RECENT REDBIRDS: The St. Louis Cardinals and Seattle Mariners play the second game of a three-game Interleague series tonight at Busch Stadium ... The Redbirds continue their six-game homestand on Tuesday with three games against the division-rival Cincinnati Reds ... Since August 12, the Cardinals are 1-7 in series openers but sport a 10-5 record during all other games (5-2 in middle games and 5-2 in finales).

FLIGHT PATTERN: With 21 games remaining, St. Louis enters today in 3rd place in the National League Central, 10.0 games back of Milwaukee, and 6.0 games out of the 3rd Wild Card spot ... St. Louis owns tiebreakers over the San Diego Padres, Atlanta Braves, and Chicago Cubs.

ROYCROFT RECALLED: The Cardinals announced that they recalled RHP Chris Roycroft from Memphis (AAA) and optioned RHP Kyle Leahy to Memphis (AAA) following last night's game ... Since re-joining Memphis on August 1, Roycroft has logged a 2.60 ERA (17.1 IP) and two saves while striking out 19 batters in 14 relief appearances.

COME AS YOU ARE: The Cardinals have won seven of 10 over the Mariners in the city of St. Louis (3-0 at Busch II & 4-3 at Busch III), for their best home win pct. (.700) against any visitor since joining the National League in 1892.

HOMEWORK ASSIGNMENT: The Cardinals are in a stretch where they are home for 13 of 16 games from Sept. 6-22 ... Their lone road games over the two-week period is a three-game International Interleague series at Toronto (Sept. 13-15).

GOTTA BEAT THE BEST TO BE THE BEST: The Cardinals are 11-9 over their current 22-game stretch against playoff contending teams: vs. Los Angeles Dodgers (1-2), vs. Milwaukee (2-1), at Minnesota (2-1), vs. San Diego (2-2), at New York Yankees (2-1), at Milwaukee (2-1) and vs. Seattle (0-1).

CARDINALS BIRTHDAY WEEK: Happy 52nd birthday to Cardinals Hall of Fame closer Jason Isringhausen ... Additional Cardinals celebrating birthdays over the next week include Lars Nootbaar (turns 27 tomorrow), JoJo Romero (28 on Sunday, Sept. 9), Paul Goldschmidt (37 on Tuesday, Sept. 10), Keynan Middleton (31 on Thursday, Sept. 12), and John King (30 on Saturday, Sept. 14).

FANTASTIC FINISHES: Since winning their 11th World Series in 2011, the Cardinals have the 2nd-most wins (211) in Major League Baseball during the month of September, trailing only the Los Angeles Dodgers (213) over those 14 seasons ... The Cardinals 10 wins since August 21 are tied for 3rd in MLB trailing the Mets (12) and Phillies (12).

HELS BELLS: With a save tonight, All-Star closer Ryan Helsley will have converted his 43rd of the season to tie Hall of Famer Lee Smith (43 in 1992 and 1993) for 6th-most in Cardinals single-season history ... Helsley has either won or saved 49 games this season, 5th-highest total in Cardinals history (Lee Smith leads with 53 - 47 saves and 6 wins in 1991).

BAKER STREET: Rookie Luken Baker hit a game-winning RBI single in the 10th inning on Wednesday in Milwaukee, extending his RBI streak to six games (Aug. 27-present), longest active in MLB ... According to Elias, Baker joins Albert Pujols (May 10-16, 2001 - 6 games) as the only two Cardinals in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to run off RBI streaks of 6+ games in their first 44 Major League games ... Brendan Donovan (7 games from June 17-24) is the only Cardinal this season with a longer RBI streak.

Lance Lynn was originally selected by Seattle in the 6th round of the 2005 MLB Draft, but did not

sign to attend the University of Mississippi

Randy Arozarena played in 19 games for St. Louis Handy Arozarena played in 19 games for St. Louis in 2019 and parts of three minor league seasons in the Cardinals organization (2017-19)...originally signed with the Cardinals as an international free agent (Aug. 1, 2016)...traded to Tampa Bay with José Martínez, and Cardinals Compensation draft pick A (INF Alika Williams) in exchange for **Matthew Liberatore**, **Edgardo Rodriguez** and Rays Compensation draft pick B (RHP **Tink** Hence). Jan. 9, 2020.

Cardinals broadcaster **Chip Caray** worked for the Seattle Mariners for three seasons (1993-95).

Mariners Pitching Strategy Coach **Trent Black** was born in St. Louis...graduated from nearby Columbia (III.) High School.

SEATTLE CONNECTIONS

Andrew Kittredge was born in and resides in Spokane, WA...graduated from Joel E. Ferris High School in Spokane...originally selected by his home state Mariners in the 45th round of the 2008 MLB Draft, but did not sign to attend the University of Washington...pitched three seasons for the Huskies (2009-11) before signing as a minor league free agent with Seattle in 2011... pitched six seasons in the Mariners minor league organization (2011-16) before traded with Dalton Kelly and Dylan Thompson to Tampa Bay for Taylor Motter and Richie Shaffer (Nov. 18, 2016).

John King made his MLB debut at T-Mobile Park with Texas (Sept. 4, 2020)...fanned Kyle Lewis (swinging) that night for his first MLB strikeout.

Mariners broadcaster Rick Rizzs is a 1975 graduate of Southern Illinois Univ. in Carbondale...pre-viously served as a broadcaster for the Memphis Chicks (AA-Expos) from 1978-80.

Riley O'Brien was born in Seattle and resides in Shoreline, WA... graduated from Shorewood (WA) High School...pitched two seasons at Everett (WA) Community College (2014-15)...traded by Cincinnati to the Mariners for **Luis Chevalier** (April 17, 2022) and pitched in one game for Seattle (May 7, 2022 vs. TB)...2023 PCL Post-Season All-Star for AAA-Tacoma...acquired by the Cardinals from the Mariners for cash considerations (Nov. 5, 2023).

Luis Urías's brother, Ramón Urías, played two seasons (2018-19) in the Cardinals minor leagues.

Mariners broadcaster Aaron Goldsmith was born in St. Louis...graduated from Principia Colle Elsah, III...began broadcast career in 2007 with the nearby Gateway Grizzlies in the independent Frontier League.

Cardinals Hall of Famer Vince Coleman played in Seattle in 1995, including all 11 postseason games.

- Making 27th start of the season and as a member of the Cardinals (321st career start).
- Pitching on 7 days rest following one of his finest starts of the season last Sat. (8/31)
 when he gained the Cardinals 1st road win against the NY Yankees since Bob Gibson did
 so in Game 5 of the 1964 World Series.
- Durable starting pitcher has now logged 10 seasons of 20 or more starts since 2014, tied with teammate **Sonny Gray** for most in MLB (2014-19, 2021-24).
- Is 4-2 with a 3.43 ERA in 11 day starts this season as opposed to 4-4 with a 5.16 ERA in 15 night starts. Home/Road splits are 2-4, 5.24 at Busch and 6-2, 3.65 on the road.
- Needs one more win to tie Stephen Strasburg (113) for the most wins of any pitcher from the MLB 2009 draft class.
- Limited his opposition to two earned runs or fewer in 14-of-26 starts, 3rd among Cardinals starters behind Sonny Gray (15) behind Erick Fedde (17).
- Boasts a 41.8% Whiff Pct. on Sweepers, 2nd-highest for the Sweeper (Gray, STL, 42.9%) among MLB starting pitchers.
- Is 7 strikeouts shy of 1,500 for his career. Has had 100+ K's in each of his 10 full seasons played including this year (134).
- Five of his starts have been delayed by rain (5 hr. 14 min. total) and he was scratched from his scheduled start on 6/19 at MIA during warm-ups due to back tightness.
- Has started four doubleheader games this season (April 30-1 at Detroit; June 26-1 vs. Atlanta; June 13-2 vs. Chicago Cubs; July 20-1 at Atlanta), most by a Cardinal since Daniel Ponce de Leon (4 in 2020) and most in a non-COVID-19 affected season since Bob Forsch (4 in 1983). Elias
- St. Louis area resident and Univ. of Missouri Baseball alum signed with the Cardinals
 as a free agent last November. Is one of three free-agent starters (Sonny Gray & Lance
 Lynn) that the Cardinals signed last off-season. Pitching for his fifth MLB team: Twins
 (2013-19), Rangers (2020-21), Phillies (2021-22), Orioles (2023) and Cardinals (2024).

LAST TIME OUT

 Put together one of his finest games of the season with a 7.0 inning effort in 6-5 win over the Yankees last Sat. (8/31), allowing just one run. It was the first Cardinals road win against the Yankees since the 1964 World Series (also won by a Gibson - Hall of Famer Bob Gibson in Game 5).

- Is trying to snap a 4-game losing streak against Seattle that covers 7 starts dating back to his last win on 6/13/17 at Minnesota (20-7).
- His team's were victorious in 7 of his first 10 career starts vs. the Mariners, but have lost each of his last six, including two last season in his most recent meetings with the M's. Has made 10 starts while with MIN, three with TEX and two with BAL.
- His 13 career HR's allowed vs. Seattle are 4th-most against any team behind DET (19), CLE (17) and CWS (15).
- Allowed a career single-game high 9 runs & 12 hits in his last start against the Mariners (8/11/23 at SEA), including 3 HR's.
