Ohio to Become One of First States to Offer Next of Kin Registration

WHO:

Ohio Department of Public Safety Director Henry Guzmán

WHAT:

On Sept. 8, Ohio will become one of the first states to make a next of kin registration process available. Any holder of a valid Ohio driver license, commercial driver license, temporary permit or identification card will now have the option of providing the name and information of a contact person they wish to be notified in the event the individual is involved in a crash or emergency and is otherwise unable to communicate with the contact person.

WHY:
