The Fox News Poll is conducted under the joint direction of Beacon Research (D) and Shaw \& Company Research (R). It was conducted by telephone (landline and cellphone) with live interviewers March 2-6, 2022 among 918 Ohio Republican primary voters.

Results based on the full sample have a margin of sampling error of plus or minus 3 percentage points. Results among the attached subgroups have larger sampling errors:
