FOX NEWS POLL

All results are for release after 6PM/ET Wednesday, October 3, 2018.

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The Fox News Poll is conducted under the joint direction of Anderson Robbins Research (D) and Shaw & Company Research (R). The poll was conducted by telephone with live interviewers September 29-October 2, 2018 among a random sample of 805 Missouri registered voters (RV).

Results based on the full sample have a margin of sampling error of plus or minus 3.5 percentage points.

A subsample of 683 has been defined as likely voters (LV), with a margin of error of plus or minus 3.5 percentage points.

Landline (308) and cellphone (497) telephone numbers were randomly selected from a statewide voter file of registered Missouri voters using a probability proportionate to size method. This simply means phone numbers are proportionally representative to the number of voters in all regions across the state of Missouri. Voters who participated in one or more of the past five general elections (2008, 2010, 2012, 2014, 2016), plus new registrants since the 2016 election, were eligible for selection in the sample. Fieldwork by Braun Research, Inc. of Princeton, NJ.

An asterisk (*) is used for percentages of less than one-half percent.

A dash (-) represents a value of zero.

Some percentages may not add to 100% due to rounding. In the same way, percentages in "total" columns may be one point more or less than the sum of their component parts due to rounding.
