

Anderson Robbins Research (D) / Shaw & Company Research (R) N = 1,019 registered voters (502 landline, 517 cell phone)

Interviews Conducted: July 13-15, 2015

Questions 1, 4-15 and 26-39 are for release after 6:00 P.M. ET Thurs., July 16, 2015. Questions 16-25 are for release after 7:00 A.M. ET Tues., July 21, 2015. Questions 2-3 are for release after 7:00 A.M. ET Thur., July 23, 2015.

Methodology

The Fox News Poll is conducted under the joint direction of Anderson Robbins Research (D) and Shaw & Company Research (R). The poll was conducted by telephone with live interviewers July 13-15, 2015 among a random national sample of 1,019 registered voters (RV). Results based on the full sample have a margin of sampling error of plus or minus three percentage points.

Landline and cell phone telephone numbers were randomly selected for inclusion in the survey using a probability proportionate to size method, which means that phone numbers for each state are proportional to the number of voters in each state.

Results are of registered voters, unless otherwise noted.

Results from Fox News polls before February 2011 were conducted by Opinion Dynamics Corp.
