruz has made one appearance in the outfield in his big league career, which came on August 16, 2022, when he played one inning in left field (no chances)...He has made two appearances (one start) in center field during spring training in his career (he had one total chance in his start on March 4, 2021, against the Braves).

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

August 28, 2002: Brian Giles had his second walkoff of the month, this time a single in the 10th, as the Pirates defeated the Braves 1-0 at PNC Park. Brian Meadows gave up just three hits over 8.0 scoreless innings, as he opposed Hall of Famer Greg Maddux, who went 9.0 scoreless. Craig Wilson had two hits, while Rob Mackowiak had one hit and scored the game's lone run.

TODAY'S STARTER **RHP PAUL SKENES** **#30**

2024 RECORD: 8-2, 2.16 ERA

HEIGHT/WEIGHT: 6-6/235 **BATS/THROWS:** R/R
BORN: May 29, 2002
AGE: 22 **SIGNED:** Thru 2024
HOW ACQUIRED: Selected by the Pirates in the 1st round (No. 1) of the 2023 Draft.

STARTING OFF: The 22-year-old righthander is in his first Major League season with the Pirates...He began the season with Triple-A Indianapolis where he posted an 0.99 ERA (27.1ip/3er) and recorded 45 strikeouts while allowing just eight walks in seven starts before being selected to the Major League roster on May 11...Was the No. 1 overall selection by the Pirates in the 2023 First-Year Player draft out of Louisiana State University.

LAST TIME OUT: Skenes allowed two hits in 6.0 innings, struck out nine batters, and earned his eighth win in the team's 7-0 shutout on August 22 against the Reds at PNC Park.

VS. CHICAGO (NL): Skenes will be making his third start against the Cubs this afternoon...He struck each of the first two and seven batters total in 4.0-plus innings in his MLB debut on May 11 at PNC Park...According to Baseball Reference, that was the second-most strikeouts by a Pirates starter age 21 or younger in their debut behind Nick Maddox (11) in 1907...He also threw 6.0 no-hit innings with 11 strikeouts, including fanning the first seven hitters of the game on May 17 at Wrigley Field for his first career win...He was the first Pirate to ever strike out seven-plus consecutive hitters to start a game.

BODY OF WORK: Is making his 18th career start and appearance this afternoon...He has allowed three earned runs or fewer in 16 of his 17 career outings, including two or fewer 14 times and one or fewer nine times (four scoreless outings).

- Of his 17 career starts, 13 have been quality starts...The 13 quality starts are tied for the most on the team with Mitch Keller.

AS A PIRATES ROOKIE: Skenes comes into today with 130 strikeouts, which ranks second among all National League rookies behind Chicago's Shota Imanaga (140)...Skenes' 130 punchouts are already the most by a Pirates rookie since Kris Benson had 139 in 1999...Skenes also has eight wins after his first 17 starts...His eight wins are the most by a Pirates rookie since Gerrit Cole had 10 in 2013.

SELECT COMPANY: Skenes lowered his ERA to 2.16 after tossing 6.0 scoreless innings in his last start...According to Baseball Reference, Skenes' 2.16 ERA is the fourth-lowest by a Pirates starter (minimum 17 starts) in the last 100 years...The only three Pirates starters to post a lower ERA are Bob Veale (2.05 in 1968), Steve Blass (2.12 in 1968) and Vern Law (2.15 in 1965).

HERE'S THE PITCH: Skenes has a 30.0 whiff percentage when throwing his sinker this year according to Baseball Savant...That's the eighth-best whiff percentage among all pitchers in MLB according to Baseball Savant...The only seven pitchers with a better whiff percentage when throwing the sinker are Andres Munoz (45.3 percent), Tanner Banks (38.2 percent), Aroldis Chapman (33.3 percent), Josh Hader (32.9 percent), Nestor Cortes (31.6 percent), Kenley Jansen (30.3 percent) and Edwin Uceta (30.1 percent).

LEAGUE LEADERS: Since making his Major League debut on May 11, Skenes ranks among the NL leaders in ERA (first, 2.16), WHIP (second, 0.94), strikeout-to-walk ratio (third, 5.20), strikeouts (fourth, 130), strikeouts per 9.0 IP (second, 11.23) and batting average against (second, .198).

100 K CLUB: Skenes reached 100 career strikeouts in his 13th career game in his outing on July 29 at Houston...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became just the sixth player all-time since the current mound distance was established in 1893 to reach 100 strikeouts in 13 or fewer games and the first since Masahiro Tanaka did so in 2014...The others to do so were Kerry Wood in 1998 (12 games), Hideo Nomo in 1995 (12 games), Jose DeLeon in 1983 (13 games) and Herb Score in 1955 (12 games).

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: Skenes made the start for the National League at the 2024 All-Star Game in Arlington on July 16, tossing a scoreless first inning with three groundouts and a walk...He was the first Pirate to earn the starting honors in the All-Star Game since Jerry Reuss in 1975...Dock Ellis (1971), Bob Friend (1960 All-Star Game on July 11), Vernon Law (1960 All-Star Game on July 13) and Bob Friend (1956) are the only other Pirate pitchers to start in the Midsummer Classic.

- He was the fifth rookie to ever start the All-Star game, joining LAD Hideo Nomo in 1995, LAD Fernando Valenzuela in 1981, DET Mark Fidrych in 1976 and WSH Dave Stenhouse in 1962.

MEMORABLE DAY AT WRIGLEY: On May 17 in his second career Major League start, Skenes threw 6.0 no-hit innings with 11 strikeouts against the Cubs, including fanning the first seven hitters of the game...He was the first Pirate ever strike out seven-plus consecutive hitters to start a game and the third Major League rookie of all-time to do so, joining Jacob deGrom on Sept. 15, 2014 (8 K in his 21st career game) and Jim Deshaies on Sept. 23, 1986 (8 K in his 28th career game).

ON DECK: The 27-year-old Falter will make his 23rd start of the season Friday night when the Pirates open a three-game series on the road against Cleveland...Allowed five runs in 5.0 innings and was in line for the loss before having a no-decision in the team's 6-5 comeback win on 8/23 against the Reds...Is 2-0 in his last three starting assignments on the road since losing for the last time on 6/24 at Cincinnati...Is 2-0 in his last five starts since losing a 5-2 decision against the Mets on 7/6 at PNC Park.

JUST KEEP WINNING: Skenes took his first loss as a professional (Major or Minor Leagues) on July 23 vs. St. Louis despite pitching a career-high 8.1 innings, allowing just two runs on four hits with eight strikeouts and no walks in what was his 12th career start...He was the first pitcher in Pirates history to not take a loss in each of his first 11 Major League games, all of which were starts...The previous best had been 10 by Zach Duke in 2005 (source: Elias Sports Bureau).

NO HITS (AGAIN): On July 11 at Milwaukee, Skenes threw 7.0 no-hit innings, walking one and matching his career high with 11 strikeouts...He was the seventh Pirates pitcher to ever leave a game with 7.0+ no-hit innings and the first since Francisco Cordova (9.0) did so in a combined, extra-inning no-hit bid on July 12, 1997.

RACKING UP PUNCHIES: Skenes recorded seven or more strikeouts in nine consecutive games dating back to the second game of the doubleheader in Detroit on May 29 through his start on July 23 vs. St. Louis, surpassing the previous franchise record of seven set by Mitch Keller from April 27-May 31, 2023.

- The nine-game streak matched the Major League record by a rookie, done by Dwight Gooden from August 11-September 23, 1984 and Brandon Beachy from August 9-September 24, 2011 [source: Elias Sports Bureau].
- In total, Skenes has recorded seven or more strikeouts in 13 of his 17 career outings.

MILITARY MAN: Spent the first two years of his collegiate career at the Air Force Academy, where he earned the 2022 John Olerud Award as the nation's best two-way player while both pitching and catching...He majored in Military Strategic Studies while at Air Force and was a member of Cadet Squadron 9.

- Has pledged to donate \$100 for every strikeout he records this season to the Gary Sinise Foundation to support our nation's defenders, veterans, first responders, their families,
