# A National Check Professional (NCP) Designation

An NCP designation recognizes professionals who have successfully proven an expert level of understanding of the current check payments landscape. This sets you apart by:

- Recognizing your knowledge and comprehension of check payments
- Recognizing you as a leader in your field
- Strengthening your professional credibility
- Demonstrating your commitment to customer service
- Demonstrating your commitment to stay on the leading edge of industry trends and topics of interest
- Positioning you for professional advancement

# The Ideal Candidate for The NCP Program

Passing the NCP exam indicates that you are a Subject Matter Expert in all areas of the check payment system. There are three main things that are needed to pass the NCP exam:

### 1. Experience

- It is strongly recommended you have **2+ years' experience** working in the checks payment industry.
- Candidates should possess experience in at least one of the following areas: check or image operations, treasury, product, fraud and/or risk.

#### 2. Time

Successful candidates spend on average 10+ dedicated hours per week studying for the exam including independent study, attending TCHPA's prep series, and participating in a study group.

### 3. Knowledge

A thorough understanding of the Laws & Regulations is critical to being successful on the exam. You will be answering questions that show your understanding in how to apply the different rules and regulations that affect check processing. We recommend focusing your attention on the warranties and indemnifications in the check payment systems. Understand the responsibilities of each participant; who has liability and who has recourse.

### What You Need to Know

The NCP exam is sponsored and administered by ECCHO and consists of 120 multiple choice questions. Twenty of those questions are pilot questions, meaning they won't be scored. You are allowed three hours to complete the exam.

The exam is comprised of four main categories:

- Rules, Laws & Regulations
- Fraud and Risk Mitigation
- Check Operations
- Check Products

The weight of these categories can change slightly yearly, as well as the registration fees and key dates. - Be actively engaged in TCHPA's NCP Prep Webinar Series- free for TCHPA Members.

   and make sure that you understand what you're learning in your individual study
   sessions.
