All results are for release 9AM/ET Sunday, September 23, 2018.

Methodology

The Fox News Poll is conducted under the joint direction of Anderson Robbins Research (D) and Shaw & Company Research (R). The poll was conducted by telephone with live interviewers September 16-19, 2018 among a random national sample of 1,003 registered voters (RV).

Results based on the full sample have a margin of sampling error of plus or minus three percentage points.

A subsample of 818 has been defined as likely voters (LV), with a margin of error of plus or minus three percentage points.

Landline (352) and cellphone (651) telephone numbers were randomly selected for inclusion in the survey using a probability proportionate to size method, which means phone numbers for each state are proportional to the number of voters in each state. Fieldwork conducted by Braun Research, Inc. of Princeton, NJ.

Results are of registered voters, unless otherwise noted.

An asterisk (*) is used for percentages of less than one-half percent.

A dash (-) represents a value of zero.

Some percentages may not add to 100% due to rounding. In the same way, percentages in “total” columns may be one point more or less than the sum of their component parts due to rounding.

Results from Fox News polls before February 2011 were conducted by Opinion Dynamics Corp.
