NEVADA

Methodology

Interviews were conducted January 5-8, 2020 among a random sample of 1,505 Nevada voters contacted on landlines (367) and cellphones (1138).

Results based on the full sample have a margin of sampling error of ± 2.5 percentage points. Results for the 635 Democratic caucus voters subsample have a margin of sampling error of ± 4 percentage points.

Interviews were conducted by bilingual interviewers. Respondents were given the option of completing the interview in English or Spanish.

Telephone numbers were randomly selected from a statewide voter file of registered Nevada voters using a probability proportionate to size method, which means phone numbers are proportionally representative to the number of voters in all regions across the state.

The Fox News Poll is conducted under the joint direction of Beacon Research (D) (formerly known as Anderson Robbins Research) and Shaw & Company Research (R).

Note: In 2019, the firm Anderson Robbins Research changed its name to Beacon Research; the Fox News bipartisan polling team remains unchanged.

Results are of registered voters, unless otherwise noted.

An asterisk () is used for percentages of less than one-half percent.*

A dash (-) represents a value of zero.

Some percentages may not add to 100% due to rounding. In the same way, percentages in "total" columns may be one point more or less than the sum of their parts due to rounding.

Fox News Poll -- Margin of Error for Subgroups

The Fox News Poll is conducted under the joint direction of Beacon Research (D) (*formerly known as Anderson Robbins Research*) and Shaw & Company Research (R). Interviews were conducted by telephone (landline and cellphone) with live interviewers January 5-8, 2020 among a random sample of 1,505 Nevada voters, including 635 Nevada Democratic caucusgoers.

Results based on the full sample have a margin of sampling error of plus or minus 2.5 percentage points and for the Democratic caucusgoers subsample it is plus or minus 4.
