Questions 1-8 and 14-39 are for release after 9:00 AM/ET Sunday, March 24, 2019. Questions 9-13 are for release after 6:00PM/ET Wednesday, March 27, 2019.

Methodology

Interviews were conducted March 17-20, 2019 among a random national sample of 1,002 registered voters (RV). Landline (216) and cellphone (786) telephone numbers were randomly selected for inclusion in the survey using a probability proportionate to size method, which means phone numbers for each state are proportional to the number of voters in each state.

Results based on the full sample have a margin of sampling error of ± 3 percentage points.

The Fox News Poll is conducted under the joint direction of Beacon Research (D) (formerly known as Anderson Robbins Research) and Shaw & Company Research (R).

Note: In 2019, the firm Anderson Robbins Research changed its name to Beacon Research; the Fox News bipartisan polling team remains unchanged.

Fieldwork conducted by Braun Research, Inc. of Princeton, NJ. Fox News Polls before 2011 were conducted by Opinion Dynamics Corporation.
