Part Three - Grant Description

Narrative Description of the Federal Award

This agreement provides funding under the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA) to Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) to develop a comprehensive, economy-wide climate mitigation plan or update an existing plan in collaboration with air pollution control districts, and large and small municipalities statewide, and tribal governments that will support actions to reduce greenhouse gases (GHG) and harmful air pollutants and to conduct meaningful engagement with low- income and disadvantaged communities.

Specifically, the project will support technical analysis, collaboration, and engagement to expand Minnesota's Climate Action Framework and identify near-term, high-priority, quantified greenhouse gas (GHG) reduction measures that are applicable at different scales and by different jurisdictions. This work will focus on ensuring that climate actions maximize benefits and lead to the creation of high-quality jobs in the state, especially for low-income and disadvantaged communities (LIDAC).

In general, activities include the development, updating, and evaluation of plans to reduce climate pollution (i.e., to reduce GHG emissions and/or enhance carbon sinks). The Interagency Minnesota Climate Change Subcabinet, led by MPCA, will develop a Priority Climate Action Plan (PCAP) and Comprehensive Climate Action Plan (CCAP) that will cover the entire state, using the Climate Action Framework as a foundation. Targets for this work include an overall framework goal to reduce emissions by 50% by 2030 and achieve net zero emissions by 2050, aligning with the United States' nationally determined contribution to cut emissions under the Paris Agreement.

10-Day Urgent Request – Describe the nature of the urgency.

The first deliverable of this grant, the Priority Climate Action Plan (PCAP), is due March 1, 2024. To meet this deadline, we need to hire staff to complete this work at MPCA, award and execute contracts for greenhouse gas emissions quantification and forecasting, and subaward to the Department of Health and Department of Employment and Economic Development for staff hiring at those agencies. Completion of this first deliverable is required for states to become eligible to apply to EPA for Climate Pollution Reduction Grant implementation funds to implement GHG reduction activities identified in the PCAP. The deadline for applying for these implementation grant funds is April 1, 2024. Implementation grants are competitive to be funded out of a national pot of \$4.6 billion, with awards anticipated to be \$2-500 million each.
