# BRYAN KONIECKO

## Director of Tennis/Head Coach - Eighth Season

Bryan KoniECKO was named the UCF women's tennis head coach on July 5, 2016 and then promoted to Director of Tennis in August 2023. The 12th head coach in program history came to the Knights after spending two campaigns as the men's tennis head coach at Brown University.

Facing a difficult schedule with 16 ranked opponents, UCF went 11-12 in the 2023

season, reaching the AAC Tournament finals and earning its fifth-straight NCAA Tournament berth. The season started off with a bang, collecting a 4-2 upset over No. 19 Arizona State in the first match of the ITA Kickoff Weekend. The team would go on to collect five additional ranked wins and earn the second seed in the AAC Tournament, not dropping a set in its march to the finals. KoniECKO helped guide Marie Mattel to her second consecutive NCAA Singles Championship berth and AAC All-Conference Team honors. Also collecting All-Conference honors was fellow captain Nandini Sharma, who had a solid 12-5 dual singles record.

The Knights had a successful 2022 season, earning the regular season AAC title and a bid to the NCAA tournament. With a 16-8 overall record, UCF picked up huge wins over #9 Oklahoma State, #17 Baylor, and #18 Michigan, ending the regular season on an eight-game match streak. KoniECKO also helped guide Marie Mattel to her first NCAA Singles Tournament berth after being named to the AAC All-Conference Team.

UCF picked up right where they left off after a shortened 2020 campaign. After dropping the first two matches of the season, the Knights went on to win 12 of their next 13. The Knights continued to hang around the high teens and low twenties in the Oracle/ITA team rankings for the majority of the season until they crossed paths with No. 4 FSU late in the campaign. Despite losing the doubles point, the Knights were able to rally from behind as Valeriya Zeleva clinched the match as the last court standing, earning UCF's first win over a top five team in program history. The win shot the Knights up to No. 8 in the team rankings, a program record. The momentum continued from there as the Knights blew past South Florida, Houston and No. 46 Tulsa on their way to their second straight American Athletic Conference title. The Knights earned the No. 9 national seed in the NCAA Tournament and the right to host the first two rounds for the first time in program history. UCF swept Charleston Southern in the first round, leading to a rematch with No. 23 Miami, who the Knights had swept earlier in the season. The Black and Gold won all six first sets and went on to their second consecutive Sweet 16 with a 4-1 victory. UCF's run came to an end at the hands of No. 18 Duke in the third round with a record of 20-5, achieving a 20-win season for the third time in the KoniECKO era.

The Knights were on pace to continue their upward trajectory in 2020 thanks to KoniECKO and staff. After a tremendous win over No. 22 Baylor on the road and just before a home match against No. 4 Texas, the season was canceled due to the global COVID-19 outbreak. The team was ranked at No. 13 in the preseason Oracle/ITA poll before climbing to No. 12 a few weeks later, the highest ranking in program history.

UCF finished the 2019-20 season with a record of 10-3 in dual match play. The fall season saw success as well, as Marie Mattel and Rebeka Stolmar earned the doubles title at the ITA Southeast Regional Championships. Nandini Sharma won the Bedford Cup while Stolmar earned the consolation crown at ITA All-Americans.

KoniECKO guided the Knights to their best season in program history in 2019. The team earned a record 24 victories during the spring and reached a then-record ranking of No. 18 in the Oracle/ITA poll after the team's first ever win over Florida on College MatchDay and earned their first conference title since 2002. The Knights swept Alabama in the first round of the NCAA Tournament before defeating No. 11 FSU for the first time ever to punch UCF's first ticket to the Sweet 16. KoniECKO became the fastest coach in program history to 50 wins on March 24, 2019 with a 4-1 victory over No. 34 Illinois.

The team took a huge jump in his second season at the helm of the Black and Gold as they climbed to a then-record ranking of No. 19 in the Oracle/ITA poll. The Knights defeated six out of seven ranked opponents, including a 4-3 victory against No. 15 South Carolina in the season opener and a 5-2 decision at No. 16 Baylor.

In his inaugural campaign with the Black and Gold in 2017, KoniECKO guided the Knights to a 13-9 record and a spot at the American Athletic Conference Championship quarterfinals. Junior Monica Matias garnered All-Conference honors and was named The American Women's Tennis Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

KoniECKO has earned three American Athletic Conference Coach of the Year Awards ('18, '19, & '21). KoniECKO isn't the only one who took home honors in the 2019 season, as Marie Mattel took home Freshman of the Year award and Valeriya Zeleva was named conference Player of the Year. Zeleva, Ksenia Kuznetsova and Rebeka Stolmar were named to the All-Conference squad.

Doubles team Valeriya Zeleva and Ksenia Kuznetsova became the second tandem in program history to earn a spot in the NCAA Doubles Championships. Zeleva also earned a spot in the NCAA Singles Championships. The nod for UCF's top duo earned Kuznetsova her second straight trip to the tournament, as she had made it in 2018 with Maria Martinez.

KoniECKO encouraged his players to compete in ITF events throughout the years and played a vital role in encouraging Monica Matias to represent Puerto Rico in the Fed Cup, where she helped Puerto Rico to its first promotion to Americas Group I since 2010. Matias was named a Fed Cup MVP, one of five in the world. She was also tabbed as The American's Women's Tennis Scholar-Athlete of the Year for the second time in her career.

A strong recruiter, KoniECKO brought three international players that held ITF Top 50 rankings to Ohio State, helping the women's squad jump from No. 73 to No. 35 in the ITA rankings. In his first of two stints at Brown from 2010-12, KoniECKO helped guide a previously unranked Bears men's squad to a top 50 ranking as an assistant coach.

As the Brown head men's coach from 2014-16, he aided a pair of Bears in Peter Tarid (First Team, 2016) and Justin To (Second Team, 2015) to All-Ivy League singles honors. The squad totaled 24 dual-match victories and garnered ITA All-Academic accolades following both campaigns.

KoniECKO returned to his alma mater, Ohio State, in 2012 and was promoted to associate head coach during the 2013-14 campaign. During that season, he guided Ohio State to its first NCAA tournament appearance since 2009, a national ranking of 35 and an undefeated mark at home.

A five-time All-American at Ohio State, KoniECKO led his team to four Big Ten regular season and tournament titles during his four years at Ohio State. He earned consecutive Big Ten Athlete of the Year accolades in 2008 and 2009, and was named league's Freshman of the Year in 2006.

As a captain his senior year, KoniECKO won the ITA National Intercollegiate Indoor Singles Title and was ranked No. 1 in the country individually. Ohio State was also ranked No. 1 in the country during his final campaign and finished as the national runner-up.

After graduating with a bachelor of arts degree in 2009, KoniECKO continued to play at the professional level where he reached an ATP career-high ranking of 651. He earned his first professional title in 2007, winning the ITF professional futures event in Ecuador. In 2008, he was also a runner-up in the ITF professional futures event in Peoria, Ill. The Long Island, N.Y., native also had the opportunity to compete in the 2007 and 2008 U.S. Open qualifying.

KoniECKO traveled to over 17 countries to compete in tournaments such as the Junior Australian Open and Wimbledon. He was ranked as high as No. 45 in the ITF world junior rankings with a win over Marin Cilic and was ranked Top 10 nationally in the Boy's 16s and 18s.





# FRANCESCA DI LORENZO

## Assistant Coach - First Season

Francesca Di Lorenzo, who reached as high as No. 118 on the Women's Tennis Association professional circuit, was named UCF women's tennis assistant coach on August 28, 2023. A three-time All-American and Intercollegiate Tennis Association national champion,

Di Lorenzo volunteered with the Buddy Up Program during her tenure at Ohio State where she worked with athletes with down syndrome, teaching them the foundations of tennis and fitness. In 2021, she took part in a coaching internship program, coaching aspiring young female tennis players, assessing skill levels and tailoring drills to advance the fundamentals. She also worked one-on-one with junior players to provide guidance on both the physical and mental aspects of the sport, developing strategies for specific opponents and improving mental toughness.

Di Lorenzo starred at Ohio State from 2016-17, winning the 2017 NCAA doubles championship.

Di Lorenzo joined the Knights after an illustrious playing career in both the collegiate and professional landscapes. As a member of the Ohio State women's tennis team, recruited by then-associate head coach Koniecko, the Pittsburgh native twice reached No. 1 in the country in singles (2016-17), No. 3 in doubles (2017) and collected three ITA national singles championships, 2016 National Indoors, 2017 Singles All-Americans and 2017 National Indoors.

No stranger to conference championships, she led Ohio State to become Big Ten regular-season and conference champion in 2016 and 2017, collecting Big Ten Player of the Year and All-Big Ten honors in both years. The 2016 Big Ten Freshman of the Year was also named the Ohio State Female Athlete of the Year after earning two All-America awards and a doubles national championship in the 2017 dual-match season. Rounding out her collegiate tennis resume, she was named a Honda Award finalist in 2016 and 2017, an award granted to the best female collegiate tennis player in the country.

Di Lorenzo is one of the most decorated women's tennis players in Ohio State history. She remains the program leader in both career singles and doubles win percentage at .914 and .887, respectively. In her two years as a Buckeye, she compiled a 74-7 record in singles and a 55-7 record in doubles. Di Lorenzo holds the Ohio State record for singles wins in a season with 37 as a sophomore and owns the freshman record for singles wins, collecting a 35-5 mark in her first season in Columbus.

Along with her playing honors, Di Lorenzo earned a bachelor's degree in sports industry graduating magna cum laude. She was named to the ITA All-Academic (2017) and Academic All-Big Ten (2016 and 2017) teams, as well as collecting Big Ten Distinguished Scholar honors in 2017. To round out her stellar 2017 season, Di Lorenzo was named a CoSIDA Academic All-American, celebrating her achievements on the court and in the classroom, as the first Buckeye in program history to earn the award.

After the 2017 season, Di Lorenzo turned to the pro tennis circuit. She reached a career-high WTA singles ranking of No. 118 in 2020 and advanced to the second round of the U.S. Open in 2018 and 2019. Di Lorenzo also has played in the Australian Open, Roland-Garros and Wimbledon, earning qualifying wins in all four Grand Slam tournaments.





# ANDY GLADSTONE

## Director of Operations - Second Season

The UCF men's and women's tennis programs hired Andrew Gladstone as the Director of Operations for both programs in September of 2022.

Gladstone spent 20 years working for the USTA as an administrator, where he worked with professional tennis players such as Reilly Opelka, Sloane Stephens,

Amanda Anisimova, Danielle Collins, and Nicole Melichar. Along with working for the USTA, Gladstone also was a ball boy at the US Open for several years. Gladstone's family was voted as USTA Florida's Family of the Year in 2008.

Over the summer of 2022, Gladstone was a tennis coach for the Maccabiah Games in Israel, which is an event held every four years and is ranked as the third largest sporting event in the world measured by the number of athletes.

Gladstone's family includes his wife along with a son and a daughter. His wife is a leader in the United States as a 10-and-under tennis coach and is also holds the record for all time wins at the University of South Carolina. His son who attended the creative school at UCF back in preschool, got his master's degree in math and is now a tennis coach in Jacksonville.

Gladstone's daughter played four years of college tennis at Davidson College and graduated in 2022.

During his time at USTA, Gladstone became personal friends with college basketball commentator Dick Vitale. Vitale would often call Gladstone to find out the rankings of his grandchildren, who played tennis at USTA.

Along with being a passionate tennis player and fan, Gladstone loves to read business, motivational, and sports books in his free time. His new kindle reader has become very important in his life. Gladstone also loves to run and go to fitness centers.

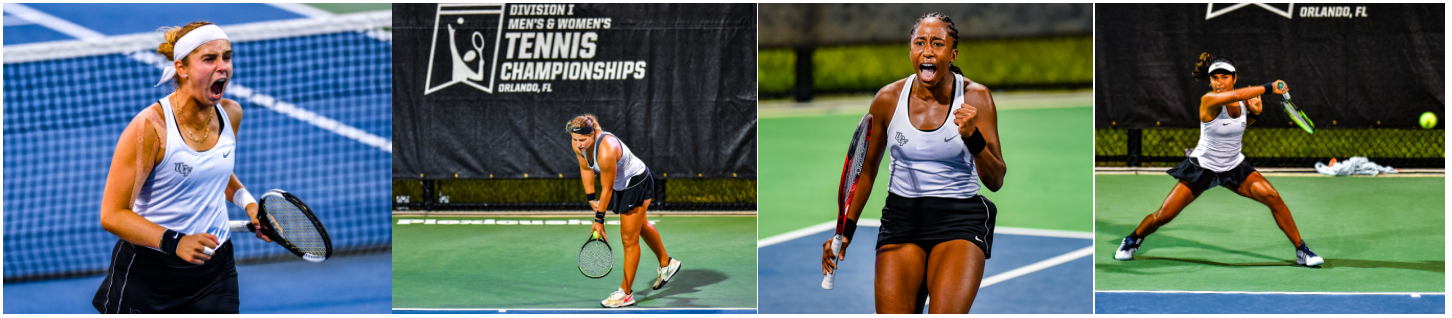

# USTA National Campus



The UCF Knights play their home matches at the UCF Collegiate Tennis Center at the USTA National Campus in Lake Nona, Florida. Both the UCF men's and women's tennis teams have played here since the campus opened in 2017.

The complex's UCF Collegiate Tennis Center features 12 plexicushion courts with seating for 1,200 fans and room for additional seating areas. It is large enough to allow two collegiate matches to be played simultaneously. The area also features a two-story pavilion including concessions and locker rooms.

The UCF women's tennis team has found overwhelming amounts of success at home as they have posted a 74-13 record in the six seasons they have played at the USTA National Campus. The Black and Gold didn't lose at home in 2019 and 2021 regular seasons and went on to win conference championships at home those same seasons.

Looked upon as one of the greatest facilities in the country, the NCAA agreed to host the NCAA team, singles and doubles championships at the UCF Collegiate Tennis Center in 2019, 2021 and 2023. The 2019 & 2021 championships were a hit to tennis fans throughout Central Florida, as was the College MatchDay series. Televised on the Tennis Channel, elite tennis programs from across the country would compete in a highly-attended rivalry match at the USTA National Campus. The series plans to continue on making its home in Orlando. The American Athletic Conference championship tournament was also held at the collegiate tennis center in 2019 as well as 2021.

In addition to the UCF Collegiate Tennis Center, the USTA National campus is home to over 100 tennis courts. The venue not only provides student-athletes the best of playing surfaces, but other hands on experiences to complement what they learn in the classroom.

The United States Tennis Association (USTA) established this tennis center to welcome all levels of players. This includes youth that are just beginning to learn the game all the way to professional players. Construction was finished on the tennis center in late 2016.

The USTA Player Development division moved its national headquarters from Boca Raton to Orlando, aiming to provide the best opportunities to succeed for the next generation of American tennis champions.

"This new home for American tennis will truly be a game-changer for our sport," said USTA chairman of the board and president Dave Haggerty. "This world-class facility will be an inclusive gathering place for American tennis and will allow us to impact our sport at every level, from the grassroots to the professional ranks."

Along with many partners, the university will help raise private funds to contribute to the development of the center. UCF also is exploring opportunities to connect its academic programs and students with the center's operations.

Former UCF President John C. Hitt joined Haggerty, Gov. Rick Scott, Orange County Mayor Teresa Jacobs and Orlando Mayor Buddy Dyer were all a part of this process. Officials from Tavistock Group, the developer of Lake Nona, also participated.

"UCF has embraced this project because it impacts academics, community partnerships, economic development and athletics," Hitt said. "Our students, our tennis players and our entire community will benefit from having the finest tennis facilities in the country at Lake Nona."

This new home for American tennis hosts every type of tennis event from 10-and-under team tennis events to national championships for those aged 90 and older. Additionally, the facility is conveniently located near the Orlando International Airport to accommodate visiting tennis players.

"More than a decade ago we undertook a strategic plan for the development of the southeast sector of our city," Dyer said. "The selection of Orlando for the United States Tennis Association's new divisional headquarters further enhances this area and speaks to the value of our community's assets—a talented labor force, business-friendly environment and global access via a world-class airport."

"Lake Nona is founded on the principles of innovative collaboration and inspiring human potential," said Rasesh Thakkar, senior managing director of Tavistock Group. "This campus at Lake Nona has all of the ingredients for the beginnings of a world-class sports and human performance cluster with the USTA setting the bar."
