

Lessons learnt from PISA: How to develop basic skills in the EU

Our news articles this month take a look at the latest edition of the OECD's Programme for International Student Assessment (PISA).

While the core results focus on basic skills (mathematics, reading and science), the importance

of <u>equity in education</u> and <u>parental engagement</u> are highlighted. Estonia and Ireland provide examples of targeted interventions in <u>driving sustained</u> improvement.

The <u>three thought-provoking PISA trends</u> from an EU perspective are explained in the expert article by Marco Montanari, European Commission. The twin challenges of <u>equity and excellence in basic skills</u> are further analysed in a recent report by the Commission.

The PISA results also address the role digital technologies can have in classrooms, providing both enrichment and distraction. In 2025, PISA will also include an optional Foreign Language Assessment to better understand how pupils learn English inside and outside school.

The projects in our practice article confirm the importance of <u>focusing on foundational skills</u> as a basis to comprehend and develop more complex ideas.
