27. Items relating to International Tribunals for the Former Yugoslavia and Rwanda

During the period under review, the Security Council held seven meetings and adopted three resolutions and one presidential statement related to the work of the International Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of the Former Yugoslavia since 1991 (ICTY) and the International Criminal Tribunal for the Prosecution of Persons Responsible for Genocide and Other Serious Violations of International Humanitarian Law Committed in the Territory of Rwanda and Rwandan Citizens Responsible for Genocide and Other Such Violations Committed in the Territory of Neighboring States between 1 January 1994 and 31 December 1994 (ICTR). ¹

At the meetings, the Council received semi-annual briefings by senior officials of the ICTY, the ICTR, as well as of the International Residual Mechanism for Criminal Tribunals (the Mechanism),² and considered the completion strategies of the Tribunals and their transition to the Mechanism. Acting under Chapter VII of the Charter, the Council, inter alia, re-appointed the Prosecutors of the ICTY and of the ICTR, respectively, and extended the terms of office of authorized permanent and ad litem judges of both Tribunals to serve

beyond the expiry of their terms of office.³ By resolution 2256 (2015), the Council also welcomed the completion of the judicial work of the ICTR, and acknowledged its substantial contribution to the process of national reconciliation and the restoration of peace and security, and to the fight against impunity and the development of international criminal justice, especially in relation to the crime of genocide.⁴ On 31 December 2015, the Council issued press statement SC/12188, marking the close of the ICTR.
