- WHEREAS the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians ("LTBB") is a federally recognized Indian Tribe under Public Law 103-324, and is a party to numerous Treaties with the United States the most recent of which being the Treaty of Washington of March 28, 1836 (7 Stat. 491) and the Treaty of Detroit of 1855 (11 Stat. 621);
- **WHEREAS** the Tribe's treaty delineated reservation area encompasses approximately 337 square miles in the Northwestern Lower Michigan;
- WHEREAS the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians Tribal Council is the elected Legislative body of the Tribe;
- WHEREAS the Little Traverse Bay Bands of Odawa Indians Executive power is vested in the Tribal Chairperson and Vice Chairperson, who oversee all Tribal Executive Departments;
- WHEREAS the LTBB Niigaandiwin Education Department provides a variety of services to LTBB Citizens, descendants, and the greater community by passionately supporting the growth of our Nation by weaving Ancestral & Contemporary knowledge through community collaboration to ensure life success for the Odawa Nation and the next 7 Generations.;
- WHEREAS the US Department of Health and Human Services, Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration, has announced the availability of FY 2024 funding for 60-months of Strategic Prevention Framework Partnerships for Success projects funding to strengthen state and community-level prevention capacity to identify and address local substance use prevention concerns, such as underage drinking, marijuana, tobacco, electronic cigarettes, opioids, methamphetamine, and heroin.
