# PITTSBURGH PIRATES (64-73) vs. CHICAGO CUBS (71-67) SEPTEMBER 3, 2024 AT WRIGLEY FIELD, CHICAGO, IL - 6:40 CDT - GAME #138/ROAD #70 RHP PAUL SKENES (8-2, 2.23 ERA) vs. RHP KYLE HENDRICKS (3-10, 6.75 ERA)

THE PIRATES: scored four times in the eighth inning to highlight a 5-3 comeback win last night against the Cubs...Have won 15 games in their last at-bat (their most since having 16 last at-bat wins in 2021)...Have won eight games when trailing after seven innings (their most since winning nine times in 2019 when trailing after seven frames)...

Have played in 47 one-run games, which are the most in MLB (played 39 one-run games in all of 2023)...Have the best stolen base percentage (86.8 percent) in MLB...Are tied for fifth in MLB with 59 quality starts (Seattle leads with 81)...Are hitting .340 with the bases loaded; the fourth-highest average in MLB behind the Royals (.384) Diamondbacks (.375) and Reds (.349)...Have the third-highest batting average (.247) in MLB in pinch-hit situations behind Baltimore (.356) and Arizona (.282)...Have scored the fifth-most runs (59) in MLB since August 22 behind the Cubs (102), Brewers (74), Diamondbacks (71) and Dodgers (64).

**THE BEAR FACTS:** Paul Skenes has tallied 24 strikeouts against the Cubs this season...That's tied for the most by any Pirates rookie against the Cubs in the modern era along with Preacher Roe in 1944...The only MLB rookie to reach 30 strikeouts in their first four games against the Cubs was Jack Sanford for the Phillies in 1957 (34)...Courtesy of StatsPerform.

**ROOKIE RECORD WATCH:** Paul Skenes comes into today with 136 strikeouts...That's the third-most in a single season by a Pirates rookie since 1900 behind Cy Blanton (142 in 1935) and Kris Benson (139 in 1999)...Special thanks to the Elias Sports Bureau.

**THE ARMS RACE:** Pittsburgh's rookie pitchers have recorded 343 strikeouts this season...That's the third-most in all of MLB behind the Athletics (453) and Giants (436)...The Cubs rank fourth in that category with 341 punchouts from their rookies...Specials thanks to the Elias Sports Bureau.

**STREAKING CUTCH:** Andrew McCutchen brings a season-high 14-game hitting streak into today, which is the longest active streak in MLB...McCutchen has gone 18-for-55 (.327) with two doubles, five home runs, 17 RBI and a 1.051 OPS during his current 14-game hitting streak... McCutchen's last single-season hitting streak of more than 14 games came in 2015 when he hit safely in a career-high 18 straight games with the Pirates...McCutchen has also reached base safely in 15 straight games, which is tied for the third-longest active streak in MLB behind Francisco Lindor (31 games) and Yordan Alvarez (26 games).

**DENNIS DEALING:** Dennis Santana has retired each of his last 18 batters since allowing a single

to Cincinnati's Santiago Espinal in the seventh inning on August 23...Beginning with his outing on August 11, Santana has issued just one hit in 37 at-bats (.027 batting average against) while also allowing just one walk in 13.1 innings.

**LET'S GO REYNOLDS:** Bryan Reynolds recorded the 400th RBI of his career with his three-run home run in the eighth inning in Monday's comeback win...Reynolds' 400 RBI ranks 39th in team history since RBI became an official stat in 1920...Reynolds also

has 298 extra base hits in his career with the Pirates...His next extra base hit will tie him with Pirates Hall of Famer Manny Sanguillen for 36th in team history in that category.

**CONNOR AND THE CUBS:** Connor Joe has four home runs against the Cubs this year...It's the first time in his career hitting more than two home runs against a single opponent in a season...The only Pirates this century with more home runs in a season against the Cubs were Brian Giles in 2002 (seven) and Starling Marte in 2019 (five).

**PIRATING:** Oneil Cruz has been successful in each of his last 18 attempts since being caught for the only time on April 22...The last Pirate to steal at least 18 consecutive bases without being caught in a single season is Nate McLouth (21 straight) from May 2 to September 28, 2008...Pittsburgh has 18 stolen bases in its last 13 games...The last time a Pirates runner was caught stealing was on August 7...Pittsburgh's 86.8 percent stolen-base success rate leads MLB.

### **TODAY'S STARTER** RHP PAUL SKENES #30

**HOW ACQUIRED:** Selected by the Pirates in the 1st round (No. 1) of the 2023 Draft.

**STARTING OFF:** The 22-year-old righthander is in his first Major League season with the Pirates...He began the season with Triple-A Indianapolis where he posted an 0.99 ERA (27.1ip/3er) and recorded 45 strikeouts while allowing just eight walks in seven starts before being selected to the Major League roster on May 11...Was the No. 1 overall selection by the Pirates in the 2023 First-Year Player draft out of Louisiana State University.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Skenes allowed three runs (2er) in 5.0 innings and left with a 10-3 lead against the Cubs on Wednesday...The Cubs then scored two runs in the seventh inning, three in the eighth, and six times in the ninth inning to rally to a 14-10 win.

**VS. CHICAGO (NL):** Skenes will be making his fourth start against the Cubs...He struck each of the first two and seven batters total in 4.0-plus innings in his MLB debut on May 11 at PNC Park... According to Baseball Reference, that was the second-most strikeouts by a Pirates starter age 21 or younger in their debut behind Nick Maddox (11) in 1907...He also threw 6.0 no-hit innings with 11 strikeouts, including fanning the first seven hitters of the game, on May 17 at Wrigley Field for his first career win...He was the first Pirate to ever strike out seven-plus consecutive hitters to start a game...He also allowed three runs (2er) in 5.0 innings and left with a 10-3 lead on 8/28 but had a no-decision...The Cubs then scored two runs in the seventh inning, three in the eighth, and six times in the ninth inning to rally to a 14-10 win.

**BODY OF WORK:** Is making his 19th career start and appearance tonight...He has allowed three earned runs or fewer in 17 of his 18 career outings, including two or fewer 15 times and one or fewer nine times (four scoreless outings).

 Of his 18 career starts, 13 have been quality starts, which is tied with Mitch Keller for the most on the team.

**AS A PIRATES ROOKIE:** Skenes comes into tonight with 136 strikeouts, which ranks second among all National League rookies behind Chicago's Shota Imanaga (148)...Skenes' 136 punchouts are already the most by a Pirates rookie since Kris Benson had 139 strikeouts in 1999... Skenes also has eight wins after his first 18 starts...His eight wins are the most by a Pirates rookie since Gerrit Cole had 10 in 2013.

**SELECT COMPANY:** Skenes had a 2.16 ERA after tossing 6.0 scoreless innings in his start on August 22 against the Reds...According to Baseball Reference, Skenes' 2.16 ERA was the fourth-lowest by a Pirates starter (minimum 17 starts) in the last 100 years...The only three Pirates starters to post a lower ERA are Bob Veale (2.05 in 1968), Steve Blass (2.12 in 1968) and Vern Law (2.15 in 1965).

**DON'T STRAY TOO FAR:** Skenes has three pickoffs this year, which are tied for the fourth-most in the National League...Atlanta's Charlie Morton leads all National League pitchers with six pickoffs...Aroldis Chapman ranks second with five, while Patrick Corbin is third with four.

**LEAGUE LEADERS:** Since making his Major League debut on May 11, Skenes ranks among the NL leaders in ERA (first, 2.23), WHIP (first, 0.95), strikeout-to-walk ratio (third, 5.23), strikeouts (third, 136), strikeouts per 9.0 IP (second, 11.23) and batting average against (second, .201).

100 K CLUB: Skenes reached 100 career strikeouts in his 13th career game in his outing on July 29 at Houston...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became just the sixth player all-time since the current mound distance was established in 1893 to reach 100 strikeouts in 13 or fewer games and the first since Masahiro Tanaka did so in 2014...The others to do so were Kerry Wood in 1998 (12 games), Hideo Nomo in 1995 (12 games), Jose DeLeon in 1983 (13 games) and Herb Score in 1955 (12 games).

**HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR:** Skenes made the start for the National League at the 2024 All-Star Game in Arlington on July 16, tossing a scoreless first inning with three groundouts and a walk...He was the first Pirate to earn the starting honors in the All-Star Game since Jerry Reuss in 1975...Dock Ellis (1971), Bob Friend (1960 All-Star Game on July 11), Vernon Law (1960 All-Star Game on July 13) and Bob Friend (1956) are the only other Pirate pitchers to start in the Midsummer Classic

 He was the fifth rookie to ever start the All-Star game, joining LAD Hideo Nomo in 1995, LAD Fernando Valenzuela in 1981, DET Mark Fidrych in 1976 and WSH Dave Stenhouse in 1962.

JUST KEEP WINNING: Skenes took his first loss as a professional (Major or Minor Leagues) on July 23 vs. St. Louis despite pitching a career-high 8.1 innings, allowing just two runs on four hits with eight strikeouts and no walks in what was his 12th career start...He was the first pitcher in Pirates history to not take a loss in each of his first 11 Major League games, all of which were starts...The previous best had been 10 by Zach Duke in 2005 (source: Elias Sports Bureau).

#### TOMORROW'S STARTER

The Pirates have not announced a starter for tomorrow's series finale.

**RACKING UP PUNCHIES:** Skenes recorded seven or more strikeouts in nine consecutive games dating back to the second game of the doubleheader in Detroit on May 29 through his start on July 23 vs. St. Louis, surpassing the previous franchise record of seven set by Mitch Keller from April 27-May 31, 2023.

- The nine-game streak matched the Major League record by a rookie, done by Dwight Gooden from August 11-September 23, 1984 and Brandon Beachy from August 9-September 24, 2011 [source: Elias Sports Bureau].
- In total, Skenes has recorded seven or more strikeouts in 13 of his 17 career outings.

MILITARY MAN: Spent the first two years of his collegiate career at the Air Force Academy, where he earned the 2022 John Olerud Award as the nation's best two-way player while both pitching and catching...He majored in Military Strategic Studies while at Air Force and was a member of Cadet Squadron 9.

Has pledged to donate \$100 for every strikeout he records this season to the Gary Sinise Foundation to support our nation's defenders, veterans, first responders, their families, and those in need...ESPN's Pat McAfee has also pledged to match Paul's donation at the end of the season.
