

Anderson Robbins Research (D) / Shaw & Company Research (R) N = 1,006 registered voters (630 landline, 376 cell phone)

Interviews Conducted: May 31-June 2, 2015

Questions 2-3, 18-46 are for release after 6:00 P.M. ET Wed., June 3, 2015. Questions 1 and 4-17 are for release after 6:00 P.M. ET Thur., June 4, 2015. Questions 47-49 are for release after 7:00 A.M. ET Fri., June 12, 2015.

Methodology

The Fox News Poll is conducted under the joint direction of Anderson Robbins Research (D) and Shaw & Company Research (R). The poll was conducted by telephone with live interviewers May 31-June 2, 2015 among a random national sample of 1,006 registered voters (RV). Results based on the full sample have a margin of sampling error of plus or minus three percentage points.

Landline and cell phone telephone numbers were randomly selected for inclusion in the survey using a probability proportionate to size method, which means that phone numbers for each state are proportional to the number of voters in each state.

Results are of registered voters, unless otherwise noted.

Results from Fox News polls before February 2011 were conducted by Opinion Dynamics Corp.
