Methodology

Interviews were conducted November 10-13, 2019 among a random sample of 1,504 North Carolina voters contacted on landlines (451) and cellphones (1,053).

Results based on the full sample have a margin of sampling error of ± 2.5 percentage points. Results for the 669 Democratic primary voters subsample have a margin of sampling error of ± 3.5 percentage points, and results for the 574 Republican primary voters subsample have a margin of sampling error of ± 4 percentage points.

Telephone numbers were randomly selected from a statewide voter file of registered North Carolina voters using a probability proportionate to size method, which means phone numbers are proportionally representative to the number of voters in all regions across the state.

The Fox News Poll is conducted under the joint direction of Beacon Research (D) (formerly known as Anderson Robbins Research) and Shaw & Company Research (R).

Note: In 2019, the firm Anderson Robbins Research changed its name to Beacon Research; the Fox News bipartisan polling team remains unchanged.

Results are of registered voters, unless otherwise noted. An asterisk (*) is used for percentages of less than one-half percent. A dash (-) represents a value of zero.

Fox News Poll -- Margin of Error for Subgroups

The Fox News Poll is conducted under the joint direction of Beacon Research (D) (formerly known as Anderson Robbins Research) and Shaw & Company Research (R). Interviews were conducted by telephone (landline and cellphone) with live interviewers November 10-23, 2019 among a random sample of 1,504 North Carolina voters, including 669 NC Democratic primary voters and 574 Republican primary voters.

Results based on the full sample have a margin of sampling error of plus or minus 2.5 percentage points and for the Democratic primary voters subsample it is plus or minus 3.5 and for the Republican primary it is plus or minus 4.
