This is a request to spend federal dollars received through the CARES Act as part of the Coronavirus Relief Fund for necessary expenditures incurred due to the public health emergency with respect to the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19). This request is submitted under M.S. 3.3005 subd. 4 and 5, which allows for a 10-day review.

Attached are the details of the federal fund review request. Details about this request were shared in a briefing for the Legislative COVID-19 Response Commission members and the chairs of the relevant House and Senate Finance Committees on July 7, 2020.

DEED's non-payroll expenses include acquisition and distribution of sanitizing products, personal protective equipment, or other COVID-19 related supplies, disinfecting and intense cleaning of DEED facilities, improved teleworking strategies, remote service delivery models and translation services of materials into multiple languages to ensure understanding.

Although DEED had payroll expenses that were coded to C19 for COVID-related activities, these positions including the Incident Management Team, were already budgeted positions so have been excluded from this request. Also, DEED had state and federal positions that ended up being on COVID leave, these positions were already budgeted positions so have been excluded from this request. Although there is a risk that the COVID-leave costs for federally-funded employees may be disallowed in the future, it is considered unlikely since the federal government required the COVID leave, although the state policy is more generous.

Also, excluded are any COVID-19 related expenditures paid from COVID-related federal/state funds already awarded to DEED. We are using these resources first to preserve the more flexible CRF dollars. This exclusion includes our payroll (C19 and CVD) and non-payroll expenses for our Unemployment Insurance Program. These UI COVID-19 expenses certainly meet the requirements for reimbursement under this CRF program, but we received \$9.8 million in administrative dollars from the Department of Labor for their COVID-related expenses, exclusively for the operation of this program. Similarly, we have excluded BCD payroll expenses (C19 only) since they received state dollars and we have used other BCD funding sources for these COVID-19 related expenses since there were no administrative dollars provided.
