

## Continuing Education Renewal Credits



Although it is our goal to develop curriculum that meets the criteria of NACHA, ECCHO and AFP (etc.) for continuing education, we cannot guarantee renewal credits based on registration alone. It is ultimately up to the owner of each designation to approve or deny credits based on attendee submissions. For example, NACHA (and other organizations) should take into consideration how many times an AAP has taken a specific course and/or whether the materials covered are too basic for a long time AAP (examples). With this type of reasoning in mind, we advise our audience to:

- be familiar with the criteria outlined by the individual organizations
- choose the appropriate course content
- monitor and chronicle the time spent on eligible training
- save registration confirmations and handouts to support credit submissions

Remember, The Clearing House Payments Authority is a Direct Member of NACHA and therefore a recognized and licensed provider of Payments Education.

Calculation Example: If a workshop runs from 9:00am – 4:00pm with an hour break for lunch, it should qualify for 6 hours or 360 minutes of training. Divide that by 50 minutes (NACHA's criteria), it equates to 7.2 renewal credits. But again, different organizations have different criteria.
