



Nightletters may, at the option of the Signal Corps, be mailed at destination to the addressees, and in such cases, the Signal Corps shall be deemed to have discharged its obligation with respect to delivery.

Dayletters may be forwarded as a deferred service and the transmission and delivery of such dayletters are, in all respects, subordinate to the priority of transmission and delivery of full-rate messages.
