AT HOME: The Brewers are 40-25 at home, going 13-6-2 in series play.....are 7-1 in their last 8 home games.....the team has had two season-high 6-game home winning streaks, coming from 5/29-6/10 and 6/15-6/28.

ON THE ROAD: The Brewers are 37-31 on the road, going 11-9-2 in series play.....the team is 12-6 in its last 18 road games.....the team has had two season-high 4-game road winning streaks, coming from 4/9-4/13 and 8/6-8/20.

MANAGER: Pat Murphy was named the 20th manager in franchise history on 11/15/23, replacing Craig Counsell.....he is signed to a 3-year contract through 2026.....Murphy spent the previous eight seasons (2016-23) as bench coach.....his only Major League managerial experience previously came in 2015 as interim manager of the Padres, replacing **Bud Black** in June (42-54).....he enjoyed a 25-year college head coaching career primarily at the University of Notre Dame (1988-94) and Arizona State University (1995-2009).....Murphy went 1,000-457-4 as a college coach and was on pace to be the winningest coach in NCAA history before he transitioned into the professional ranks.

COACHES: First base coach Quintin Berry (4th season), field coordinator Néstor Corredor (2nd season/1st in current role), hitting coach Connor Dawson (3rd season), assistant pitching coach Jim Henderson (3rd season/1st in current role), pitching coach Chris Hook (6th season), third base coach Jason Lane (9th season/4th in current role), run prevention coordinator Walker McKinven (5th season/1st in current role) and hitting coach **Ozzie Timmons** (3rd season) all returned from the 2023 staff.. Rickie Weeks (associate manager), Daniel de Mondesert (assistant coach), Matt Erickson (infield coach) and Charlie Greene (bullpen coach) are in their first seasons on the coaching staff, all Major League coaches for the first time.

LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE: The Brewers have made 36 replay challenges this season, going 22-14....their last challenge (won) came on 8/23 at Oakland as an out call at first base involving Joey Ortiz was overturned.

GAME 1 STARTER: #48 - RHP COLIN REA (25g, 22gs, 12-4, 3.61)

REA AT A GLANCE: Colin Rea, 34, will be making his 26th appearance and 23rd start of the season.....Rea last pitched last Saturday at Oakland in a start and earned a 9-5 win (6.2ip, 8h, 4r, 4er, 0bb, 5k, 2hr, 102 pitches)....he is 10-4 with a 3.77 ERA as a starter (126.2ip, 53er) and 2-0 with a 2.35 ERA in relief (15.1ip, 4er).....the team is 16-6 in his starts.....he has a career-high 8 quality starts.....opponents are batting .235 (128-for-544, 22hr).....he has 10+ wins for the first time in his career....he has also produced career highs in innings pitched (142.0) and strikeouts (113).....Rea is signed through the 2024 season with a club option for 2025.....name is pronounced "RAY."

CAREER: Is 26-18 with a 4.36 ERA in 87 games/71 starts (421ip, 204er).....has pitched in the majors for San Diego (2015-16), Miami (2016), Chicago-NL (2020) and Milwaukee (2021, '23-24).....is 22-17 with a 4.49 ERA as a starter (379ip, 189er) and 4-1 with a 3.21 ERA in relief (42ip, 15er).....Rea was selected by San Diego in the 12th round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft out of Indiana State University....he underwent "Tommy John" surgery on 11/11/16, causing him to miss the entire 2017 season.....Rea also pitched in Japan with the Fukuoka SoftBank Hawks in 2021 and 2022.

CAREER AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Is 9-7 with a 4.30 ERA in 28 games/24 starts (142.1ip, 68er).....is 7-3 with a 3.87 ERA in 13 games/12 starts this season (76.2ip, 33er).

CAREER ON THE ROAD: Is 12-7 with a 4.28 ERA in 39 games/29 starts [185ip, 88er].....is 5-1 with a 3.31 ERA in 12 games/10 starts this season [65.1ip, 24er].

GAME 2 STARTER: #37 - LHP DL HALL (5gs, 0-1, 6.43)

HALL AT A GLANCE: DL Hall, 25, will be making his sixth start of the season and second against the Reds.....Hall last started for Milwaukee on 8/11 vs. Cincinnati and received no decision in the Brewers' 4-3 loss (4.2ip, 4h, 3r, 1er, 3bb, 9k, 1hr, 1hbp, 1wp, 92 pitches).....his 9 strikeouts marked a career high.....the team is 3-2 in his starts.....he does not have a quality start.....opponents are batting .348 (31-for-89, 5hr).....he is in his third stint with the team this season (Opening Day-4/20, 8/11 and 8/30-current).....Hall was acquired from Baltimore, along with INF Joey Ortiz and a 2024 Competitive Balance Round A selection, in exchange for RHP Corbin Burnes on Feb. 1.....he entered the season as the fifth-best prospect in the organization according to Baseball America.....the initials "DL" stand for Dayton Lane.

INJURY REPORT: Hall began the season in the starting rotation before landing on the 15-day injured list on April 21 with a left knee sprain.....he was sent to Class-A Wisconsin on rehab assignment on May 19 and to Triple-A Nashville on May 23....he was transferred to the 60-day IL on June 8 after aggravating the injury with Nashville....he began another rehab assignment with Nashville on June 13 that ended after he was struck in the left forearm on a batted ball on July 9....he began a third rehab assignment with Nashville on July 21.

LAST SEASON: Hall appeared in 18 games with Baltimore, all in relief, and went 3-0 with a 3.26 ERA during two stints (4/29 and 8/26-end of season).....he made his postseason debut in the 2023 American League Division Series against Texas and struck out 6 of the 12 batters he faced over 3.1 scoreless innings during 2 relief appearances.

CAREER: Is 4-2 with a 5.17 ERA and 1 save in 34 games/6 starts [54ip, 31er].....is in his third Major League season with Baltimore (2022-23) and Milwaukee (2024).....has gone 0-2 with a 7.30 ERA as a starter (24.2ip, 20er) and 4-0 with a 3.38 ERA in relief (29.1ip, 11er).....Hall was selected by Baltimore in the first round (21st overall) of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft out of Valdosta (GA) High School.

CAREER AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Is 0-1 with a 3.60 ERA in 2 starts, both coming this season (10ip, 4er).

CAREER ON THE ROAD: Is 1-1 with a 5.93 ERA in 17 games/4 starts (30.1ip, 20er).....is 0-0 with a 9.00 ERA in 3 starts this season (11ip, 11er).
