The Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development (DEED) oversees the Minnesota Small Business Relief Grants Program approved by the Minnesota State Legislature and signed by Gov. Tim Walz on June 16, 2020. A total of \$62.5 million was appropriated with \$60 million from Corona Virus Relief funds and \$2.5 million from the Small Business Loan Guarantee Trust Fund.

Additional Funding Request

DEED is requesting \$10 million in CRF dollars that would be deployed through this existing program.

- Approximately \$4-5 million would be used for grants to businesses that were previously found to be ineligible solely due to a lapsed or missing business registration with the Office of the Secretary of State (OSS). Before a grant is approved, the business will demonstrate they are in good standing with the OSS.
- Approximately \$5-6 million would be used for randomly selected businesses that are currently on the waiting list. There are approximately 17,700 businesses that are on the application waiting list.
- Any leftover funds (approximately \$250,000) would be directed for grants to Cultural Mall operators to back fill any grant awards they were unable to utilize prior to December 1.
