FLORIDA

The Fox News Poll is conducted under the joint direction of Anderson Robbins Research (D) and Shaw & Company Research (R).

The telephone poll was conducted with live interviewers March 5-8, 2016 among 813 Florida likely Republican primary voters on landlines (439) and cellphones (374). Results for the full sample have a margin of error of plus or minus 3.5 percentage points.

Respondents were randomly selected from a statewide voter file of Florida registered Republicans using a probability proportionate to size method. This simply means respondents are proportionally representative to the number of voters in all regions across Florida. Fieldwork conducted by Braun Research, Inc. of Princeton, NJ.

An asterisk (*) is used for percentages of less than one-half percent. A dash (-) represents a value of zero. Some results may not add to 100% due to rounding.
