Its vision is to be a national and international powerhouse for competence, growth and innovation in the High North. With a newly elected leadership, a new strategy process has just been initiated.

International cooperation through student and staff mobility and strategic partnerships for cooperation in education, research and innovation is a major part of the current strategy, and will certainly be a part of the new one. The former UiT has taken place in EUs cooperation programmes since its inception. 2/3 of the total student and staff mobility at UiT are Erasmus. Activities to be implemented by participating in Erasmus are: Student and staff mobility, stronger institutional cooperation by developing joint degrees, partnerships and placements.
