**FLIGHT PATTERN:** The St. Louis Cardinals begin a six-game road trip today visiting New York (Aug. 30-Sept. 1) and Milwaukee (Sept. 2-4) against two division leaders. The Cardinals and Yankees represent the World Series Championship leaders in each league with the Cardinals boasting 11 in the National League and the Yankees with 27 in the American League. The Cardinals defeated the Yankees in the 1926, 1942 and 1964 World Series and lost to them in 1928 and 1943. St. Louis entered today in 3rd place in the National League Central, 10.5 games back of Milwaukee and 6.0 games out of the 3rd Wild Card position.

**RECENT REDBIRDS:** The Cardinals played an afternoon game yesterday defeating the San Diego Padres 4-1 at Busch Stadium to split a four-game series and win the season series 4-3. The team arrived at their Manhattan hotel at 11:00 p.m., Eastern Time last night. After four straight games with temperatures hovering in the high 90's, they will experience nearly a 30-degree temperature change with a high of 70 in the Bronx tonight.

**PHAM DFA'd; WALKER RECALLED:** Prior to tonight's game the Cardinals recalled OF **Jordan Walker** from Memphis (AAA) and designated OF **Tommy Pham** for assignment. Walker was recently optioned to Memphis on August 20 and batted .348 (8-23) in six games since.

**GOTTA BEAT THE BEST TO BE THE BEST:** The Cardinals are 7-6 over their current 22-game stretch against playoff contending teams: vs. Los Angeles-NL (1-2), vs. Milwaukee (2-1), at Minnesota (2-1), vs. San Diego (2-2), at New York-AL (3), at Milwaukee (3) and vs. Seattle (3).

**THE SUMMER OF '64:** The St. Louis Cardinals are the only team in Major League Baseball who have not recorded a win at new Yankee Stadium. The Cardinals last win in the Bronx came on October 12, 1964, when they defeated the Yankees 5-2 in Game 5 of the World Series. **Tim McCarver's** 10th inning three-run home run backed a 10-inning complete game behind Bob Gibson. Only former National League president **Bill White (1B)** and former Cardinals General Manager **Dal Maxvill (2B)** remain alive from Cardinals who played in that game.

**A BRONX TALE:** The Cardinals will play only their 4th regular season game at the new Yankee Stadium, fewest among visiting teams since the stadium opened in 2009 and their 2nd-fewest at any active stadium behind Globe Life Field (3 in 2023).

- The Cardinals own the worst winning pct. (.000, 0-3) at Yankee Stadium, followed by the Pirates (.250, 1-4) and Cubs (.250, 2-6).
- St. Louis is 0-6 all-time in the regular season in the Bronx (0-3 at both Yankee Stadiums from 2003-17), its lowest regular season road win percentage in against an opponent franchise history.
- The Cardinals were 9-6 at Original Yankee Stadium in the Postseason.

**IT'S ALL IN YOUR MIND:** Despite not winning a regular season game in the Bronx, the Cardinals have won five of their last six games vs. the Yankees in the regular season, all at Busch Stadium III in St. Louis over the last two seasons. Both the Cardinals and Braves (also 5-1) top that leaderboard against the Bronx Bombers in winning percentage since the start of the 2022 season.

**GOLDY AND JOLTIN' JOE:** Cardinals first baseman **Paul Goldschmidt** is one home run from tying Hall of Famer and New York Yankees outfielder **Joe DiMaggio** for 86th place all-time in Major League history with 361 home runs. Goldschmidt hit No. 360 against the Padres and has been on a tear lately hitting safely in his last five games (8-14, .571). He also has hit three home runs and an all-time best eight RBI against tonight's starting pitcher **Marcus Stroman**.

**WINN-ING ATTITUDE:** Cardinals rookie shortstop **Masyn Winn** leads all of MLB with 23 hits since August 14 (.383, 23-60). Winn has recorded a career-best four straight games with multiple hits, longest streak by a Cardinals player this season and longest active in MLB. **Jonathan India** rapped out eight straight such games for Cincinnati to lead the list in MLB in 2024.

**WHEN NOLAN GETS ROLLIN':** **Nolan Arenado** has hit safely in 12 straight games vs. the Yankees dating back to Flag Day in 2016 while with the Colorado Rockies. Arenado's streak is the longest among active players vs. the Bombers' and with five straight as a Cardinal, is one behind Matt Carpenter (2014-17) for the longest by a Cardinals player in the regular season. Only **Jim Bottomley (8)**, **Tim McCarver (7)** and **Walker Cooper (7)** have longer streaks, all accomplished for the Cardinals in World Series contests against the Yankees.

**LONGBALL LORE:** Active Major Leaguers who have homered against every Major League team except the St. Louis Cardinals include **Aaron Judge** and **Gary Sanchez**. **Shohei Ohtani** recently achieved the feat on Aug. 17, 2024 at Busch Stadium.

- **Babe Ruth** has the most career home runs (714) of any player in MLB history to have never homered against the Cardinals in the regular season, however Ruth and **Carlos Beltrán** share the MLB Postseason record of most homers against St. Louis during Postseason play with seven. Judge has the most career homers (308) among all active players without ever going yard against the Cardinals.
- **Matt Carpenter** (Cardinals & Twins) and **Joey Gallo** (Cardinals & Reds) are two active Major Leaguers to have homered against 28 teams but not St. Louis.
- **Juan Soto**, and **Giancarlo Stanton** are three of 22 active Major Leaguers to have homered against all 30 MLB teams. - *Elias*

#### NEW YORK YANKEES CONNECTIONS

**Willie McGee** was drafted by the Yankees in the 1st round (15th overall) of the 1977 MLB January Draft-Secondary Phase...played five minor league seasons in New York's organization before traded to St. Louis for LHP **Bob Sykes** (Oct. 21, 1981).

**Turner Ward** was originally selected by the Yankees in the 18th round of the 1986 MLB Draft...played three minor league seasons in the Yankee organization before traded to Cleveland for **Mel Hall** (March 19, 1989).

**Sonny Gray** pitched parts of two seasons with New York (2017-18) after being traded by Oakland with international bonus money for **Dustin Fowler**, **James Kaprielian**, and **Jorge Mateo** (July 31, 2017)...later traded by the Yankees with **Reiver Sanmartin** to Cincinnati for **Shed Long Jr.** & 2019 competitive balance Rd A pick (Jan. 21, 2019).

**Matt Carpenter** aka "Matty Mustache" batted .305/.412/.727 with 15 HR and a 1.138 OPS in 47 games for the Yankees in 2022.

**Oliver Marmol** was born in nearby Elizabeth, NJ.

**Lance Lynn** made 18 starts for the Yankees in 2018 after being traded by Minnesota with cash for **Luis Rijo** and **Tyler Austin** (July 30, 2018).

**Aaron Boone** made his MLB debut at St. Louis on June 20, 1997 at Busch Stadium II (while with Cincinnati)...hit-game-winning RBI infield single off **Matt Morris** for first MLB hit that night...was ejected by HP umpire Gary Darling for throwing his helmet (was just the 4th player in Baseball history to be ejected in his MLB debut).

**Julio Rangel** pitched seven minor league seasons with the Yankees (1994-2000)...began coaching career with the High-A Tampa Yankees in 2001.

**Luke Weaver** was selected by the Cardinals in the 1st round (No. 27) of the 2014 MLB Draft...pitched parts of three seasons with St. Louis (2016-18) before packaged in a trade to Arizona for **Paul Goldschmidt** (Dec. 5, 2018)...2016 Cardinals Minor League Pitcher of the Year.

Hall of Fame Manager **Joe Torre** managed both the Cardinals (1990-95) and Yankees (1996-2007).

### TONIGHT'S GAME

- Makes his 27th start of the season and his 6th since joining the Cardinals.
- It's just this 3rd career meeting against the Yankees (1st since 2020) and his 2nd career start at Yankee Stadium (last pitched here on 6/12/18 during his rookie season).
- Has made five starts as a member of the Cardinals, going is 1-3 with a 4.23 ERA (27.2 IP) and 21 strikeouts. Is 1-1 with a 2.53 ERA at Busch Stadium with the Cardinals and 0-2 with a 5.29 ERA on the road with the Cardinals.
- Will match his career high with 27th start tonight and already has established career-highs with 149.1 IP and 129 strikeouts.
- Ranks in the Top-20 in MLB in both ERA (3.31) and opponent's BA (.229).
- Has 28 career wins with 20 coming as member of the Nationals, seven with the White Sox, and one with the Cardinals.
- Earned his first Cardinals win vs. TB (8/7), limiting the Rays to one run over 5.0 innings with four hits, while throwing 93 pitches. Two of his eight wins this season are vs. TB.
- Has held his opposition to one run or less in 11 starts this season. Lance Lynn has seven such starts this season for 2nd-most on the Cardinals staff this season.
- Acquired by the Cardinals 24 hours shy of the MLB Trade Deadline on July 29 in a three-way trade with the White Sox and Dodgers that brought OF Tommy Pham to the Cardinals as well and INF Tommy Edman being sent to the Dodgers.
- Establish a new single-season high in innings pitched (143.1) and is six strikeouts shy of his career-high in strikeouts (122) with the Nationals in 2021.
- Ranked 11th in the American League in ERA (3.11) at the time of the trade.
- Pitched 6.0 or more innings in 13 starts with 10 quality starts for White Sox. Threw a season and career-high 8.1 IP vs. Tampa Bay in a 4-2 win on April 28 on the South Side.
- Struck out a career-high 11 batters over 6.0 innings at Minnesota on April 23.
- Ran off four straight winning decisions to start the year, establishing a new career-best winning streak from April 17-May 14, including consecutive scoreless starts vs. CLE (5/9) and vs. WSH (5/14) covering a season-high 14.0 inning scoreless streak.
- Received one run of support or less in 10 of his 26 starts. Is 6-1 in starts which he receives three runs of support or more this season.
- Had a positive home/road split going 5-2 with a 1.87 ERA at Chicago's Guaranteed Rate Field, ranking 4th in Major League Baseball in home ERA.

- Took a ND in the Cardinals 3-2 come-from-behind win at Minnesota last Sun. (8/25) while allowing just one run on a lead-off HR to begin the game. Fanned 7 over 6.0 IP, his most strikeouts as a Cardinal, and allowed just two hits (one over final 22 batters faced).
