Request for funding from The Nature Conservancy "Kiyi Restoration Analysis" Project

- **WHEREAS** the Waganakising Odawak, known in English as Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians is a nation of citizens with inherent sovereignty and right to self-governance;
- WHEREAS the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians ("LTBB") is a federally recognized Indian Tribe under Public Law 103-324, and is a party to numerous Treaties with the United States the most recent of which being the Treaty of Washington of March 28, 1836 (7 Stat. 491) and the Treaty of Detroit of 1855 (11 Stat. 621);
- **WHEREAS** the Tribe's treaty delineated reservation area encompasses approximately 337 square miles in the Northwestern Lower Michigan;
- **WHEREAS** the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians Tribal Council is the elected Legislative body of the Tribe;
- WHEREAS the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians Executive power is vested in the Tribal Chairperson and Vice Chairperson, who oversee all Tribal Executive Departments;
- WHEREAS the LTBB Natural Resources Department (NRD) leads in the enforcement, conservation, and management of tribal natural resources by successfully and responsibly preserving the LTBB's sovereign right to hunt and fish, both on the inland lands and waters as well as commercial and subsistence fishing on the 1836 Great Lakes. The LTBB NRD will wisely utilize our natural resources in order to promote, honor and respect our traditional, spiritual and physical relationship with the land and waters. The LTBB NRD will implement management strategies that protect our resources on, above, below and within the land and waters for the future benefit of our Tribe.
- WHEREAS the LTBB NRD is committed to and experienced in protecting the bald eagle population and is in need of an eagle aviary to provide permanent housing for eagles that are no longer capable of surviving in the wild; rehabilitate injured eagles and release them back into the wild; and educate the public on protection of the bald eagle population;
- **WHEREAS** The Nature Conservancy desires to provide funding to Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians for a Kiyi Restoration Analysis project;
