Post-Wildfire Debris Removal

Debris removal is a two-phase process

PHASE 1 HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE REMOVAL



- Removal of household hazardous waste that may pose a threat to human health, animals and the environment
- No sign-up needed, Phase 1 is automatic

PHASE 2 DEBRIS REMOVAL



- Removal of wildfire debris, ash, metal, concrete and contaminated soil
- Two Options to remove debris from private property
 - Option 1: Participate in the State's Consolidated Debris Removal Program (property owners incur no direct costs). Sign up by completing, signing and submitting a Right-of-Entry form to your county by the deadline
 - Option 2: Hire a properly licensed private contractor to perform the work in accordance with local health, safety and environmental standards and requirements
