# **IOWA**

The Fox News Poll is conducted under the joint direction of Anderson Robbins Research (D) and Shaw & Company Research (R). The poll was conducted by telephone with live interviewers December 7-10, 2015 among a random state sample of 807 Iowa likely caucus-goers. Results for the 357 likely Democratic caucus-goers have a margin of error of plus or minus 5 percentage points and results for the 450 likely Republican caucus-goers have a margin of error of plus or minus 4.5 percentage points.

Landline and cellphone numbers were randomly selected from a statewide voter file of registered Iowa voters using a probability proportionate to size method. This simply means that phone numbers are proportionally representative to the number of voters in all regions across the state of Iowa. Respondents were screened to identify likely caucus-goers.

An asterisk (\*) is used for percentages of less than one-half percent. A dash (-) represents a value of zero. Some results may not add to 100% due to rounding.
