A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Creation of a State Debt – Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2024,**
3 **and the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loans of 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018,**
4 **2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, and 2023**

5 FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of ~~One Billion,~~
6 ~~Seven Hundred and Ninety Two Million, Eight Hundred and Thirty Thousand~~
7 ~~Dollars (\$1,792,830,000)~~ One Billion, Seven Hundred and Ninety-Five Million, Eight
8 Hundred and Ninety-Six Thousand Dollars (\$1,795,896,000), the proceeds to be used
9 for certain necessary building, construction, demolition, planning, renovation,
10 conversion, replacement, and capital equipment purchases of the State, for acquiring
11 certain real estate in connection therewith, and for grants to certain subdivisions
12 and other organizations for certain development and improvement purposes, subject
13 to certain requirements that certain matching funds be provided and expended by
14 certain dates; providing generally for the issuance and sale of bonds evidencing the
15 loan; imposing a certain tax on all assessable property in the State; requiring that
16 certain grantees convey certain easements under certain circumstances to the
17 Maryland Historical Trust; providing that the proceeds of certain loans must be
18 expended or encumbered by a certain date; requiring the Department of General
19 Services to record certain correct information in certain grant agreements under
20 certain circumstances, notwithstanding certain differences; authorizing the Board of
21 Public Works, under certain circumstances, to approve certain appropriations,
22 notwithstanding certain ~~technical~~ differences; authorizing certain unexpended
23 appropriations in certain prior capital budgets and bond loans to be expended for
24 other public projects; altering certain requirements for certain programs in certain
25 prior capital budgets and bond loans; reducing prior authorizations of State Debt;
26 requiring that certain projects be constructed at certain locations; adding, altering,
27 and repealing certain requirements for certain appropriations; specifying the use of
28 certain project funds; altering and expanding the authorized purpose of certain

30 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 31 That:

32 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on
 33 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland
 34 Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2024 in the total principal amount of ~~\$1,792,830,000~~
 35 \$1,795,896,000. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of State
 36 general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works and
 37 issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with §§ 8–117 through 8–124 and 8–131.2 of the

1 State Finance and Procurement Article.

2 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold as a
3 single issue of bonds under § 8–122 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

4 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer and
5 first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and delivering the
6 bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then shall be credited on
7 the books of the Comptroller and expended on approval by the Board of Public Works, for
8 the following public purposes, including any applicable architects’ and engineers’ fees:
