

# SENEGAL

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## RULES/GENERAL LAWS

<b>General</b>	<p>1. Code de justice militaire 2. Code pénal de Sénégal</p> <p><a href="http://www.gouv.sn/-Lois-et-reglements-.html">http://www.gouv.sn/-Lois-et-reglements-.html</a></p> <p>United Nations rules on Sexual Exploitation and Abuse are implemented in the field through lawful commands and standing orders.</p> <p>Senegal military personnel are regarded as on duty twenty four hours when deployed in operations.</p>
<b>SEA: military offence?</b>	<p>Sexual Exploitation and Abuse is not a military crime. Acts which are categorized as SEA by the UN, would largely fall under the military and penal codes of Senegal.</p>
<b>Powers of the Commanding Officer (CO)</b>	<p>The Commanding Officer has administrative, investigative and disciplinary powers.</p>

## INVESTIGATION

<b>Who can investigate?</b>	<p>The Civilian Police (Prévoité) and Civilian Judges are empowered to investigate sexual exploitation and abuse allegations.</p>
<b>National Investigation Officer (NIO)</b>	<p>National Investigation Officers are deployed with units.</p>

## PROSECUTION

<b>Referral</b>	<p>The National Investigation Officers refer completed investigations to civilian prosecutors.</p>
<b>Who can charge?</b>	<p>The civilian prosecutors are mandated to charge.</p>

## JUSTICE

<b>Military justice</b>	<p>Senegal has a military justice system.</p>
<b>Deployable Court Martial?</b>	<p>Senegal does not have a peace time deployable court martial system.</p>

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
