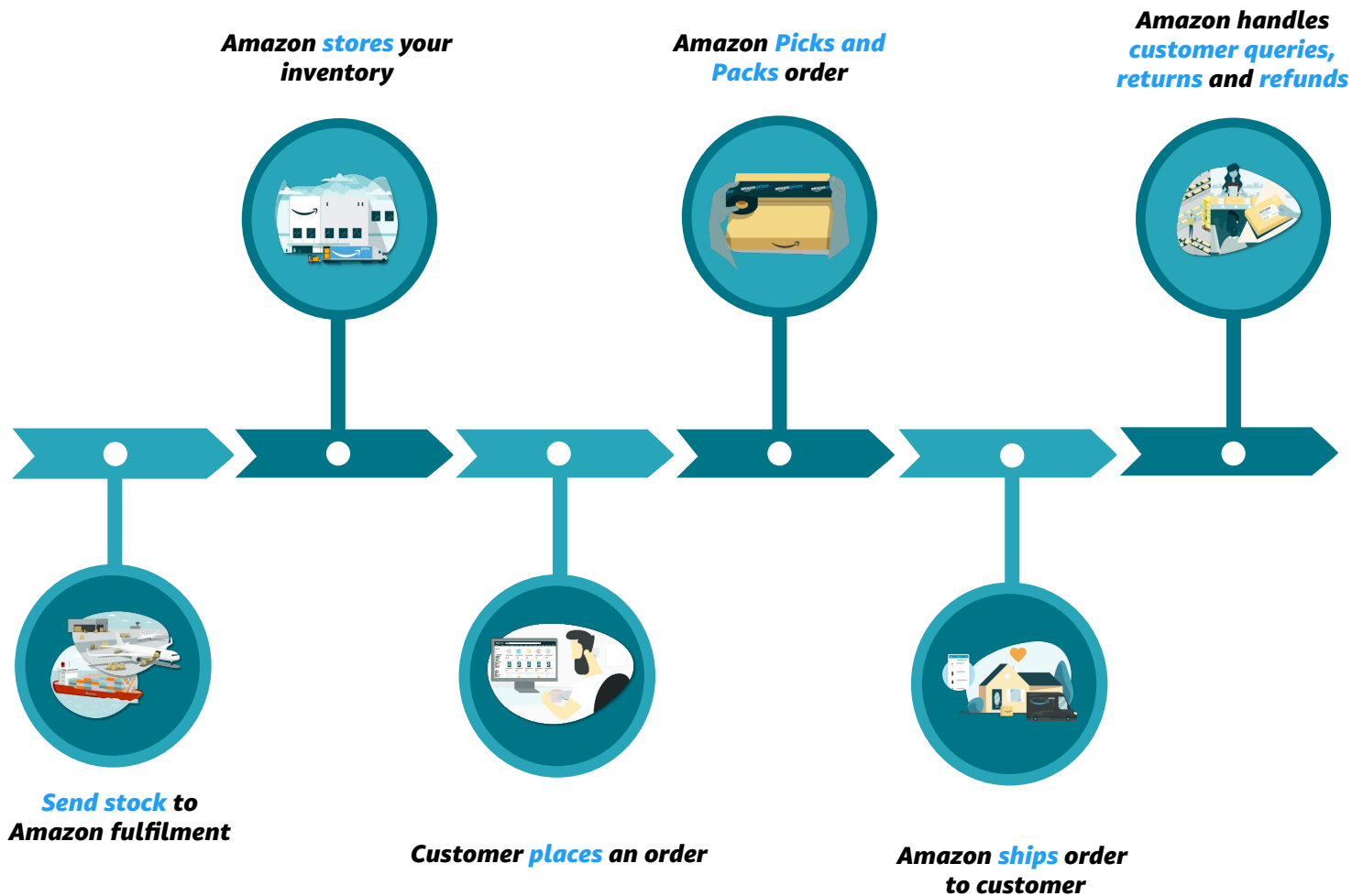

How FBA works



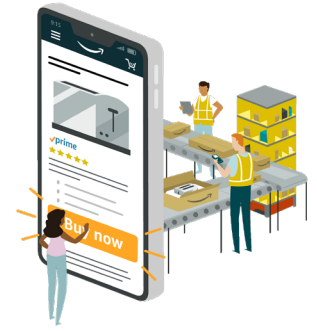
How FBA fees work

Fulfilment fees: These fees cover picking and packing, shipping and handling, customer service and product returns for your FBA products. They're charged per unit according to the unit's dimensions and weight, within product size tiers. In addition you will be charged a [referral fee](#), based on the product sold.

Inventory Storage fees: These are charged for all items stored in an Amazon fulfilment centre, based on your daily average volume of inventory measured in cubic metres. They vary depending on time of year.

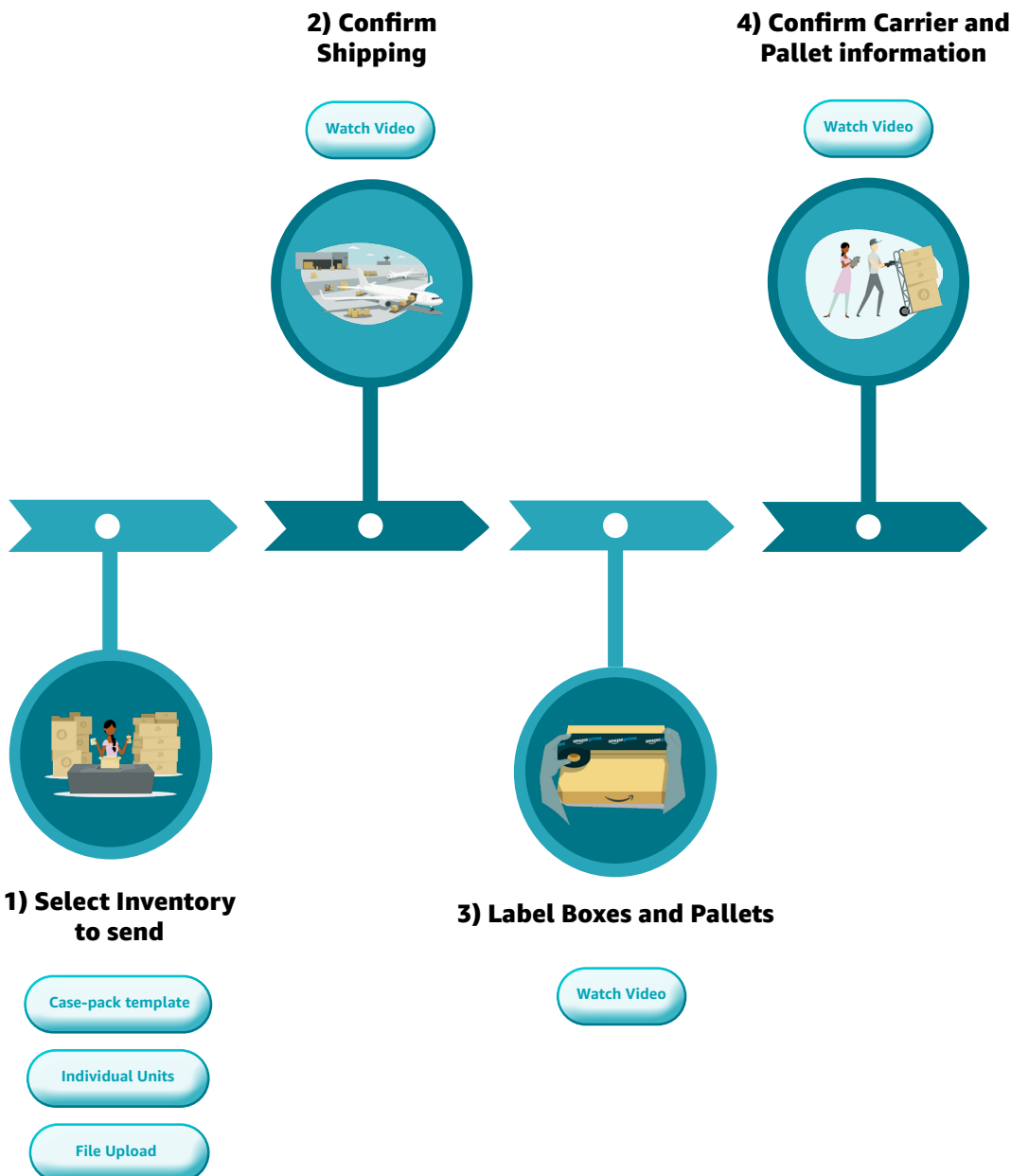

How Send to Amazon works

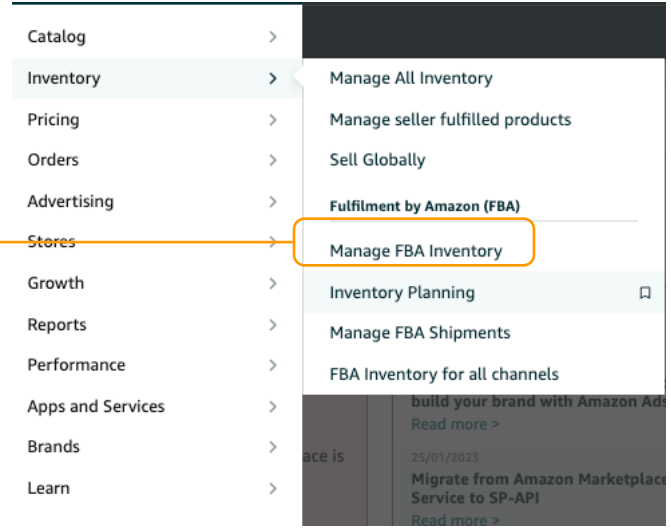
Create 2 separate workflows
1 for PCP SPD and 1 for LTL



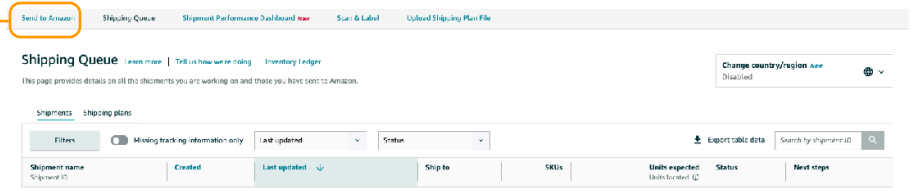
Step 1) Choose inventory to send

Step 1) Create your workflow

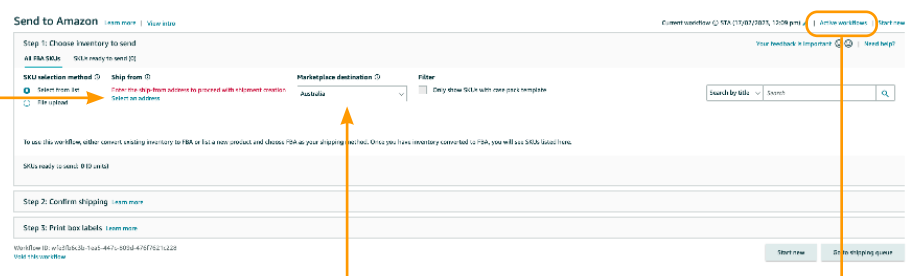
1) Click on left hand and select **Inventory**, then **Manage FBA Shipments**



2) Select **Send to Amazon**



3) To set up your workflow, select your **Ship-from** address.



4) Select your **Marketplace destination**.

HOT TIP: You can switch between as many as nine active workflows through **Active workflows**. Once all shipments in a workflow have been confirmed as shipped, the workflow is considered complete and will no longer count as active.

HOT TIP: No matter which option you select in Step 2, remember that to **bulk update** prep and labeling requirements, select the boxes to the left of the product image. You are only required to enter this once for each SKU.

Decide how you want to select your inventory from the below options:

a) Single-SKU boxes



Select option A: If the contents, weights and dimensions for your single-SKU boxes don't change frequently. You provide box content information through reusable case-pack templates.



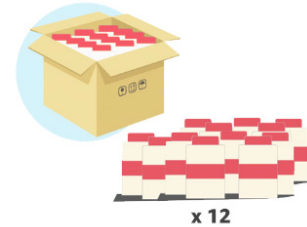
b) Individual units



Select option B: If you are shipping mixed-SKU boxes (boxes containing more than one SKU) or single-SKU boxes that change from shipment to shipment.



c) Bulk upload using template file

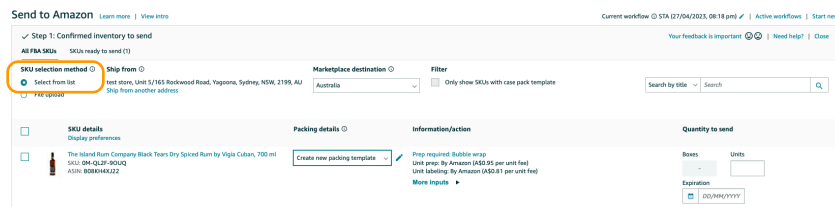


Select option C: If you want to add inventory to a workflow in bulk.

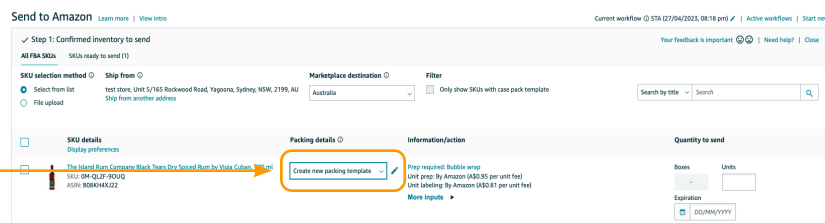


a) Single-SKU boxes (Create case-pack template)

1) Choose **Select from list** to add inventory from a list of available FBA SKUs.



2) Select **Create new packing template** for the SKU you want to work on.



3) Enter the following information into the template:

Packing template name: Name the template so that you can tell it apart from any others that you create for the same SKU.

Units per box: The number of sellable units in each shipping box. A sellable unit is the item that a customer can buy. For example, a pack of 10 pens sold together is 1 sellable unit.

Box dimensions: The outside dimensions of the shipping box.

Box weight: The total weight of a packed shipping box.

Prep for each unit: The [packaging and prep requirements](#) for your SKU.

Who preps units (if required): Choose **By seller** if your units will be prepped before they arrive at the fulfilment centre.

1. Choose **By Amazon** to opt in to the [FBA Prep Service](#).

2. Choose **By seller** if your units will be labelled before they arrive at the fulfilment centre.

Click **Save**, you can edit a template by clicking the Edit icon in the packaging details column.



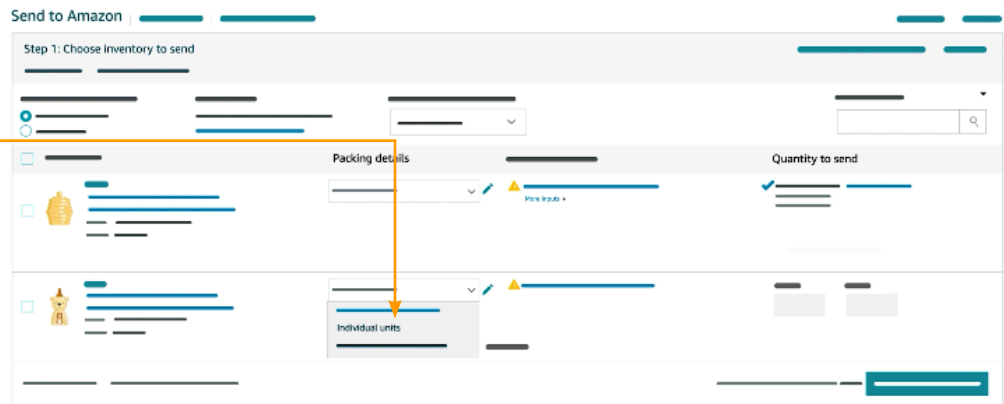
4) Enter the number of boxes to send for the SKU.

5) If you selected Seller as the labelling owner in the case-pack template, the **Print SKU labels** will be visible. Click to print and apply SKU labels.

You have now completed Step 1, you can move on to Step 2: Confirm Shipping.

b) Individual Units (mixed-SKU boxes)

1) From the Packing details drop-down menu, select **Individual units** for the SKU that you want to work on.



2) Enter the following information into the template:

Prep for each unit: The [packaging and prep requirements](#) for your SKU.

Who preps units (if required):

1. Choose **By Seller** if your units will be prepped before they arrive at the fulfilment centre.
2. Choose **By Amazon** to opt in to the [FBA Prep Service](#).

Who labels units (if required):

1. Choose **By Seller** if your units will be labelled before they arrived at the fulfilment center.
2. Choose **By Amazon** to opt into the [FBA Label Service](#).

3) Enter the **number of units** of the SKU that you want to send. Finalise by clicking **Ready to pack**.




4) If you're shipping individual units - you will find new step in the workflow **Step 1b: Pack individual units**. Follow steps [here](#) to fill this out accurately.

C) Bulk upload using template file

1) Tick **File upload**

2) Select Choose optional columns to add to your template:

- Choose **Case pack** information if one or more of your SKUs will be packed in single-SKU shipping boxes.
- Choose **Expiration date** if one or more of your SKUs require an expiration date. You can enter the expiration date information for your inventory in the Excel template.

3) Click **Generate and download file**.

You can create a workflow using a Microsoft Excel spreadsheet. Follow these 3 simple steps.

1. Generate and download the template
2. Complete the file with the list of SKUs that you want to replenish
3. Upload your completed file

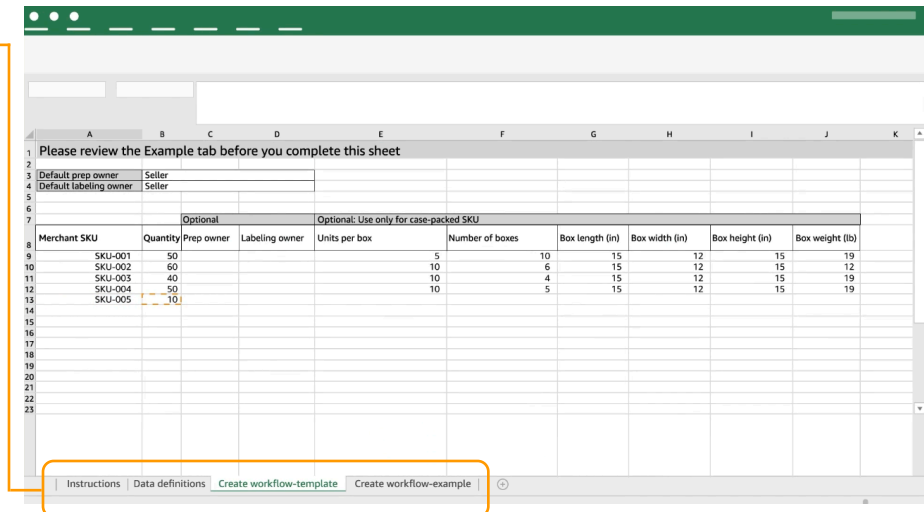

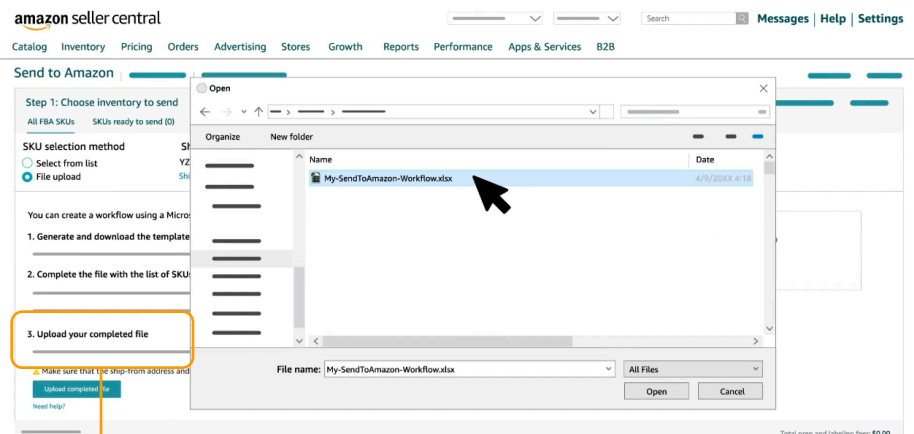

HOT TIP: Ensure items are labelled with **accurate expiration date** otherwise failure to specify manufacturing date can cause delays in receiving your products

4) The template has tabs with instructions, data definitions, and an example. Fill out the spreadsheet and list your SKUs in the **Create workflow-template tab**. The spreadsheet will include the option columns that you select when you generated the template.



5) After you have filled out all the required information. Save the spreadsheet in either option:
 1. .xlsx format (do not rename tabs or change the structure of the cells)
 2. **Create workflow-template tab** in .txt format.



6) Click **Upload complete File** and select your file. If there are errors you'll see an error message with a downloadable error report.

After you have added all of the inventory that you want to send, you can review all of the SKUs by clicking the SKUs ready to send tab. Proceed to [Step 2- Confirm shipping](#) (if packing mixed SKU boxes, go to [Step 1b – Pack individual units first](#)) by clicking Confirm and continue.

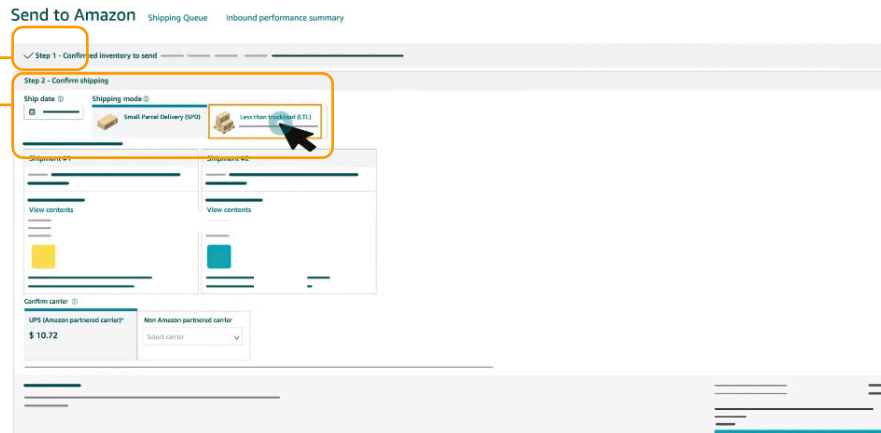


Step 2) Confirm Shipping

By default, Amazon assigns the destination fulfilment centre automatically in Seller Central during the FBA shipment creation process. Eligible sellers can sign up for [FBA Premium Placement](#) and send their eligible inventory to a single fulfilment centre. To confirm shipping, follow these steps:

1) Enter the estimated **Ship date** for the shipment in the workflow.

2) Select your Shipping mode:
1. Small parcel delivery
2. Less than truckload

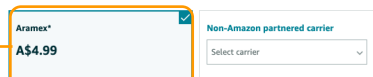


Using Amazon Partner Carrier Program for Small Parcel Delivery (SPD)

The Amazon Partnered Carrier Program (PCP) offers discounted shipping rates, the convenience of buying and printing shipping labels when you create shipments, shipment pick up and automated tracking when sending inventory to Amazon fulfilment centres.

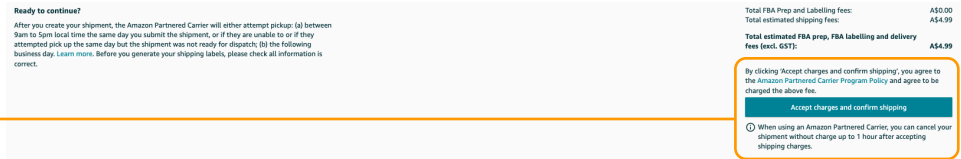
This service is currently available to sellers whose ship from address is an eligible AU postcode and use Fulfilment by Amazon (FBA) or Multi-Channel Fulfilment. These sellers are those who wish to send small parcel deliveries from eligible Australian postcodes to Amazon fulfilment centres in Australia.

1) Select the **Amazon Partnered Carrier** option as the 'shipping carrier'.

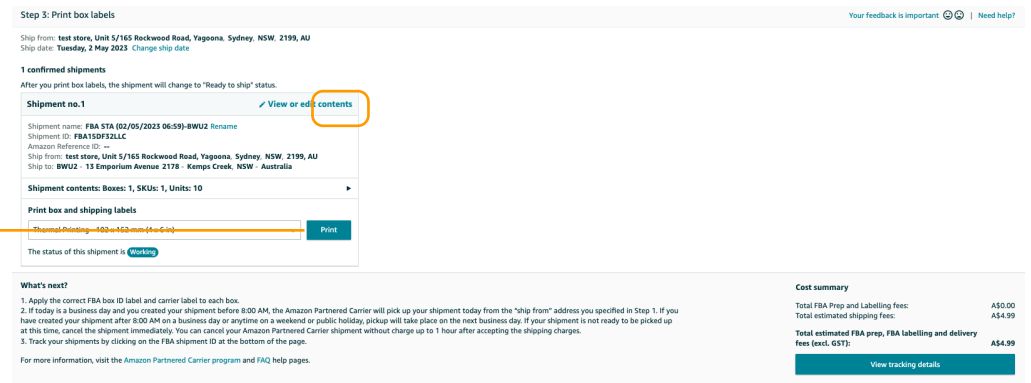


The Amazon Partnered Carrier program offers discounted delivery rates, the convenience of buying and printing delivery labels when you create shipments, shipment collection and automated tracking. Before creating your Amazon Partnered Carrier shipment, please ensure that your shipment is eligible for this service, you can comply with the collection schedule and your shipment does not contain any dangerous (hazmat) items, restricted products or products containing alcohol. 2) Before you **'Accept charges and confirming shipping'**, take check all the information you entered is correct and that your boxes are ready to be picked up in accordance with the pick-up schedule.



3) Click "Print" shipping labels. There will be a **FBA shipment label and Carrier shipping label** generated.



4) Prepare your shipment in accordance with our FBA packaging and prep requirements and affix the **FBA box ID label and carrier label (shipping label)**.



5) The Amazon Partnered Carrier will **automatically pick-up your shipment** from your specified "ship from" address based on the pick-up schedule. You do not need to separately pick up.

Pick-up Schedule

The carrier will pickup the shipment between **9 a.m. to 5 p.m.** local time within the next two business days after you created the shipment. If the carrier is unable to pick the shipment or if the shipment is not ready for dispatch on the first pickup attempt, then the Amazon Partnered Carrier will **attempt to pickup** on the **following business day**. If you select Non-Partnered Carrier for Small Parcel Delivery

1) Select **Non-Amazon partnered carrier** and select your carrier and how they will be transported



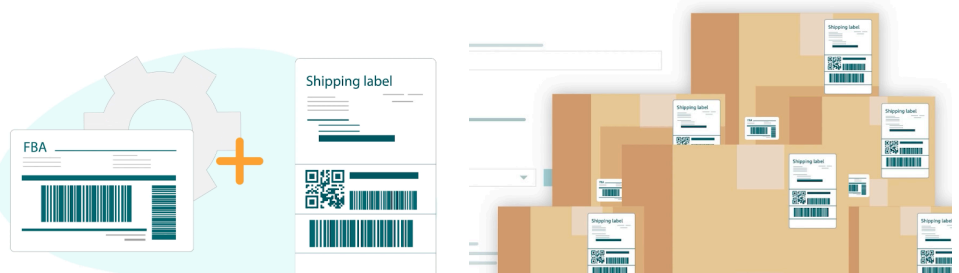

2) After you 'accept charges and confirm shipping', you can click Print box labels to generate a PDF with FBA box ID labels and carrier labels. Work with your carrier to create the carrier labels for your boxes.

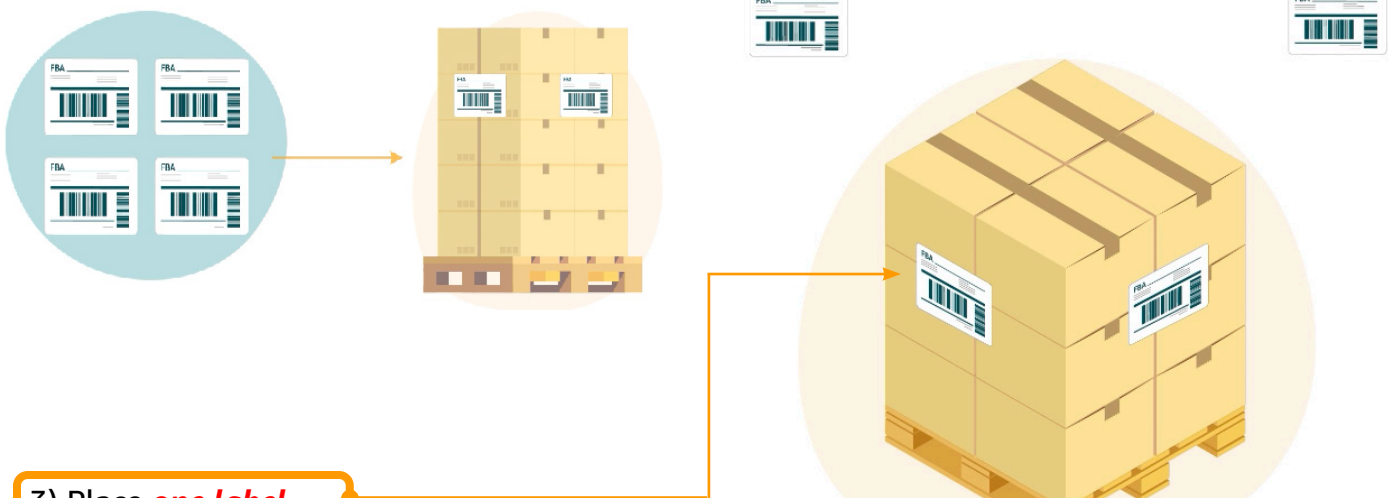
