

Anderson Robbins Research (D) / Shaw & Company Research (R)

Interviews Conducted: January 4-7, 2016

All results are for release after 6:00PM/ET Friday, January 8, 2016.

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The Fox News Poll is conducted under the joint direction of Anderson Robbins Research (D) and Shaw & Company Research (R).

The poll was conducted by telephone with live interviewers January 4-7, 2016 among a random state sample of 504 likely Iowa Republican caucus-goers. Results for the full sample have a margin of error of plus or minus 4 percentage points.

Landline (362) and cellphone (142) numbers were randomly selected from a statewide voter file of registered Iowa voters using a probability proportionate to size method. This simply means that phone numbers are proportionally representative to the number of voters in all regions across the state of Iowa. Respondents were screened to identify likely caucus-goers.

An asterisk (*) is used for percentages of less than one-half percent. A dash (-) represents a value of zero. Some results may not add to 100% due to rounding. 1. How likely is it that you will attend one of the Iowa caucuses scheduled for February of 2016 -- will you definitely attend, probably attend, probably not attend, or definitely not attend? (IF DEFINITELY OR PROBABLY) Will you attend the Democratic or Republican caucus?
