RHP VALENTE BELLOZO (2-2, 3.78 ERA) vs. RHP PAUL SKENES (9-2, 2.13 ERA)

THE PIRATES: beat the Nationals 7-3 yesterday to earn a split in the four-game series...Are 4-3 in their last seven games...Have won 15 games in their last at-bat (their most since having 16 last at-bat wins in 2021)...Have won eight games when trailing after seven innings (their most since winning nine times in 2019 when trailing after seven frames)...

Have played in 47 one-run games, which are tied for the most among National League teams along with the Brewers and Cubs... Have the best stolen base percentage (85.7 percent) in MLB...Are tied for fifth in MLB with 61 quality starts (Seattle leads with 85)... Are hitting .333 with the bases loaded; the fourth-highest average in MLB behind the Diamondbacks (.382), Royals (.377), and Reds (.348)... Have the third-highest batting average (.258) in MLB in pinch-hit situations behind Baltimore (.343) and Arizona (.278)... Are 24-22 in series openers this season, including 14-9 at home.

ONE K AWAY FROM HISTORY: Paul Skenes comes into today with 142 strikeouts...That's tied for the most in a single season by a Pirates rookie since 1900 along with Cy Blanton in 1935...Special thanks to the Elias Sports Bureau.

IN SELECT COMPANY: Paul Skenes will be making his 20th career start tonight and currently sits at 142 career strikeouts...Only four pitchers have reached 150 career strikeouts in 20 games or fewer: Kerry Wood (17), Hideo Nomo (17), Dwight Gooden (19) and Mark Prior (20).

FROM PITTSBURGH. FOR PITTSBURGH: Earlier today Major League Baseball announced David Bednar as Pittsburgh's nominee for the prestigious Roberto Clemente Award...The Roberto Clemente Award is the annual recognition of a Major League player who best represents the game of baseball through extraordinary character, community involvement, philanthropy and positive contributions, both on and off the field...Pittsburgh's last national winner of the Roberto Clemente Award was Andrew McCutchen in 2015.

SETTING UP THE SERIES: Since the start of the 2012 season, the Pirates have gone 44-30 against the Marlins...That's their second-best record vs. any NL opponent in that span (45-30 vs. Rockies)...The Pirates swept a four-game set in Miami on opening weekend this season, which was the first time the team have ever swept a four-games series in Miami.

AGAINST THE EAST: The Pirates have a 4-2-3 (.611) series record against NL East opponents this season, their best vs. any division...The only National League team with a better series record against the NL East this season is the Braves (7-4-2, .615).

FIRST THINGS FIRST: Billy Cook had a single and a double in his MLB debut Sunday...He is the first Pirates first baseman with multiple hits in his MLB debut since Alex Hernandez on September 1, 2000...He also became just the third different player to start at first base this season for the Pirates...That's tied for fourth-fewest in MLB...The only teams to use fewer starters at first base are the Braves (one), White Sox (two) and Cardinals (two).

PIRATING: Oneil Cruz has been successful in each of his last 19 attempts since being caught for the only time on April 22...The last Pirate to steal at least 19 consecutive bases without being caught in a single season is Nate McLouth (21 straight) from May 2 to September 28, 2008... Pittsburgh's 85.7 percent stolen-base success rate leads MLB....Since 1951, the only seasons in which Pittsburgh led MLB in that category are 1979 and 1997.

STREAKING YAS: Yasmani Grandal doubled in his first at-bat Saturday night to extend his hitting streak to a season-high nine games (it's the fourth time in his career he has hit safely in at least nine straight games)...It's Grandal's longest single-season hitting

in at least nine straight games)...It's Grandal's longest single-season hitting streak since hitting safely in a career-high 11 straight games while playing for the Dodgers in 2018...Grandal, whose next game will be the 1300th of his career, ranks second among active catchers with 172 home runs...The only active catcher with more home runs is Salvador Perez (214).

20-20 VISION: Andrew McCutchen hit his 19th home run of the season on Sunday...His next homer would mark his eighth career 20-home run season with the Pirates, which would break a tie with Ralph Kiner for the second-most 20-home run seasons in Pirates history behind only Willie Stargell (15).

2024 RECORD: 9-2, 2.13 ERA

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected by the Pirates in the 1st round (No. 1) of the 2023 Draft.

STARTING OFF: The 22-year-old righthander is in his first Major League season with the Pirates...He began the season with Triple-A Indianapolis where he posted an 0.99 ERA (27.1ip/3er) and recorded 45 strikeouts while allowing just eight walks in seven starts before being selected to the Major League roster on May 11...Was the No. 1 overall selection by the Pirates in the 2023 First-Year Player draft out of Louisiana State University.

LAST TIME OUT: Skenes allowed four hits in 5.0 innings and earned his ninth win of the season in the team's 5-0 shutout on Tuesday night at Wrigley Field.

VS. MIAMI: Skenes will be making his first career appearance tonight against the Marlins.

BODY OF WORK: Is making his 20th career start and appearance tonight...He has allowed three earned runs or fewer in 18 of his 19 career outings, including two or fewer 16 times and one or fewer 10 times (five scoreless outings).

 Of his 19 career starts, 13 have been quality starts...The only Pirate with more quality starts this year is Mitch Keller (14).

AS A PIRATES ROOKIE: Skenes comes into tonight with 142 strikeouts, which ranks second among all National League rookies behind Chicago's Shota Imanaga (155)...Since 1900, Skenes' 142 punchouts are tied for the most by a Pirates rookie along with Cy Blanton in 1935.

SELECT COMPANY: Skenes has a 2.13 ERA after his first 19 starts...In the last 100 years, that's the third-lowest ERA after 19 starts in a season by a Pirate...The only two Pirates to have a lower ERA after 19 starts are Bob Veale (2.05 in 1968) and Steve Blass (2.12 in 1968).

DON'T STRAY TOO FAR: Skenes has picked off three baserunners this season, which are tied for the third-most among National League pitchers...Atlanta's Charlie Morton has picked off a league-leading six runners, while teammate Paul Skenes and Washington's Patrick Corbin are tied for the second-most with five apiece.

SHUT OUTS: The Pirates shut out the Cubs 5-0 in Skenes' last start on September 3 at Wrigley Field...It was the third time this season Skenes did not allow a run in a game in which the Pirates went on to toss a shutout along with July 11 at Milwaukee and August 22 vs. Cincinnati... Pittsburgh's pitching staff has recorded 11 shutouts this year, which are the sixth-most among all National League teams.

LEAGUE LEADERS: Since making his Major League debut on May 11, Skenes ranks among the NL leaders in ERA (first, 2.13), WHIP (first, 0.98), strikeout-to-walk ratio (third, 4.74), strikeouts (tied for third, 142), strikeouts per 9.0 IP (second, 11.21) and batting average against (third, 201).

100 K CLUB: Skenes reached 100 career strikeouts in his 13th career game in his outing on July 29 at Houston...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became just the sixth player all-time since the current mound distance was established in 1893 to reach 100 strikeouts in 13 or fewer games and the first since Masahiro Tanaka did so in 2014...The others to do so were Kerry Wood in 1998 (12 games), Hideo Nomo in 1995 (12 games), Jose DeLeon in 1983 (13 games) and Herb Score in 1955 (12 games).

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: Skenes made the start for the National League at the 2024 All-Star Game in Arlington on July 16, tossing a scoreless first inning with three groundouts and a walk...He was the first Pirate to earn the starting honors in the All-Star Game since Jerry Reuss in 1975...Dock Ellis (1971), Bob Friend (1960 All-Star Game on July 11), Vernon Law (1960 All-Star Game on July 13) and Bob Friend (1956) are the only other Pirate pitchers to start in the Midsummer Classic.

 He was the fifth rookie to ever start the All-Star game, joining LAD Hideo Nomo in 1995, LAD Fernando Valenzuela in 1981, DET Mark Fidrych in 1976 and WSH Dave Stenhouse in 1962.

JUST KEEP WINNING: Skenes took his first loss as a professional (Major or Minor Leagues) on July 23 vs. St. Louis despite pitching a career-high 8.1 innings, allowing just two runs on four hits with eight strikeouts and no walks in what was his 12th career start...He was the first pitcher in Pirates history to not take a loss in each of his first 11 Major League games, all of which were starts...The previous best had been 10 by Zach Duke in 2005 (source: Elias Sports Bureau).

NO HITS (AGAIN): On July 11 at Milwaukee, Skenes threw 7.0 no-hit innings, walking one and matching his career high with 11 strikeouts...He was the seventh Pirates pitcher to ever leave a game with 7.0+ no-hit innings and the first since Francisco Cordova (9.0) did so in a combined, extra-inning no-hit bid on July 12, 1997.

RACKING UP PUNCHIES: Skenes recorded seven or more strikeouts in nine consecutive games dating back to the second game of the doubleheader in Detroit on May 29 through his start on July 23 vs. St. Louis, surpassing the previous franchise record of seven set by Mitch Keller from April 27-May 31, 2023.

- The nine-game streak matched the Major League record by a rookie, done by Dwight Gooden from August 11-September 23, 1984 and Brandon Beachy from August 9-September 24, 2011 [source: Elias Sports Bureau].
- In total, Skenes has recorded seven or more strikeouts in 13 of his 17 career outings.

MILITARY MAN: Spent the first two years of his collegiate career at the Air Force Academy, where he earned the 2022 John Olerud Award as the nation's best two-way player while both pitching and catching...He majored in Military Strategic Studies while at Air Force and was a member of Cadet Squadron 9.

Has pledged to donate \$100 for every strikeout he records this season to the Gary Sinise Foundation to support our nation's defenders, veterans, first responders, their families, and those in need...ESPN's Pat McAfee has also pledged to match Paul's donation at the end of the season.
