Subject: URGENT REVIEW | #65-70 Coronavirus Relief Fund Request to Legislative Advisory Commission

This is a request to spend federal dollars received through the CARES Act as part of the Coronavirus Relief Fund for necessary expenditures incurred due to the public health emergency with respect to the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID–19). These requests are submitted under M.S. 3.3005 subd. 4 and 5, which allows for a 10-day review.
