FLIGHT PATTERN: The St. Louis Cardinals conclude a six-game road trip with the last of a three-game series against the first place Milwaukee Brewers tonight. St. Louis entered today in 3rd place in the National League Central, 11.0 games back of Milwaukee and 5.5 games out of the 3rd Wild Card position. The Cardinals are 3-2 on this current road trip after taking 2-of-3 at the New York Yankees. Following an open date tomorrow, the Cardinals begin a six-game homestand over seven days welcoming the Seattle Mariners (Sept. 6-8) and Cincinnati Reds (Sept. 10-12).

RECENT REDBIRDS: The Cardinals scored a run in the 11th inning and three more in the 12th to win 7-4 in 12 innings, matching their longest game of the season by innings. **Paul Goldschmidt** was 3-for-5 with a home run (#21), double and stolen base, while **Michael Siani** roped a two-RBI single in the 12th inning for the game-winner.

GOTTA BEAT THE BEST TO BE THE BEST: The Cardinals are 10-8 over their current 22-game stretch against playoff contending teams: vs. Los Angeles-NL (1-2), vs. Milwaukee (2-1), at Minnesota (2-1), vs. San Diego (2-2), at New York-AL (2-1), at Milwaukee (1, 1-1) and vs. Seattle (3).

THE BOYS OF RUBBER: The Cardinals are playing in their 19th rubber match game of the 2024 season. St. Louis has won their last three series-clinching rubber match games and are 11-7 overall this season.

FANTASTIC FINISHES: Since winning their 11th World Series in 2011, the Cardinals have the 2nd-most wins in Major League Baseball during the month of September with 210, trailing only the Los Angeles Dodgers (213) over those 14 seasons. The Cardinals nine wins since August 21, are tied for 2nd in MLB trailing only the New York Mets (10).

GOLDY JOINS JOLTIN' JOE: **Paul Goldschmidt** slammed his 21st home run of the season in the 4th inning last night giving him 361 for his career. The home run tied him with Yankees' Hall of Fame outfielder **Joe DiMaggio** for 86th all-time and also tied **Joe "Ducky" Medwick** for 14th in Cardinals history with 152. Goldschmidt is currently on a 10-game hitting streak, his longest of the season and has doubled in a career-high six straight games, longest active streak in MLB and by a Cardinal since **Yadier Molina** set the franchise record with a double in eight straight games in 2016. Goldschmidt's home run left the bat at 110.1 MPH and traveled 430-feet, his 2nd hardest hit and 2nd-longest home run of the season.

TWO GOOD TO BE TRUE: Tonight's starting pitcher **Sonny Gray** is 12-0 (Cardinals are 14-2) when he receives two or more runs of support (while in the game) this season. Gray is 0-9 when he receives one or zero. Gray's 12 wins marks his highest single-season total since a career-high 14 in back-to-back seasons (2014 & 2015).

THIS ROAD TRIP, SPONSORED BY THE LETTER "K": During this six-game road trip, Cardinals pitchers have struck out 57 batters over 46.0 innings in their first five games. The 57 strikeouts since August 30 are tied for the most in MLB with their current opponent, the Milwaukee Brewers. The Brewers have pitched 13.1 more innings over that period with one more game due to a doubleheader in Cincinnati on Friday. St. Louis pitchers are averaging an MLB-best 11.15 strikeouts/9 IP over the last five days.

BAKER STREET: Rookie **Luken Baker** hit a sacrifice fly in his lone pinch-hit plate appearance on Monday, but in the process ran his RBI streak to five games. According to *Elias Sports Bureau*, Baker joins **Jeremy Hazelbaker** (Apr. 6-11, 2016 - 5 games) and **Albert Pujols** (May 10-16, 2001 - 6 games & May 4-8, 2001 - 5 games) as the only Cardinals players in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to run off RBI streaks of five or more games in their first 43 Major League games.

HALL OF FAME WEEKEND: This upcoming weekend, when the Cardinals host the Seattle Mariners, will be the 2024 Cardinals Hall of Fame Induction ceremony. Pitching coach **Dave Duncan**, pitcher **Matt Morris** and third baseman **Whitey Kurowski** (posthumously) will be honored with their red jackets. The Walk of Fame plaque presentation will take place at 6:30 p.m., on Friday, while the induction ceremony will take place on the Together Credit Union Plaza at Ballpark Village on Saturday at 3:00 p.m.

MILWAUKEE CONNECTIONS

Ryan Helsley (April 16, 2019) made his MLB debut at Milwaukee.

Devin Williams was born in nearby Florissant, Mo...was 1st Team Rawlings/Perfect Game Pre-season High School All-American at Hazelwood West High School in 2013...committed to the Univ. of Missouri before drafted by Milwaukee in the 2nd round in 2013.

Trevor Megill was originally selected by St. Louis in the 3rd round of the 2014 MLB Draft, but did not sign to return to Loyola Marymount Univ.

Cardinals AGM/Player Development **Gary LaRocque** was selected by Milwaukee in the 14th round of the 1975 MLB Draft.

Hall of Famer **Ted Simmons** played five seasons with Milwaukee (1981-85), where he was a two-time AL All-Star and faced off against St. Louis in the 1982 World Series...traded to Milwaukee with **Rollie Fingers** and **Pete Vuckovich** in exchange for **David Green**, **Sixto Lezcano**, **Dave LaPoint** and **Lary Sorensen**.

Willson Contreras's younger brother, **William**, is also a catcher for the Brewers.

Bryan Hudson graduated from Alton (Ill.) High School, where he set school records for career wins (25) and strikeouts (324)...committed to the University of Missouri prior to being drafted by the Cubs in the 3rd round. of 2015.

Joe Ross's older brother **Tyson Ross**, pitched in nine games for the Cardinals in 2018.

Turner Ward played parts of three seasons (1994-96) with the Brewers.

Ricky Horton made five starts for the Denver Zephyrs (AAA) in the Brewers organization in 1990.

Steve Dillard, father of Brewers broadcaster **Tim Dillard**, was hitting coach for the Single-A Quad Cities Swing/River Bandits from 2006-07 and hitting coach for the High-A Palm Beach Cardinals in 2007...later piloted Quad Cities in 2008-09, where he managed infielder **Oliver Marmol**.

Cardinals Hall of Famer & broadcaster **Jim Edmonds** played in 73 games for Milwaukee in 2010.

Brewers broadcaster **Bob Uecker** played two seasons (1964-65) with St. Louis...won the 1964 World Series...traded by the Milwaukee Braves to St. Louis for **Jimmie Coker** and **Gary Kolb** (Apr. 9, 1964).

Brewers broadcaster **Jeff Levering** previously worked three seasons (2010-12) as broadcaster for the Springfield Cardinals (AA).

KMOX broadcaster **Matt Pauley** hosted Brewers pre- and postgame shows for parts of six seasons (2017-22)...was radio play-by-play voice of the Univ. of Wisconsin-Green Bay women's basketball team.

Cardinals Special Asst. to the GM, Player Procurement **Matt Slater** is a Marquette Univ. graduate...started in pro baseball as the Brewers' Scouting and Player Development Assistant (1991).

Cardinals Dir. of Medical Ops/Head Athletic Trainer **Adam Olsen** is a native of Green Bay...graduated from the University of Wisconsin-Madison.

- Makes his 305th career appearance (296th start) and 26th start of the season as a member of the Cardinals.
- Gray's 179 strikeouts are the 4th-most by a pitcher in their first season with St. Louis behind **Darryl Kile** (192 in 2000), **Todd Stottlemire** (194 in 1996), and **José DeLeón** (208 in 1988).
- His 179 strikeouts in his first 25 starts with the Cardinals are the most in franchise history. He was the 9th Cardinal in history to record 100+ strikeouts in his first 14 starts of any season. **Bob Gibson** leads with four such seasons (1965, 1966, 1969, 1970).
- Is four strikeouts away from reaching 183 for the season to match his strikeout totals from 2014 and 2023, 2nd-most in his career behind 205 in 2019.
- His 10.91 SO/9 IP is currently the highest single-season mark in franchise history. **Jack Flaherty** (10.59 in 2019) ranks 2nd-highest.
- Is 12-0 (Cardinals are 14-2) when he receives two or more runs of support (while in the game) this season. Is 0-9 when he receives one or zero.
- Has allowed 21 HR this season, but only five at Busch Stadium. Has surrendered a home run in a career high six straight starts (Aug. 1-present).
- Since 2014, Gray and teammate **Kyle Gibson** are the only two MLB pitchers with 10 or more seasons with 20 or more starts (2014-19, 2021-24). The 2024 season is his 7th career making 25 or more starts.
- His 11 wins this season are his most since a career-high 14 in 2015 with Oakland, part of consecutive seasons (2014-15) with 14 wins.
- Despite missing first 11 games of season, his 121 strikeouts prior to All-Star break were the most by Cardinal since **Carlos Martinez** fanned 128 in 2017 (18 starts).
- Has a 56.8 strikeout pct. on his Sweeper pitch this season (fanning 100 in 176 plate appearances), MLB's 2nd-best K% of any pitch behind **Fernando Cruz** (62.9% Split-Finger) (minimum 100 plate appearances).
- Gray's 32.1 Put Away % on his sinker is the 4th-highest of any MLB pitcher's pitch this season. Teammate **Ryan Helsley**'s slider (34.0%) leads MLB.
- Gray (1,718.2), **David Price** (2,143.0) and **Scott Sanderson** (2,561.2) are the only three Vanderbilt University baseball alums to surpass 1,700 innings in their MLB careers.
- Opened the season with 17.0 scoreless innings, longest by a Cardinals starting pitcher this season and 4th-longest in MLB. The last time a Cardinals starting pitcher opened the season with 17.0+ scoreless innings was **Woody Williams** (24.2 IP) in 2003, who set the franchise record in the Divisional Era (1969-present). - *Elias*

- Limited San Diego to one run on three hits over 6.0 inning in the Cardinals 4-1 win on Thursday at Busch Stadium, snapping a season-high three-game losing streak. His lone blemish was a Jackson Merrill solo homer.
