WASHINGTON NATIONALS (64-78) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (66-76)

SEPTEMBER 8, 2024 AT PNC PARK, PITTSBURGH, PA - 1:35 EDT - GAME #143/HOME #72

LHP PATRICK CORBIN (5-12, 5.41 ERA) vs. RHP JARED JONES (5-7, 3.91 ERA)

THE PIRATES: were swept in Saturday's doubleheader against the Nationals...Opened their season-long 10-game homestand with a 9-4 win Thursday night...Are 3-3 in their last six games...Have won 15 games in their last at-bat (their most since having 16 last at-bat wins in 2021)...Have won eight games when trailing after seven innings (their most since winning nine times in 2019 when trailing after seven frames)...Have played in 47 one-run games, which are tied for the most among National League teams along with the Brewers...Have the best stolen base percentage (86.5 percent) in MLB...Are tied for seventh in MLB with 60 quality starts (Seattle leads with 85)...Are hitting .333 with the bases loaded; the fourth-highest average in MLB behind the Royals (.378), Diamondbacks (.370) and Reds (.348)...Have the third-highest batting average (.258) in MLB in pinch-hit situations behind Baltimore (.346) and Arizona (.272)...Have scored the fifth-most runs (82) in MLB since August 22 behind the Cubs (114), Diamondbacks (92), Phillies (89) and Brewers (87).

A PROMOTION IS IN ORDER: The Pirates promoted outfielder/infielder Billy Cook from Triple-A Indianapolis prior to today's series finale against the Nationals...The 25-year-old Cook went 6-for-22 with three home runs and 11 RBI in his first six games of this month with Indianapolis, including a grand slam last night at Toledo...At the time of his promotion to the big leagues today, Cook's 11 RBI this month were tied for the second-most in the International League (he was also pacing the International League with nine walks this month).

SHOW TIME: The Pirates have had four players (Grant Koch, Jared Jones, Paul Skenes and Brady Feigl) make their MLB debuts this season...Fourteen players made their Major League debuts last season for the Pirates.

ON DECK: The Pirates will continue their season-long 10-game homestand with the beginning of a three-game series against the Marlins tomorrow...It's the first meeting between the teams since the Pirates swept the 2024 season-opening series at Miami from March 28-31...The four-game sweep marked the 14th time since 1900 that the Bucs began the season 4-0.

KEEPING UP WITH THE JONES: Jared Jones comes into today with 106 strikeouts, which ranks eighth among National League rookies (teammate Paul Skenes ranks second among National League rookies with 142 strikeouts)...Jones and Skenes are the second rookie duo in Pirates history with at least 100 strikeouts...The other was in 1993 when Steve Cooke had 132 strikeouts while Paul Wagner had 114 punchouts.

FOUR YOUR INFORMATION: The Pirates are 3-0-3 in their first six four-game series heading into the deciding game of this series against the Nationals...The Pirates swept the Marlins in four games in Miami to begin the 2024 campaign...The team's other four-game series wins came at Wrigley Field from May 16-19 and against the Reds here at PNC Park from August 22-25...Pittsburgh earned series splits at Philadelphia from April 11-14, vs. Milwaukee from April 22-25 and vs. the New York Mets from July 5-8.

PIRATING: Oneil Cruz has been successful in each of his last 19 attempts since being caught for the only time on April 22...The last Pirate to steal at least 19 consecutive bases without being caught in a single season is Nate McLouth (21 straight) from May 2 to September 28, 2008...Pittsburgh's 86.5 percent stolen-base success rate leads MLB...Since 1951, the only seasons in which Pittsburgh led MLB in that category are 1979 and 1997.

DENNIS DEALING: Since August 11, Dennis Santana has issued two hits in 44 at-bats...Since June 18, Santana has recorded a 1.35 ERA (33.1ip/5er)...That's the sixth-lowest ERA among relievers in MLB with at least 32.0 innings of work behind Raisel Iglesias (0.00), A.J. Puk (0.28), Emmanuel Clase (0.56), Tanner Scott (1.07) and Ryan Walker (1.26).

FIRING CUBAN MISSILES: Aroldis Chapman comes into today seventh in all of MLB among relief pitchers with 87 strikeouts...Chapman's 87 punchouts are the fifth-most in a single season by a Pirates left-handed reliever...The only four Pirates southpaw relievers with more strikeouts in a single season are Rod Scurry (94 in 1982), Felipe Vazquez (90 in 2019), Felipe Vazquez (89 in 2018) and Felipe Rivero (88 in 2017).

STREAKING YAS: Yasmani Grandal doubled in his first at-bat Saturday night to extend his hitting streak to a season-high nine games (it's the fourth time in his career he has safely in at least nine straight games)...It's Grandal's longest single-season hitting streak since hitting safely in a career-high 11 straight games while playing for the Dodgers in 2018.

TODAY'S STARTER **RHP JARED JONES** **#37**

2024 RECORD: 5-7, 3.91 ERA

BORN: August 6, 2001
AGE: 23 **SIGNED:** Thru 2024
HOW ACQUIRED: Selected by the Pirates in the 2nd round of the 2020 Draft.

STARTING OFF: The 23-year-old righthander is in his first Major League season with the Pirates...Was named to the Opening Day roster after being a non-roster invitee to big league camp...The Whittier, California, native was Pittsburgh's second-round draft selection in 2020 out of La Mirada (CA) High School.

LAST TIME OUT: Jones allowed three runs in 6.1 innings but had a no-decision Monday night at Wrigley Field...The Bucs erased a 3-0 deficit with a four-run eighth inning while adding an insurance run in the ninth for a 5-3 comeback win.

VS. WASHINGTON: Has never faced the Nationals.

ON THE HOME FRONT: Jones has posted a 2.79 ERA (58.0ip/18er) in 10 starts this year at PNC Park...He allowed five runs in 4.0 innings in his last home start on August 27 against the Cubs...Prior to that he had a 2.17 ERA (54.0ip/13er) in nine starts at PNC Park.

AS A PROSPECT: Jones entered the 2024 season rated as the team's No. 3 prospect and the No. 74 prospect in all of baseball according to Baseball America.

FEELING BETTER NOW: Jones was placed on the 15-day injured list on July 4 with a right lat strain...He made a total of three rehab starts with Triple-A Indianapolis, where he went 0-1 with a 4.91 ERA (11.0ip/6er)...In his last rehab start on August 20 at Columbus, he threw a total of 73 pitches (53 strikes) while striking out 10 of the 16 batters that he faced.

THE CENTURY MARK: Jones has amassed 106 strikeouts so far this season...Since the mound was moved to its current distance in 1893, the only other three Pirates to reach 100 career strikeouts in fewer than 20 games are Gerrit Cole in 2013 (19), Jose DeLeon in 1983 (13) and Paul Skenes (13).

BODY OF WORK: Is making his 19th career start and appearance today...He has allowed three earned runs or fewer in 15 of his 18 starts, as well as two or fewer nine times and one or fewer five times.

WHAT A DEBUT: Jones became the first Pirate since Tim Wakefield in 1992 and the third pitcher in team history to record at least 10 strikeouts in his big league debut on March 30 at Miami...In addition, he became one of just five starting pitchers since 1900 to strike out at least 10 batters in less than 6.0 innings in a big league debut...Prior to Jones, Milwaukee's Freddy Peralta was the last pitcher to record 10-plus strikeouts in a big league debut when he did so on May 13, 2018 (13 punchouts)... Dick Hall struck out 11 batters in his first MLB start, but he made his MLB debut as a third baseman for the Pirates on April 15, 1952.

GET YOU A MAN THAT CAN DO BOTH: Was committed to being a two-way player at the University of Texas prior to signing with the Pirates... As a senior in high school, he hit .394 with 32 extra base hits and 59 RBI... Batted .457 (43-for-94) with three home runs and 16 RBI as a junior.

NO WALK SIGN IS ON: Jones opened his career with a streak of 21.1 consecutive innings without issuing a walk before issuing his free pass to Blake Perkins in the fifth inning on April 22 vs. Milwaukee...It was the fifth-longest streak by a Major League pitcher within their first five career games since 1971 and the longest since Cleveland's Cody Anderson had a streak of 25.2 consecutive walkless innings in 2015.

- Through five career starts, he had 39 strikeouts against just four walks, making him the only pitcher since 1893 when the mound to plate distance was set at 60'6", to record 35-plus strikeouts and four or fewer walks in a pitcher's first 5 career MLB games.

ON DECK: The 22-year-old Skenes will be making his 20th start tomorrow...Struck out six batters in 5.0 innings while earning his ninth win in the team's 5-0 shutout Tuesday at Wrigley Field...Has posted the lowest ERA (2.13) in all of MLB since making his debut on 5/11...His 142 strikeouts are tied for the most in a single season by a Pirates rookie along with Cy Blanton in 1935...Has won each of his last three decisions since being charged with his second career loss on August 10 at Dodger Stadium.
