Federal Funds for Legislative Advisory Commission (LAC) Review May 4, 2021

Department of Education

Homeless Children and Youth – American Rescue Plan (ARP)

Amount: FY 2021 - \$1,622,051; FY 2022 - \$7,028,884

Urgency: Funds are needed to provide services in the coming months to meet the immediate needs of students experiencing homelessness. These funds were not included in a previous ARP submission because the specific amounts of funding available to states were not announced until April 2021.

Flexibility: Funds must be spent on providing homeless children and youth wraparound services and assistance to attend school and participate fully in school activities.

Summary: These funds are for the purposes of identifying homeless children and youth, providing wraparound services in light of the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, and providing assistance needed to enable homeless children and youth to attend school and participate fully in school activities, including in-person instruction this spring and summer learning and enrichment programs that begin in the coming months.

Department of Health

Epidemiology and Laboratory Capacity for Infections Disease (ELC) – Funding to Support Reopening Schools **Amount:** FY 2021 – \$90,000,000; FY 2022 – \$79,862,951

Urgency: The funds support the immediate needs to safely reopen schools and the ongoing efforts to keep schools operating safely. Funds must be spent immediately and in coming months to jump start the ability for jurisdictions to implement school testing through the close of the present school year (estimated May 1, 2021, to June 30, 2021), and later for safe operation during the 2021-2022 school year.

Flexibility: A minimum of 85% of the award must be allocated to support public or private schools that cover all or some K-12 grades.

Summary: Funding is planned to be expended on school-based screening testing.

<u>Epidemiology and Laboratory Capacity for Infections Disease (ELC) – Funding to Support Advanced Molecular Development Technologies, Public Health Laboratory Preparedness, and Travelers' Health</u>

Amount: FY 2021 – \$300,000; FY 2022 – \$952,000

Urgency: Funds must be spent immediately and in coming months to ensure Minnesota remains in a position to respond to the COVID-19 pandemic, particularly in the areas of submitting genomic sequencing samples to the CDC, ensuring the public health laboratory is well-equipped, and meeting the ever changing rules around travel, isolation, and quarantine as the nation and the world becomes more mobile.

Flexibility: Provided funding is restricted to use on the three identified award components of advanced molecular development technologies, public health laboratory preparedness, and travelers' health.

Summary: Funding is planned to be expended on advanced molecular development technologies, public health laboratory preparedness, and travelers' health.

FEMA Funding for Vaccination – Disaster Grants – Public Assistance

Amount: FY 2021 – \$17,000,000. FEMA will advance 50% of these funds and then reimburse MDH for the remaining amount after expenditures have been made.

Urgency: Funds must be spent immediately and in coming months to support the distribution and administration of COVID-19 vaccines.

Flexibility: Funds may be spent on certain COVID-19 vaccination efforts, though there are FEMA restrictions on eligibility of expenditures.

Summary: Funding is planned to be expended on local public health, tribes, and health care coalition grants, mass vaccination sites, community vaccinators and coordinators, communications, call centers, technology, and materials, supplies and equipment for vaccine sites.

Women, Infants and Children (WIC) Cash-Value Voucher/Benefit

Amount: FY 2021 – \$2,021,000; FY 2022 – \$6,164,811

Urgency: Implementation of this temporary increase in the Cash-Value Voucher/Benefit (CVB) for Fruit and Vegetable purchases is only authorized between now and September 30, 2021 for a maximum of 4 months of WIC benefit issuance.

Flexibility: Funds must be used to supplement nutritional food costs associated with this temporary Cash-Value Voucher/Benefit increase.

Summary: Funding is planned to be expended on covering the increased costs associated with this temporary Cash-Value Voucher/Benefit increase.

Department of Human Services/Minnesota Board on Aging

Aging and Disability Resource Center/ No Wrong Door System COVID-19 Vaccine Access Supplemental Funding

Amount: FY 2021 - \$100,000; FY 2022 - \$295,291

Urgency: Funding needed to support vaccination efforts **Flexibility:** Award provided to assist vaccination efforts

Summary: This award will be used for three purposes. \$170,251 will be allocated to third party contracts to transport people with disabilities to vaccinations sites. \$100,000 will be allocated for translation and other communication assistance for older adults and people with disabilities for vaccine education and awareness including appointment registration. \$125,000 will be used for a temporary full time equivalent staff at the Minnesota Board on Aging for 15 months.

Department of Human Services

Expanding Access to COVID-19 Vaccines via the Aging Network

Amount: FY 2021 - \$150,000; FY 2022 - \$586,000; FY 2023 - \$90,149 **Urgency:** Funding needed to support vaccination for older Minnesotans

Flexibility: Award must be spent expanding vaccine access

Summary: Awards to the Department of Human Services and Area Agencies on Aging will be used to provide services to older Minnesotans. This includes identifying people who may need help getting a COVID-19 vaccination, help with scheduling appointments and assistance with transportation to those appointments. This award can also be used to provide technical assistance to local public health departments and providing peer support.

FEMA-Disaster Grants - Public Assistance (Presidentially Declared Disasters)

Amount: FY 2021 - \$948,500

Urgency: Needed to sustain vaccination activities among vulnerable populations

Flexibility: Award to be spent in accordance with request made to the federal government

Summary: The state is seeking reimbursement from the FEMA Public Assistance program to support the distribution and administration of COVID-19 vaccines. This award is designed to allow the Department of Human Services to support vaccination efforts among at-risk populations including providing vaccine information and assistance to those enrolled in Medicaid or receiving Older Americans Act-funded long-term services and supports, those experiencing housing instability, and staff serving those populations. This funding will support vaccine assistance contracts with third party nonprofit organizations, expanded vaccination education, and additional administrative costs for DHS, MDH, and the Minnesota Board on Aging. The state is requesting \$948,500 from FEMA to cover expenses from March 1st to June 30th. Half of this award will be an advanced payment, with the rest coming after expenses have been incurred.

Part Three - Grant Description

Narrative Description of the Federal Award

The purpose of this award is to support the specific and urgent needs of homeless children and youth in recognition of the extraordinary impact of the pandemic on students experiencing homelessness. States can address urgent needs of homeless children and youth including academic, social, emotional, and mental health needs, and so States and local educational agencies (LEAs) can increase capacity by hiring staff, dedicating resources, and planning partnerships with community-based organizations, among other strategies.

Funding will be dispersed by USDE in two parts, ARP Homeless I and ARP Homeless II. ARP Homeless I funds supplement the McKinney-Vento Education of Homeless Children and Youth program, and all allowable EHCY uses apply to these funds. These funds must be distributed as soon as possible to LEAs so that funding can be used for students experiencing homelessness in spring and summer 2021. These activities may include any expenses necessary to facilitate the identification, enrollment, retention, and educational success of homeless children and youth, such as:

- providing wraparound services (which could be provided in collaboration with and/or through contracts with community-based organizations, and could include academic supports, trauma [1] informed care, social-emotional support, and mental health services);
- purchasing needed supplies (e.g., PPE, eyeglasses, school supplies, personal care items);
- providing transportation to enable children and youth to attend classes and participate fully in school activities;
- purchasing cell phones or other technological devices for unaccompanied youth to enable the youth to attend and fully participate in school activities;
- providing access to reliable, high-speed internet for students through the purchase of internet[1] connected devices/equipment, mobile hotspots, wireless service plans, or installation of Community Wi-Fi Hotspots (e.g., at homeless shelters), especially in underserved communities;
- paying for short-term, temporary housing (e.g., a few days in a motel) when such emergency housing is the only reasonable option for COVID-safe temporary housing and when necessary to
- enable the homeless child or youth to attend school and participate fully in school activities (including summer school); and
- providing store cards/prepaid debit cards to purchase materials necessary for students to participate in school activities.

ARP Homeless II funds will be available as soon as June 2021 and will be distributed on a formula basis to LEAs.

Part Three - Grant Description

Narrative Description of the Federal Award

This federal award is to support safe, in-person instruction in kindergarten through grade 12 (K-12) schools, screening testing can provide another layer of prevention to protect students, teachers, and staff and slow the spread of SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19). While it is critical for schools to open as soon as possible (and remain open) for academic, social, and emotional benefits, it is equally important to do so safely.

The federal government is providing financial resources to enable and expand school-based screening testing. This award will enable schools to establish COVID-19 screening testing programs to support and maintain in-person learning. Screening guidance must be implemented in ways consistent with CDC guidance.

The goal of the ELC Reopening Schools funds are for states to set up comprehensive programs of weekly test screening in K-12 schools (public and private) across their entire jurisdiction (i.e., state, local, and territorial).

The objectives and goals of this funding are primarily focused on providing needed resources to implement screening testing programs in schools aligned with the CDC recommendations for K-12. Therefore, a minimum of 85% of the award must be allocated to directly fund school districts or provide materials (e.g., test kits, PPE, staffing, etc.) and services (e.g., sample collection, laboratory testing, etc.) to increase screening testing in all K-12 schools (public or private) within the recipient's jurisdiction. These testing efforts will support determination of appropriate modifications to school quarantine guidance.

A key goal of this initiative is to establish screening testing programs in schools around the country in April 2021, extending through the end of the school year and into summer activities and subsequent school year, through June 2022. In short, these funds are focused to increase testing, access to testing and support to K-12 schools so that they can reopen and/or remain opened.

Recipients will need to support school district implementation with technical assistance and monitoring, as well as identifying public health actions needed based on school screening testing information. Recipients should assure that school districts and private/charter schools have adequate plans for action when they identify a positive test result.

Coinciding with the heightened testing period and into Summer 2021, assessment of appropriate testing modalities and methods, and research into less expensive testing options will be explored through a request for information and subsequent vendor selection process that aligns with the goals of this effort and its related funding.

10-Day Urgent Request – Describe the nature of the urgency.

The department is seeking approval under the Minnesota Laws of 2020, chapter 66. The funds are focused around three main activities that are designed to meet the immediate needs to safely reopen schools and the ongoing efforts to keep schools operating safely. The focus for Activity 1 is to jump start the ability for jurisdictions to implement school testing (estimated April 1, 2021, to June 30, 2021). A minimum of 85% of the award must be allocated to support public or private schools that cover all or some K-12 grades within the recipient's jurisdiction. Because this time frame for this first activity focuses on the current school year, we need the funds approved as quickly as possible.

Part Three – Grant Description

Narrative Description of the Federal Award

This award is supplemental for three specific projects: advanced molecular development (AMD) technologies, public health laboratory preparedness, and travelers' health:

Project 1: AMD Technologies: The advent of high throughput DNA sequencing, or next-generation sequencing (NGS), has greatly expanded the use of AMD technologies in public health. This funding is being made available to Epidemiology and Laboratory Capacity (ELC) grant recipients to increase the amount of SARS-CoV-2 sequencing being performed in the United States and facilitate the use of microbial genomic sequence data in the response to SARS-CoV-2 and other emerging pathogens. MDH will use this funding to:

- •Sequence at least 1,500 specimens that tested positive for COVID-19 from August 1, 2020-July 31, 2021
- •Send COVID positive specimens to the CDC weekly in addition to conducting NGS activity in the MDH lab
- Provide associated metadata (important testing information that is critical for investigations) when available
- •Use tools, including Nextstrain, to integrate genomic and epidemiologic data
- •Continue our relationship with the University of Minnesota to aid with COVID sequencing and to leverage their supercomputing capacity
- •Hire additional staff to facilitate and improve the use of our laboratory information management system (LIMS) and the electronic submission of data and test resulting to improve overall data quality, decrease staff time, and improve efficiency

Project 2: **Public Health Laboratory Preparedness:** The goals and objectives of this funding include strengthening state and local public health laboratory preparedness and response capabilities by building a robust, flexible, and scalable infrastructure and enhancing and modernizing data pipelines, analysis, and laboratory data reporting. MDH will

- Purchase equipment that will produce high quality testing results more efficiently, including instruments to aid with nucleic acid extraction, NGS, and service contracts for the MDH matrix-assisted laser desorption/ionization mass spectrometry
- •Continue shipping activities of biothreat agents to appropriate partners

Project 3: Travelers Health: ELC is awarding COVID-19 supplemental funds for:

- 1) Developing streamlined approaches for the collection and reporting of traveler-related data, as well as building capacity for data-sharing among public health networks, including sharing with CDC.
- 2) Identifying, developing, and implementing innovative solutions for communicating with travelers.
- 3) Providing guidance for public health activities at travel hubs and among travel industry stakeholders. With this funding, MDH will:
- •Continue to work closely with CDC and the Minneapolis/St. Paul Quarantine Station on traveler health related issues. This partnership includes the notification between partners of traveler-related data and follow-up related to travel-associated cases. Protocols on collecting information on travel and reports on travel-associated cases will be formalized. Activities will include improvement of IT systems to more efficiently communicate between groups and develop timely and accurate ways of reporting. Systems will be developed to accurately report relevant traveler testing and vaccination data between groups.
- •Explore and develop collaborative partnerships with various travel stakeholders including community-based travel agents, travel clinics, community clinics. Resource materials and information will be provided, including new resources developed with their input to improve how the resources will resonate and impact community members.

10-Day Urgent Request – Describe the nature of the urgency.

The department is seeking approval under the Minnesota Laws of 2020, chapter 66. These funds were awarded in December 2020 for this work and are critical to ensuring Minnesota remains in a position to respond to the COVID-19 response, particularly in the areas of submitting genomic sequencing samples to the CDC per the requirements; ensuring the public health laboratory is well-equipped by supplying funds for staff, supplies and new lab equipment to meet the increased capacity demands; and meeting the ever changing rules around travel, isolation, and quarantine especially as the nation and the world becomes more mobile.

Narrative Description of the Federal Award

Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) Public Assistance grant program is a mechanism for states to seek reimbursement for certain costs incurred during a major disaster or emergency declared by the president. Minnesota is seeking reimbursement from the FEMA Public Assistance Program for costs to support the distribution and administration of COVID-19 vaccines, in accordance with guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

Eligible costs for reimbursement include temporary leased space, facility support costs, equipment, supplies and materials, and communications, among other costs. The cost of the vaccine dose itself is not supported by FEMA reimbursement. In order for the costs to be eligible for reimbursement, they must be performed by, or at the direction of, public health officials.

For eligible expenses incurred during the authorization period, FEMA will reimburse 100% of costs and provide 50% in advance. The department is submitting anticipated expenses for 1/21/2021 to 6/30/2021 of \$53M.

Total allowable FEMA vaccination costs for the above award (\$53M) are as follows:

- -Local public health, tribes, and healthcare coalition grants: \$5.0M
- -Vaccination sites and miscellaneous costs: \$12.0M
- -Community vaccinators/vaccinate homeless and other congregate living facilities contracts: \$3.5M
- -Communication (vaccine messaging & media buys)/ community outreach/diverse media contracts: \$8.3M
- -COVID immunization community coordinators, federally qualified health centers, and community based organization contracts: \$12M
- Call center contract: \$5.2M
- Technology services/MN.IT: \$5.5M
- Transportation: \$1M
- Materials, supplies, and equipment for vaccine sites: \$0.5M

Narrative Description of the Federal Award

On March 11, 2021, President Biden signed the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) into law. Under section 1105 of Subtitle B, Title I of ARPA, the USDA may temporarily increase the Cash-Value Voucher/Benefit (CVB) for Fruit and Vegetable purchases up to \$35 for the time period of June 2021 - September 2021, during the federally declared COVID-19 public health emergency. Minnesota Department of Health received \$8,185,811 to cover the increased costs associated with this temporary Cash-Value Voucher/Benefit increase.

The voucher benefit increase will be applied to invoices for costs incurred for eligible purchases in both FY2021 and FY2022, and are received as a supplement to existing WIC disbursements. Vouchers will be paid by MDH against costs submitted by vendors that, in turn, reimburse retail locations for vouchers redeemed by WIC program participants. None of the costs are used for administration at the department.

10-Day Urgent Request – Describe the nature of the urgency. The department is seeking approval under the Minnesota Laws of 2020, chapter 66. The implementation of this temporary increase in the Cash-Value Voucher/Benefit (CVB) for Fruit and Vegetable purchases up to \$35 is time sensitive since it is only authorized between now and September 30, 2021 for a maximum of 4 months of WIC benefit issuance. Minnesota WIC will begin offering this increase in benefits for June 1, 2021 to fully utilize the authorized 4 months of increased benefits. WIC food benefits are typically issued for 3 months at a time, thus WIC Local Agencies must already start to issue food benefits for the 3 months including June 2021.

- \$170,251 will be allocated to third party contracts for transportation for people with disabilities to vaccination sites.
- \$100,000 will be allocated to third party contracts for translation and other communication assistance for older adults and people with disabilities necessary for vaccine education and awareness raising, including vaccine hesitancy, as well as to register for and access vaccines.
- \$125,000 will be allocated as temporary administrative expenses for a full time equivalent staff at MBA for 15 months.

Narrative Description of the Federal Award

Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) Public Assistance grant program is a mechanism for states to seek reimbursement for certain costs occurred during a major disaster or emergency declared by the President. Minnesota is seeking reimbursement from the FEMA Public Assistance Program for costs to support the distribution and administration of COVID-19 vaccines, in accordance with guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. This award, specifically, will allow DHS to support vaccination efforts for at-risk populations, including to provide vaccine information and assistance to people enrolled in Medicaid or receiving Older Americans Act-funded long-term services and supports, those experiencing housing instability, and staff serving those populations. DHS vaccine assistance efforts are happening, in addition to vaccination efforts by the Minnesota Department of Health and local public health, due to statutory restrictions on data sharing between the welfare system and public health data systems.

This funding will support vaccine assistance contracts with third party nonprofit organizations, expanded vaccination education, and additional administrative costs for DHS, MDH, and Minnesota Board on Aging.

For eligible expenses incurred during the authorization period, FEMA will reimburse 100% of costs and provide 50% in advance. DHS is submitting anticipated expenses for 3/1/2021 to 6/30/2021 of \$948,500. FEMA has provided an advance payment of \$474,250, with the remainder to be paid after expenses are incurred.
