MDVA has been responding to the COVID-19 crisis in a number of ways in order to protect our Veterans Homes residents, our staff, and MN Veterans that have been negatively impacted by the COVID-19 emergency. The following is a list of the agency's response and the impact that it will have on our FY21 General Fund budget that wasn't otherwise funded or appropriated to respond to this emergency.

1. \$1.0 million for staff costs for the Veteran Healthcare program in order maintain a safe COVID-free healthcare environment for our residents and staff in the Veterans Homes. MDVA has had staff shortages due to COVID leave which has resulted in an increase in overtime and the need to have other staff and contract workers pick-up extra shifts at the Veterans Homes.

2. \$300 thousand for non-payroll costs for Veteran Healthcare program for the purchase of Personal Protective Equipment for staff and residents along with other necessary products and services to maintain a safe COVID-free healthcare environment.

3. \$2.8 million for COVID-19 testing of Staff. New CMS COVID Testing requirements which will require extensive testing of Staff at four veteran homes. Memorandum and Interim Public Law, Ref: QSO-20-38-NH on August 26, 2020.

4. \$85 thousand for increased MNIT technology costs due to having staff working from home which required purchasing additional laptops, new phones and increased voice service.

5. \$60 thousand for staff overtime costs for the Programs & Services program in order to process emergency grants for MN Veterans that have been impacted by COVID.

6. \$305 thousand for non-payroll costs for the Programs & Services program to cover costs related to purchasing necessary products and services to maintain a safe COVID-free work environment at our State Veterans cemeteries, the Veterans Services building and MNIT office work spaces.

7. \$60 thousand of non-payroll contract costs for the MN CORE program which is serviced by Lutheran Social Services to provide mental health services and respite care to MN Veterans and dependents who have by impacted by COVID-19.
