

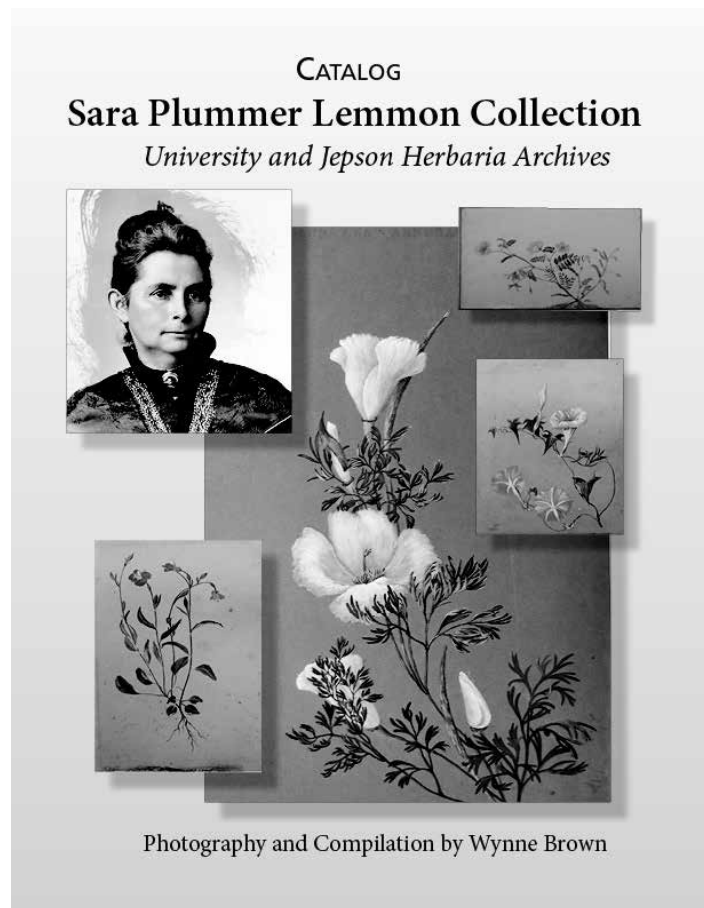

## Protecting the Sara Plummer Lemmon Collection – 140+ Years Later

### Introduction

*It's like death to me to be idle ...*

So wrote the botanist and artist Sara Plummer Lemmon – back in 1870, long before she became an acknowledged botanical expert and illustrator. She'd recently arrived in Santa Barbara and was writing home to her younger sister back East.

Born in 1836 in New Gloucester, Maine, Sara attended school in Massachusetts before moving to New York City, where she taught “calisthenics” (gym class) and private art lessons.

Her health had always been fragile, and driven by frequent bouts of bronchitis and pneumonia, she made the momentous decision to move, alone, to California.

There she not only taught herself botany – partly by drawing the unfamiliar plants – but she also established Santa Barbara's first library. In 1876, she met another

amateur Western botanist, John Gill Lemmon, a Civil War veteran who'd moved to California to convalesce after being captured by the Confederate army and held prisoner in both the Andersonville Prison in Georgia and South Carolina's Florence Stockade.

The two eventually married on Thanksgiving Day, 1880. They then spent the rest of their lives traveling throughout the West. They're credited with discovering three percent of Arizona's vascular plants.

According to their letters, Sara illustrated hundreds of species, but tragically, most of her work has disappeared. She was the first woman invited to speak to the all-male California Academy of Sciences, and after breaking through that ceiling, she was at the Academy often. She and JG both wrote about donating much of her work to that organization.

It's likely that many of Sara's paintings were destroyed in the fires that gutted the California Academy of Sciences in the 1906 San Francisco Earthquake.

But not all were lost ...

Sara's great-nephew, Harold St. John, a noted botanist in Hawaii, ended up with two boxes of her watercolors — many of them painted in 1881 during the Lemmons' time in southeastern Arizona's Huachuca Mountains.

In 2015, Harold's granddaughter, Sara's great-great-grandniece, Amy St. John, donated the works to the University of California and Jepson Herbaria Archives in Berkeley, Calif.

Back in 2017, I knew I wanted to write Sara Lemmon's biography – and that I wanted to include photos of her work. So, to get photographs for the book I hadn't yet written – and didn't even have a contract for – I hired a local art conservator, Susan K. Filter, for a day to assess the work.

Susan, my husband Dave Peterson, and I then spent a thrilling day examining Sara's paintings.

The assessment revealed that the work was in desperate need of what is technically referred to as "stabilization and re-housing."

In other words, each painting needed to be protected with glassine sheets and nestled in archival-quality folders and boxes of appropriate sizes.

After so many years of being stored in Hawaii's humidity, many of them are in sad shape and marred by foxing and insect damage.

Susan recommended the following strategy:

"Carefully place each artwork into a two-piece archival folder with 5mil melinex front and 20 pt. acid-free and lignin-free folder stock back to enable quick viewing and identification. (*Gaylord Archival Catalogue*, ZZZ-VF1824, 18" x 24")

The folders should be placed in an archival box either ordered to the folder size, or a Gaylord Blue e-flute deep lid newspaper box." (ZZ-EFNB20243, 20"X24 1/4"X3"H)

But, sadly, the archives had no funding to do anything with the works.

In 2021, my biography of Sara, *The Forgotten Botanist: Sara Plummer Lemmon's Life of Science and Art*, was published by University of Nebraska Press/Bison Books. The book has done well, winning seven awards.

Thanks to my royalties and some very generous donations totalling about \$12,000, I received sufficient funding to return to the Archives three more times. The money allowed me to hire Susan each time. Even better, we were joined by Amy St. John, Sara's great-great-grandniece!

In August 2023, we processed the last of 565 items.

This catalog documents those items. Some highlights:

- Each piece is now stored in an archival-quality folder, protected by glassine sheets, and they all now reside in ten boxes, rather than the original four.
- Each item now has an assigned number that is linked to its image number.
- The catalog includes the height and width of each item.



- When possible, each plant is identified with the location and the date the painting was made.
- All the notes on both the front and back of every painting has been transcribed and is included.
- Most of the works are not finished paintings, and the majority are unsigned sketches. But many, 135 of them, are signed by Sara Lemmon.
- Interestingly, at least 70, are not even by Sara, but were painted by Adelia Sarah Gates, her friend and mentor. Adelia was a fascinating individual in her own right, a talented and quirkily independent woman who traveled the world, alone, creating hundreds of plant illustrations – many of which are in the Smithsonian. So far, few details are known about Adelia. Fortunately, one of her descendants is digging into this artist's intriguing and unusual life.
- The catalog not only includes if the painting is signed by either Sara or Adelia, but is also color-coded: Those items marked in green are definitely Sara's, and ones in yellow are Adelia's. Those not color-coded could be by either artist – or may even be by one of their students.

I don't know for sure? But I like to think that Sara, the woman for whom it was "like death to be idle" would be pleased that her work and that of her friend has been immortalized in a way that she could never have imagined. Thanks to the internet, this work is now accessible to all, from anywhere, at any time – and for free.
