**RECENT REDBIRDS:** The St. Louis Cardinals and Seattle Mariners conclude their three-game Interleague series this afternoon at Busch Stadium ... The Redbirds continue their six-game homestand on Tuesday with three games against the division-rival Cincinnati Reds ... Since August 12, the Cardinals are 1-7 in series openers but sport a 11-5 record during all other games (6-3 in middle games and 5-2 in finales).

**FLIGHT PATTERN:** With 20 games remaining, St. Louis enters today in tied with Chicago for 2nd place in the National League Central, 10.0 games back of Milwaukee, and 6.0 games out of the 3rd Wild Card spot ... St. Louis owns tiebreakers over the Padres, Braves, and Cubs.

**THE BOYS OF RUBBER:** The Cardinals are playing in their 20th series rubber game of the 2024 season ... St. Louis has won their last four series-clinching rubber games and are 12-7 overall this season.

**FIESTA CARDENALES:** The Cardinals are 6-1 when celebrating Fiesta Cardenales at Busch Stadium since the inaugural event in 2016 ... Their lone defeat was in 2019.

**COME AS YOU ARE:** The Cardinals have won eight of 11 over the Mariners in the city of St. Louis (3-0 at Busch II & 5-3 at Busch III), for their best home win pct. (.727) against any visitor since joining the National League in 1892.

**HOMEWORK ASSIGNMENT:** The Cardinals are in a stretch where they are home for 13 of 16 games from Sept. 6-22 ... Their lone road games over the two-week period is a three-game International Interleague series at Toronto (Sept. 13-15).

**GOTTA BEAT THE BEST TO BE THE BEST:** The Cardinals are 12-9 over their current 22-game stretch against playoff contending teams: vs. Los Angeles Dodgers (1-2), vs. Milwaukee (2-1), at Minnesota (2-1), vs. San Diego (2-2), at New York Yankees (2-1), at Milwaukee (2-1) and vs. Seattle (1-1).

**VOTE FOR PEDRO!:** Rookie catcher **Pedro Pagés** last night launched his 3rd go-ahead homer of the season and 2nd in the 8th inning or later, becoming the only Cardinal this season with multiple go-ahead blasts in the 8th inning or later (also June 14, 8th inning at Chicago Cubs) ... Pagés's six game-winning RBI this season are the most by a rookie catcher in Cardinals single-season history ... The last Cardinals rookie with 7 or more game-winning RBI was **Tommy Edman** in (7 in 2019).

**CARDINALS BIRTHDAY WEEK:** Happy 27th birthday to Cardinals outfielder **Lars Nootbaar** ... Additional Cardinals celebrating birthdays over the next week include **JoJo Romero** (turns 28 tomorrow), **Paul Goldschmidt** (37 on Tuesday, Sept. 10), **Keynan Middleton** (31 on Thursday, Sept. 12), and **John King** (30 on Saturday, Sept. 14).

**FANTASTIC FINISHES:** Since winning their 11th World Series in 2011, the Cardinals have the 2nd-most wins (212) in Major League Baseball during the month of September, trailing only the Los Angeles Dodgers (214) over those 14 seasons ... The Cardinals 10 wins since August 21 are tied for 3rd in MLB trailing the Mets (12) and Phillies (12).

**HELLS BELLS:** All-Star closer **Ryan Helsley** converted his league-leading 43rd save last night, tying Hall of Famer **Lee Smith** (43 in 1992 and 1993) for 6th-most in Cardinals single-season history ... Helsley has combined to win or save 50 games this season, T-3rd-highest total in Cardinals history (**Lee Smith** leads with 53 - 47 saves and 6 wins in 1991).

**BAKER STREET:** Rookie **Luken Baker** hit a game-winning RBI single in the 10th inning on Wednesday in Milwaukee, extending his RBI streak to six games (Aug. 27-present), longest active in MLB ... According to *Elias*, Baker joins **Albert Pujols** (May 10-16, 2001 - 6 games) as the only two Cardinals in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to run off RBI streaks of 6+ games in their first 44 Major League games ... **Brendan Donovan** (7 games from June 17-24) is the only Cardinal this season with a longer RBI streak.

**THIS DATE IN CARDINALS HISTORY (Sept. 8, 1998):** **Mark McGwire** passes **Roger Maris** with his 62nd home run of the season with a blast in the 4th inning off **Steve Trachsel** during a nationally televised 6-3 win over the Cubs at Busch Stadium ... At 341 feet, the line drive homer to left field was McGwire's shortest of the season and recovered under the stands by Cardinals Grounds Crew member, **Tim Forneris**, who gave the ball back to Big Mac ... The game was delayed 11 minutes by the ensuing celebration and a brief speech where McGwire thanked his family, his son, the Cubs, **Sammy Sosa**, and the fans of St. Louis ... After the game, Commissioner **Bud Selig** conducted an on-field ceremony where McGwire was presented with the first Commissioner's Historic Achievement Award ... The Cardinals also presented Mark with a red 1962 Corvette for his achievement.

**Lance Lynn** was originally selected by Seattle in the 6th round of the 2005 MLB Draft, but did not sign to attend the University of Mississippi

**Randy Arozarena** played in 19 games for St. Louis in 2019 and parts of three minor league seasons in the Cardinals organization (2017-19)...originally signed with the Cardinals as an international free agent (Aug. 1, 2016)...traded to Tampa Bay with **José Martínez**, and Cardinals Compensation draft pick A (INF **Alíka Williams**) in exchange for **Matthew Liberatore**, **Edgardo Rodríguez** and Rays Compensation draft pick B (RHP **Tink Hance**). Jan. 9, 2020.

Cardinals broadcaster **Chip Caray** worked for the Seattle Mariners for three seasons (1993-95).

Mariners Pitching Strategy Coach **Trent Black** was born in St. Louis...graduated from nearby Columbia (Ill.) High School.

**Andrew Kittredge** was born in and resides in Spokane, WA...graduated from Joel E. Ferris High School in Spokane...originally selected by his home state Mariners in the 45th round of the 2008 MLB Draft, but did not sign to attend the University of Washington...pitched three seasons for the Huskies (2009-11) before signing as a minor league free agent with Seattle in 2011... pitched six seasons in the Mariners minor league organization (2011-16) before traded with **Dalton Kelly** and **Dylan Thompson** to Tampa Bay for **Taylor Motter** and **Richie Shaffer** (Nov. 18, 2016).

**John King** made his MLB debut at T-Mobile Park with Texas (Sept. 4, 2020)...fanned Kyle Lewis (swinging) that night for his first MLB strikeout.

Mariners broadcaster **Rick Rizzs** is a 1975 graduate of Southern Illinois Univ. in Carbondale...previously served as a broadcaster for the Memphis Chicks (AA-Expos) from 1978-80.

**Riley O'Brien** was born in Seattle and resides in Shoreline, WA... graduated from Shorewood (WA) High School...pitched two seasons at Everett (WA) Community College (2014-15)...traded by Cincinnati to the Mariners for **Luis Chevalier** (April 17, 2022) and pitched in one game for Seattle (May 7, 2022 vs. TB)...2023 PCL Post-Season All-Star for AAA-Tacoma...acquired by the Cardinals from the Mariners for cash considerations (Nov. 5, 2023).

**Luis Uriás's** brother, **Ramón Uriás**, played two seasons (2018-19) in the Cardinals minor leagues.

Mariners broadcaster **Aaron Goldsmith** was born in St. Louis...graduated from Principia College in Elsah, Ill...began broadcast career in 2007 with the nearby Gateway Grizzlies in the independent Frontier League.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Vince Coleman** played in Seattle in 1995, including all 11 postseason games.

- The Cardinals' Opening Day starter for 2024 makes his team-leading 29th start of the season and his 179th career (207th career appearance).
- Leads MLB in first-pitch strike percentage (71.4%) this season, while his 67.1% career first-pitch strike percentage is tied with **Phil Hughes** (1291.0 IP) for highest in MLB history among pitchers with 1,000 innings pitched.
- Sports the lowest Walk Pct. (4.7%) among active MLB pitchers (min. 500 innings).
- Has extensive home and road splits: 1-5 with a 5.97 ERA in 13 home starts and 7-5 with a 4.65 ERA in 15 road starts.
- Seven (T-2nd in NL) of his eight wins this season have come on the road. Since joining St. Louis in 2018, he has winning road record (34-29), but is just 24-27 at Busch Stadium. Ran off a streak of eight straight quality starts on the road before it was snapped in his Aug. 4 start at Chicago Cubs, longest stretch of the season in MLB.
- Has thrown over 100 pitches in two of his 28 starts (101 at DET on 5/1 & 100 vs. LAD on 8/16) after ranking 7th in MLB with 12 such games in 2022. Ranks 2nd on the Cardinals with 2,406 pitches behind **Kyle Gibson** (2,404) and 21st in the National League.
- In his 167 starts w/ the Cardinals, St. Louis is 69-32 when Miles works 6.0+ IP (10-5 this season), while the Cardinals are 24-43 when he goes 5.2 innings or fewer.
- Mikolas is an amazing 49-7 (.875 win pct) as a Cardinal when receiving 3 or more runs in support (Cardinals are 65-16 in those 81 games, including 9-4 this season). He's just 11-52 (.175) when receiving 2 runs or fewer (Cardinals 28-59).
- St. Louis is 83-76 (.550) in his 169 career outings (168 starts) since joining the organization (2018-present).

- Is 7-6 with a 3.83 ERA in 23 Interleague starts since joining the Cardinals in 2018.

**LAST TIME OUT**

- Received a no-decision in last Sunday's 14-7 Cardinals win at Yankee Stadium. Allowed five runs (three earned) on seven hits in 4.0-plus innings. Exited with the Cardinals leading 7-4 after failing to retire the first five batters to open the bottom of the 5th.
- Committed his first error since August 2, 2018, snapping the longest errorless streak by a Major League pitcher.
