Subject: Urgent Review of Federal Funds

We are requesting your review and response on a federal award received by the Department of Employment and Economic Development so that these federal funds can be distributed as soon as possible to support community needs in order to avoid waiting ten days for distribution.

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act (CARES Act), as well as other coronavirus related federal legislation, included several specific grant increases and new grant programs that will be distributed through state government agencies. As state agencies receive notice of these awards, we would like to deploy these resources to support the community as quickly as possible.

This grant is separate from and in addition to the \$1.87 billion state award for the Coronavirus Relief Fund.

Today I am submitting a request to the Legislative Advisory Commission (LAC) for federal review under the provisions of Minnesota Statute 3.3005, subdivisions 4 and 5. I have attached to this email for summary purposes a descriptive list of the request and the federal funds review request form for the grant award.

The LAC review form provides information about the amount of the federal award, the timeline for spending, the proposed uses of the funds and the requirements associated with accepting the funding.

Procedure for LAC review: LAC members have until Monday, August 17, to provide a recommendation. To expedite the LAC review process, LAC members may respond to this review request directly by email, recommending their approval or request for further review. If all LAC review recommendations are received immediately, we may proceed with the distribution instead of waiting the 10-day period. The Department of Employment and Economic Development has notified their committee chairs about the federal grant award.

Federal Funds for Legislative Advisory Commission (LAC) Review August 7, 2020

Employment and Economic Development

National Dislocated Worker Grant Program/COVID-19-MN-Disaster Recovery

Amount: FY 2021 – \$1,267,900; FY 2022 - \$1,267,895

Urgency: The agency can begin spending these funds once approved.

Flexibility: Funding must be used to address the workforce-related impacts of the public health emergency related to the coronavirus pandemic. Disaster Recovery Dislocated Worker Grants (DWGs) may only be used to provide eligible participants disaster-relief employment to address coronavirus impacts within their communities, as well as employment and training activities. Funding may also be used to provide reemployment services to eligible individuals affected by mass layoffs.

Summary: Supported by the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA), DWGs temporarily expand the service capacity of dislocated worker training and employment programs at the state and local levels by providing funding assistance in response to large, unexpected economic events that cause significant job losses.

Part Three – Grant Description

Narrative Description of the Federal Award

Before eligible customers are connected with the following employment opportunities, they will receive career and training services provided by the local DW provider of their choice. In fact, a portion of the customers, expected to be 800, will only receive career and training services of this nature. These services will occur 1:1 with the customer and an assigned DW Counselor in a safe manner regarding the global pandemic. The customers served will share their experience and needs. The DW Counselor will administer skills and interest assessments and help the customer analyze the results. Together, both parties will develop an individualized employment plan. Individual employment plans will help the customers pursue training, or employment related to this grant in the positions shown below, or employment in other jobs or any combination of these general categories. Labor market information will also be provided to the customers by DW Counselors to help the customer forge a robust path forward.

Along the way customers may need supportive services in order to: initially meet with a DW Counselor; continue their meeting with their DW Counselor to receive services; participate in Employment Plan related activities; and to participate in employment. For example, for those that find suitable employment their first paycheck will not be received until after the first two weeks most likely. During that time, they will still need to pay their bills and secure transportation. It will be appropriate for a customer in this situation to receive supportive services to fuel their vehicle or safely access public transit to attend work.

Customers need the services described above due to negative economic impacts caused by the local COVID-19 pandemic; nearly 12.8% of Minnesotans have lost their jobs and sources of income.

Similarly, amidst the global COVID-19 pandemic, it is critical that DW providers and customers receive PPE to safely engage in services and Employment Plan related activities which is why a portion of the requested funding amount includes those costs.

Lastly, while all of the job titles shown below will be connected to these grant funds there is a sub-group of humanitarian-based jobs that relates to the global pandemic and the disaster recovery tenets therein. Humanitarian jobs may be included in this grant in order to: save lives; alleviate suffering; and maintain human dignity.
