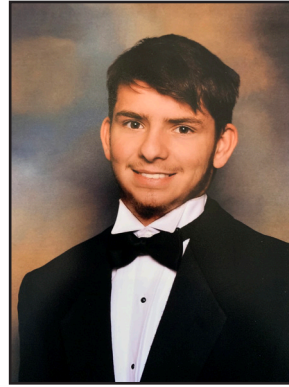

Garland & Mildred Powers Memorial

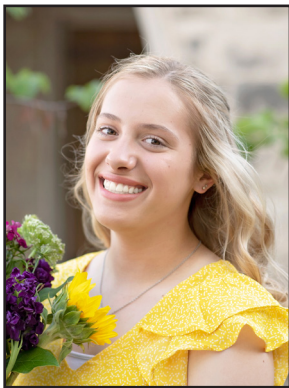
