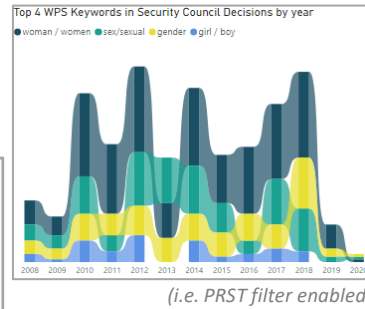


# How to navigate the Cross-cutting Themes Dashboard (Women and peace and security – page 1)

This view allows a user to get a quick grasp of Security Council decisions based on the cross-cutting themes keywords, by year, agenda item, and type of Security Council decision and paragraph

Since the interactivity with the rest of the report is enabled, a user can, for example, filter by year, PP/OP/PRST and explore the development of top four WPS keywords in Security Council decisions by year

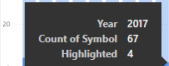

## How to navigate the Cross-cutting Themes Dashboard (Women and peace and security – page 2)

Filter by category of agenda items (thematic or country-specific and regional items), agenda items of Security Council decisions, and perambulatory paragraphs (PP) and operative paragraphs (OP) of Security Council resolution(s) and presidential statement(s) (PRST)

Select a year range between 2008 and 2020 using the year slicer

Clicking on the WPS icon allows a user to download the underlying data

Search a keyword (i.e. women) to view the text of a specific provision(s) of Security Council decision(s) and a link to a new window with a .pdf version of the relevant Security Council decision

The dashboard interface includes a navigation menu, filter sections for Category, Agenda, and PP/OP/PRST, a year range slicer, a search bar, and a table of results. A logo for 'women, peace, and security dashboard' is also present.

Country-specific and regional items	S/PRST/2008/38	PRST	2	The Security Council expresses its deep concern over continued threats to the safety of the civilian population and to the conduct of humanitarian operations. The Council strongly condemns the continuing recruitment and use of children by armed groups as well as the continued prevalence of sexual and gender based violence in the eastern region of the Democratic Republic of the Congo. It urges all parties to comply fully with their obligations under international law, including international humanitarian law, human rights law and refugee law.	<a href="#">🔗</a>
Country-specific and regional items	S/PRST/2008/4	PRST	2	The Security Council expresses its deep concern that, despite the commitments made on 1 February, civilians continue to be killed, subjected to sexual and gender-based violence and displaced from their homes. The Council emphasizes that the only solution to the crisis lies through dialogue, negotiation and compromise and strongly urges Kenya's political leaders to foster reconciliation and to elaborate and implement the actions agreed to on 1 February without delay, including by meeting their responsibility to engage fully in finding a sustainable political solution and taking action to end immediately violence, including ethnically motivated attacks, dismantle armed gangs, improve the humanitarian situation and restore human rights. Recalling the need to avoid impunity, the Council calls for those responsible for violence to be brought to justice. It expresses its concern at the political, security and economic impact of the crisis in Kenya on the wider region.	<a href="#">🔗</a>
Country-specific and regional items	S/PRST/2008/48	PRST	4	The Security Council strongly condemns the recent attacks by the LRA in the Democratic Republic of the Congo and Southern Sudan, which pose a continuing threat to regional security. It demands that the LRA cease its recruitment and use of children and that it release immediately all women, children and other non-combatants, in accordance with Security Council resolution 1612 (2005).
