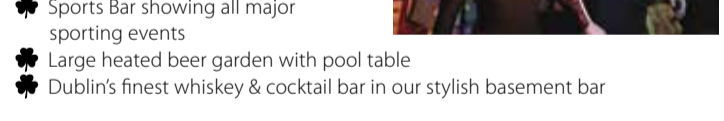

During the 1919-21 War of Independence, rebels under Michael Collins, sought refuge here and made their confessions to sympathetic clergy in secret rooms. Then called The Maid of Erin, its small rooms and proximity to the Pro-Cathedral led to it become known as 'The Confession Box'. One of the smallest bars in Dublin, it is situated in the heart of Dublin opposite the Pro-Cathedral and near the Spire and Lias. This authentic cosy Dublin pub is frequented by local regulars and returning visitors from afar. Feel at home and relax or join in the banter and craic and best of all, meet the friendliest bar staff in Dublin! All major TV sport events shown and great live music at weekends. Historic Attractions

E6 SAINT PATRICK'S CATHEDRAL

Over 800 years old, Ireland's largest church and the island's National Cathedral for the Church of Ireland was founded beside a sacred well where Saint Patrick is said to have converted pagans to Christianity. Jonathan Swift, author of Gulliver's Travels, was Dean from 1713-1745. He is buried near the entrance and his death mask and a selection of artefacts are on display. The World War I exhibition is also not to be missed. In 1742 Handel's Messiah was premiered in the Cathedral and a strong singing tradition continues today, with two services daily (except Sat) during school term - the only Cathedral to do so in Britain and Ireland. Perhaps more than any other building in Ireland, Saint Patrick's embodies the history and heritage of Irish people of all backgrounds from the earliest times to the present day. Come and enjoy one of Dublin's most popular tourist attractions and celebrate its place in the life of the city, its history and role in the future. K5 BATTLE OF THE BOYNE VISITOR CENTRE - OLDBRIDGE HOUSE AND GARDENS

Located along the banks of the iconic River Boyne, the Battle of the Boyne Visitor Centre is located in the restored 18th century Oldbridge House. Fought in July 1690, between King William III and King James II, the battle was the largest ever attended battle in Ireland with over 60,000 troops present. Explore the history of the battle with interactive displays of costumes, weaponry and the life of the soldiers. Relax in the beautiful Victorian Gardens. Enjoy a browse in the Gift Shop and lunch in the Tea Rooms. Events throughout the year. Guided tours on request. Open: All Year. 9 am - 5pm Summer, 9 am to 4 pm Winter. Located 5 km from Exit 9 off the M1 Motorway.

F5 DUBLIN CASTLE

The story of Dublin Castle is the story of Ireland over more than 1,000 years. This is a journey through time: from the 10th to the 21st century, from British rule to Irish independence and beyond. Underground caverns, medieval ruins, a Georgian palace and fairytale chapel are just some of the stops along the way. See the spectacular ballroom where the President of Ireland is inaugurated. Follow in the footsteps of everyone from Queen Victoria and Charles Dickens, to John F. Kennedy and Queen Elizabeth II. Discover a treasure trove of art and culture. E4 ST. MICHAEL'S CHURCH

Originally founded in 1095 present church dates from 1685, was renovated in 1825 and largely remains unchanged since Victorian times. The Church of Ireland parish houses what must be the city's most extraordinary attraction. Due to an unusual combination of magnesium salts in limestone, the crypts beneath the church are without any moisture, resulting in the perfect preservation of those buried within. Four damaged coffins reveal their inhabitants, and the dungeon-like setting makes it quite a spine-tingling sight. The adjacent crypt contains the ornate coffins of the Earl of Leinster's family as well as artefacts and coffins from the 1798 Rising and death mask of Irish revolutionary Wolfe Tone. Open: March to Oct Mon-Fri 10am-12.45pm & 2pm-4.45pm (closed 1pm-2pm). Nov to March Mon-Fri 12.30pm-3.30pm. Sat 10am-12.45pm. May close for tours due to weddings, funerals and other church events. Adults €7 Students/Concessions €5.

F5 DUBLIN CITY HALL

The magnificent City Hall, formerly a financial centre for the merchants of Dublin, became the centre of municipal government in 1852. An outstanding example of the Georgian architecture for which Dublin is world-renowned, the spectacular entrance hall or Rotunda can be hired as a venue for corporate events, filming, fashion shows or civil marriage ceremonies in the atmospheric vaults, multimedia exhibition unlocks key moments in the history of the city and 2016 brought some exciting new additions such as the original 1916 proclamation and Postcards in the 1916 Rising. Information on any upcoming temporary exhibitions featured in the exhibition space is available on City Hall's social media channels. Talks on the history of the building are available for groups by prior arrangement and a charming café and gift shop on site add to the ambience of this wonderful city treasure. Open: Mon-Sat from 10am-5:00pm. Closed Sundays and bank holidays. Admission is free.
